1	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
	Section 1. Section 17-22-2.5 is amended to read:
	17-22-2.5. Fees of sheriff.
	[(1) The sheriff shall receive the following fees:]
	(1) (a) The legislative body of a county may set a fee for a service described in this

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30	section and charged by the county sheriff:
31	(i) in an ordinance adopted under Section 17-53-223; and
32	(ii) in an amount reasonably related to, but not exceeding, the actual cost of providing
33	the service.
34	(b) If the legislative body of a county does not under Subsection (1)(a) set a fee
35	charged by the county sheriff, the sheriff shall charge a fee in accordance with Subsections (2)
36	through (7).
37	(2) Unless under Subsection (1) the legislative body of a county sets a fee amount for a
38	fee described in this Subsection (2), the sheriff shall charge the following fees:
39	(a) for serving a notice, rule, order, subpoena, garnishment, summons, or summons
40	and complaint, or garnishee execution, or other process by which an action or proceeding is
41	commenced, on each defendant, including copies when furnished by plaintiff, [\$15] \$20;
42	(b) for taking or approving a bond or undertaking in any case in which he is
43	authorized to take or approve a bond or undertaking, including justification, \$5;
44	(c) for a copy of any writ, process or other paper when demanded or required by law,
45	for each folio, 50 cents;
46	(d) for serving an attachment on property, or levying an execution, or executing an
47	order of arrest or an order for the delivery of personal property, including copies when
48	furnished by plaintiff, \$50;
49	(e) for taking and keeping possession of and preserving property under attachment or
50	execution or other process, the amount the court orders to a maximum of \$15 per day;
51	(f) for advertising property for sale on execution, or any judgment, or order of sale,
52	exclusive of the cost of publication, \$15;
53	(g) for drawing and executing a sheriff's deed or a certificate of redemption, exclusive
54	of acknowledgment, \$15, to be paid by the grantee;
55	(h) for recording each deed, conveyance, or other instrument affecting real estate,

74	advertising shall be collected from the judgment debtor as part of the execution in the same
75	manner as the sum directed to be made.
76	[(3)] (4) When serving an attachment on property, an order of arrest, or an order for
77	the delivery of personal property, the sheriff may only collect traveling fees for the distance
78	actually traveled beyond the distance required to serve the summons if the attachment or those
79	orders:
80	(a) accompany the summons in the action; and
81	(b) may be executed at the time of the service of the summons.
82	[(4)] (5) (a) (i) When traveling generally to serve notices, orders, process, or other
83	papers, the sheriff may receive [\$1.50], except as otherwise provided under Subsection (1)(a),
84	$\underline{\$2.50}$ for each mile necessarily traveled, in going only, computed from the courthouse for each
85	person served, to a maximum of 100 miles.

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86	(ii) When transmitting notices, orders, process, or other papers by mail, the sheriff
87	may receive [\$1.50], except as otherwise provided under Subsection (1)(a), \$2.50 for each
88	mile necessarily traveled, in going only, computed from the post office where received for
89	each person served, to a maximum of 100 miles.
90	(b) The sheriff may only charge one mileage fee if any two or more papers are required
91	to be served in the same action or proceeding at the same time and at the same address.
92	(c) If it is necessary to make more than one trip to serve any notice, order, process, or
93	other paper, the sheriff may not collect more than two additional mileage charges.
94	[(5)] (a) For delivering an insane person to the Utah State Hospital, when the cost
95	of delivery is payable by private individuals, the sheriff may collect [\$1.50], except as
96	otherwise provided under Subsection (1)(a), \$2.50 per mile for the distance from the county
97	seat of his county to the Utah State Hospital, to a maximum of 100 miles.
98	(b) If the sheriff requires assistance to deliver the person to the Utah State Hospital,
99	the sheriff may also charge the actual and necessary cost of that assistance.
100	[(6) For] (7) (a) Subject to Subsection (7)(b), for obtaining a saliva DNA specimen
101	under Section 53-10-404, the sheriff shall collect the fee of \$100 in accordance with Section
102	53-10-404.
103	(b) The fee amount described in Subsection (7)(a) cannot be changed by a county
