The Strategic Initiatives Group within the Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel has created a detailed demographic profile of the legislative district that you represent. This profile contains summaries of information from the American Community Survey, which is an ongoing nationwide survey that is conducted by the United States Census to produce information on social, economic, housing, and demographic characteristics. The information from the American Community Survey contained in this profile was obtained between January 1, 2014 and December 31, 2018, making it the most recent, accurate, complete information available.

The Strategic Initiatives Group was created to conduct long-term strategic planning to inform policy analysis on issues of statewide concern for decades to come. We hope the 2020 profiles prove helpful as you not only identify trends and issues but also as you evaluate proposals that are intended to benefit the constituencies within your district. This profile not only provides detailed demographic information about the constituents within your district, but it also provides a comparison of this information to other legislative districts and to the statewide average.

After redistricting, when legislative districts are redrawn, we will produce profiles of the new districts. This 2020 profile may be useful then, as a comparison to your new district. However this profile is used, we hope it adds value to your legislative service.

Additionally, the American Community Survey contains a great deal of information that cannot be included in a profile of this length. In truth, the American Community Survey contains more than a thousand tables, with dozens of fields each. Moreover, the United State Census Bureau conducts other surveys in addition to the American Community Survey. Please let us know if you have a question about your district that is not answered in this profile. Perhaps we can find the answer in Census data that is not used here.






Figure 1.2 - AGE Percentage of Population Age 0-4




Figure 1.3 - AGE Percentage of Population Age 0-4

(First category in Figure 1.1; same data presented in Figure 1.3; additional data in Table 1 of the appendix)




Figure 1.4 - AGE




Figure 1.5- AGE Percentage of Population Age 65+





Figure 1.6 - AGE Percentage of Population Who are School Age Children (Age 5-17)





Figure 2.2 - RACE Percentage of Population Who are White

Figure 2.3 - RACE Percentage of Population Who are White




Figure 3.1 - HISPANIC OR LATINO





Figure 3.2 - HISPANIC OR LATINO Percentage of Population Who are Hispanic or Latino

Figure 3.3 - HISPANIC OR LATINO Percentage of Population Who are Hispanic or Latino




Figure 4.1 - LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME




Figure 4.2 - LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME




Figure 4.3 - LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME Percentage of Population Age 5+ Who Do Not Speak English at Home




Figure 5.1 - BIRTHPLACE AND CITIZENSHIP




Figure 5.2 - BIRTHPLACE AND CITIZENSHIP Percentage of Population Born in Utah




Figure 5.3 - BIRTHPLACE AND CITIZENSHIP Percentage of Population Born in Utah

(First category in Figure 5.1; same data presented in Figure 5.3; additional data in Table 5 of the appendix)




Figure 5.4 - BIRTHPLACE AND CITIZENSHIP




Figure 5.5 - BIRTHPLACE AND CITIZENSHIP Percentage of Population Who are Not Citizens





Figure 5.6 - BIRTHPLACE AND CITIZENSHIP Percentage of Population Who are Not Citizens





Figure 6.2 - HOUSEHOLD TYPE

Figure 6.3 - HOUSEHOLD TYPE Percentage of Households That are a Family with a Child Under Age 18 Present




Figure 7.1 - HOUSEHOLD TYPE AND SIZE





Figure 7.2 - HOUSEHOLD TYPE AND SIZE

Figure 7.3 - HOUSEHOLD TYPE AND SIZE Percentage of Households That are 3-4 Person Family Households




Figure 8.1 - MARITAL STATUS




Figure 8.2 - MARITAL STATUS





Figure 8.3 - MARITAL STATUS Percentage of Population Age 30-74 Who are Married with Spouse Present




Figure 9.2 - WOMEN GIVING BIRTH





Figure 9.3 - WOMEN GIVING BIRTH Percentage of Women Age 15-19 Giving Birth in the Past 12 Months




Figure 10.2 - CHILD LIVING ARRANGEMENTS Percentage of Children Age 0-17 Living with One Parent




Figure 10.3 - CHILD LIVING ARRANGEMENTS Percentage of Children Age 0-17 Living with One Parent




Figure 11.1 - GRANDPARENT LIVING WITH GRANDCHILD





Figure 11.2 - GRANDPARENT LIVING WITH GRANDCHILD




Figure 12.1 - EDUCATION - HIGHEST LEVEL OF ATTAINMENT Percentage of Population Age 25+, by Highest Level of Educational Attainment




Figure 12.2 - EDUCATION - HIGHEST LEVEL OF ATTAINMENT Percentage of Population Age 25+ without a High School Diploma




Figure 12.3 - EDUCATION - HIGHEST LEVEL OF ATTAINMENT Percentage of Population Age 25+ without a High School Diploma




Figure 13.1 - BACHELOR'S DEGREE ATTAINMENT Percentage of Population in Each Age Category, by Sex, with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher




Figure 13.2 - BACHELOR'S DEGREE ATTAINMENT




Figure 13.3 - BACHELOR'S DEGREE ATTAINMENT Percentage of Population Age 25+ with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher




Figure 14.1 - VETERANS

(Numbers are the percentage of civilians in each age category, not the percentage of total civilians in the state or district; categories do not sum to 100%)





Figure 14.2 - VETERANS Percentage of Civilians Age 18+ Who are Veterans

Figure 14.3 - VETERANS Percentage of Civilians Age 18+ Who are Veterans




Figure 15.1 - EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY Percentage of Civilian Employed Workers Age 16+, by Industry of Employment*





Figure 15.2 - EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY

Figure 15.3 - EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY Percentage of Civilian Employed Workers Age 16+ Who Work in Manufacturing




Figure 15.4 - EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY





Figure 15.5 - EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY

Percentage of Civilian Employed Workers Age 16+ Who Work in Arts, Entertainment, Recreation, Accomodation, and Food Services






Figure 16.2 - MEANS OF TRANSPORTATION TO WORK Percentage of Workers Age 16+ Who Drive Alone to Work





Figure 16.3 - MEANS OF TRANSPORTATION TO WORK Percentage of Workers Age 16+ Who Drive Alone to Work




Figure 17.2 - TRAVEL TIME TO WORK




Figure 17.3 - TRAVEL TIME TO WORK Average Travel Time to Work of Workers Age 16+ Who Do Not Work at Home




Figure 18.1 - SOURCES OF HOUSEHOLD INCOME





Figure 18.2 - SOURCES OF HOUSEHOLD INCOME


Percentage of Aggregate Household Income from Interest, Dividends, or Net Rental Income




Figure 19.2 - HOUSEHOLD INCOME Average Household Income




Figure 19.3 - HOUSEHOLD INCOME Average Household Income




Figure 20.1 - POVERTY

(Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)





Figure 20.2 - POVERTY Percentage of Total Households in Poverty

Figure 20.3 - POVERTY Percentage of Total Households in Poverty




Figure 21.1 - FOOD STAMPS BY POVERTY STATUS





Figure 21.2 - FOOD STAMPS BY POVERTY STATUS

Figure 21.3 - FOOD STAMPS BY POVERTY STATUS Percentage of Households in Poverty That Do Not Receive Food Stamps




Figure 22.1 - FOOD STAMPS AND CASH PUBLIC ASSISTANCE Percentage of Households Receiving, or Not Receiving, Food Stamps or Cash Public Assistance*





Figure 22.2 - FOOD STAMPS AND CASH PUBLIC ASSISTANCE




Figure 23.1 - HOUSING

(Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)





Figure 23.2 - HOUSING Percentage of Housing Units That are a Detached House

Figure 23.3 - HOUSING Percentage of Housing Units That are a Detached House




Figure 24.1 - HOME OWNERSHIP




Figure 24.2 - HOME OWNERSHIP Percentage of Occupied Housing Units Owned by Occupant





Figure 24.3 - HOME OWNERSHIP Percentage of Occupied Housing Units Owned by Occupant




Figure 25.2 - MORTGAGE STATUS




Figure 25.3 - MORTGAGE STATUS Percentage of Owner-Occupied Housing Units without a Mortgage




Figure 26.1 - YEAR MOVED INTO UNIT




Figure 26.2 - YEAR MOVED INTO UNIT




Figure 26.3 - YEAR MOVED INTO UNIT Percentage of Population in Occupied Housing Units Who Moved in Prior to 2010




Figure 27.1 - MOVED IN PAST YEAR




Figure 27.2 - MOVED IN PAST YEAR




Figure 27.3 - MOVED IN PAST YEAR Percentage of Population Age 1+ Who Moved to Utah in the Past Year




Figure 28.1 - VACANCY RATES

(Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)






Figure 28.2 - VACANCY RATES Percentage of Housing Units That are Vacant
