 (Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)

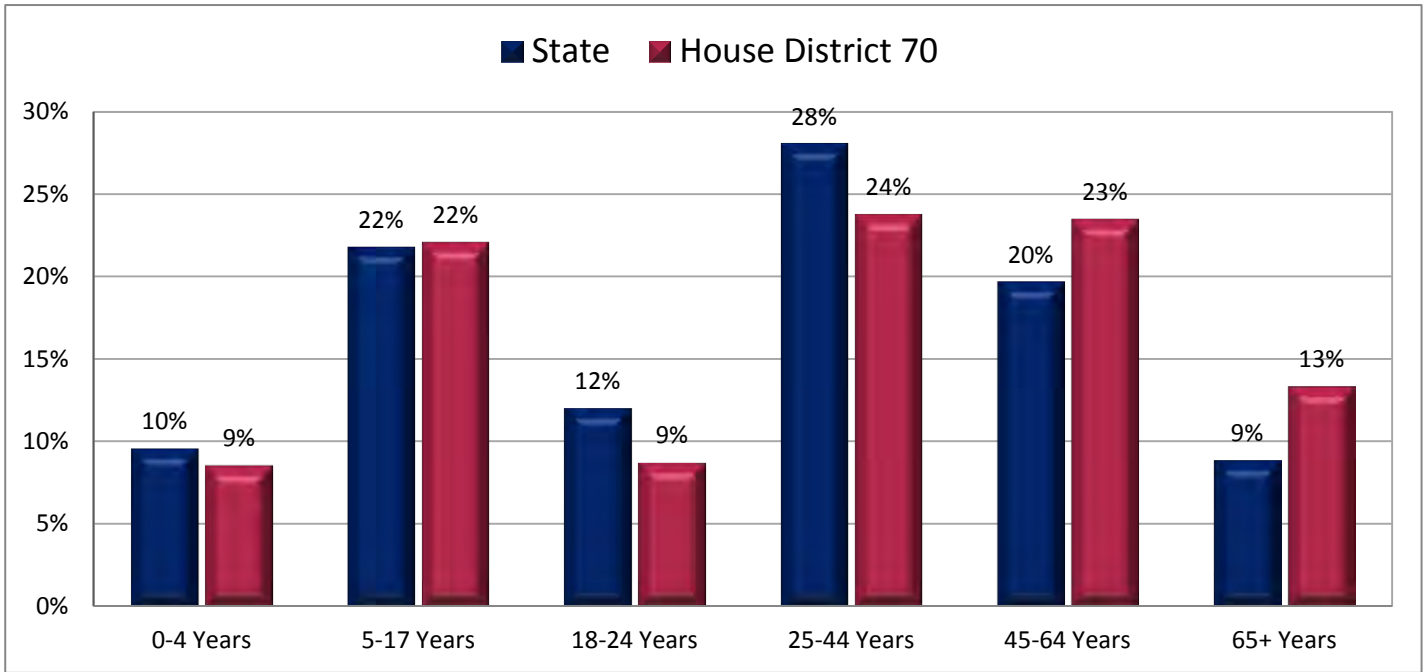


Figure 1.2 - AGE

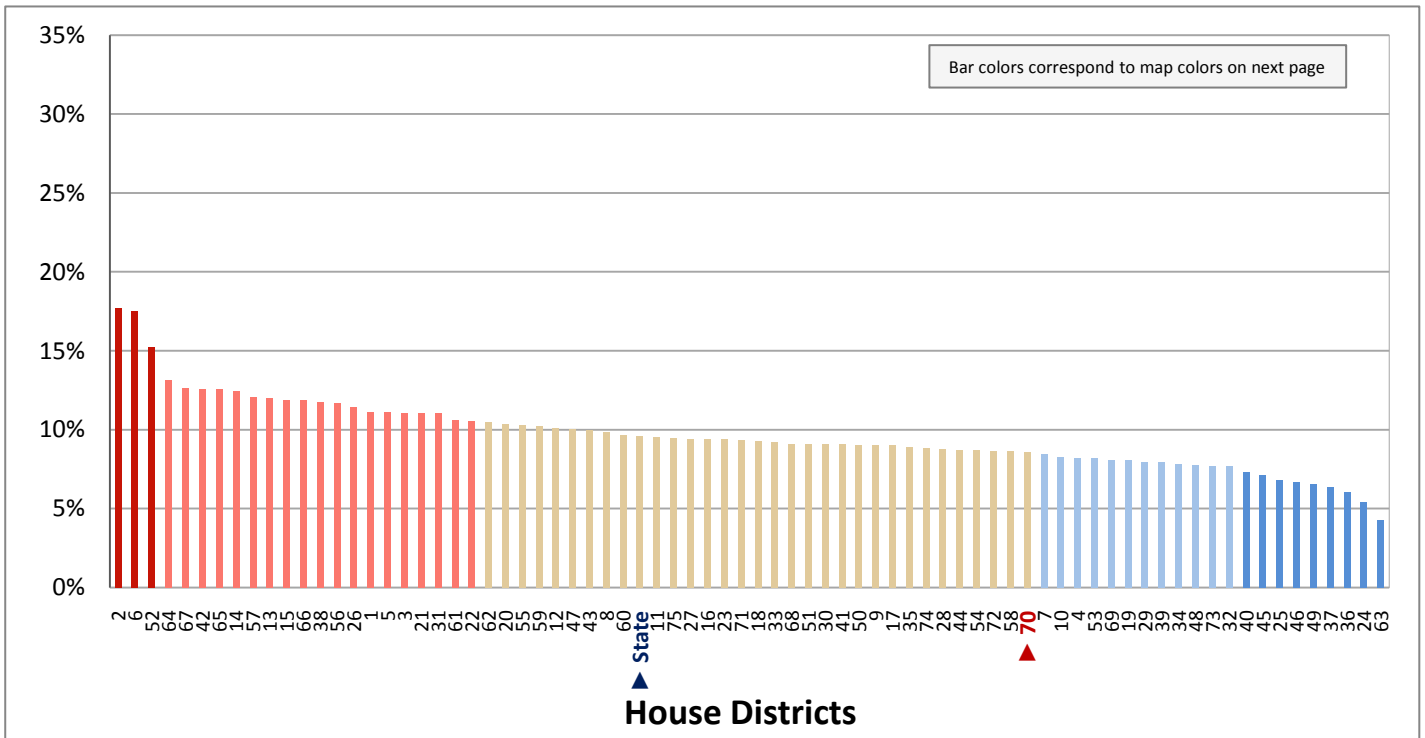


Figure 1.3 - AGE

(First category in Figure 1.1; same data presented in Figure 1.3; additional data in Table 1 of the appendix)

Percentage of Population Age 0-4

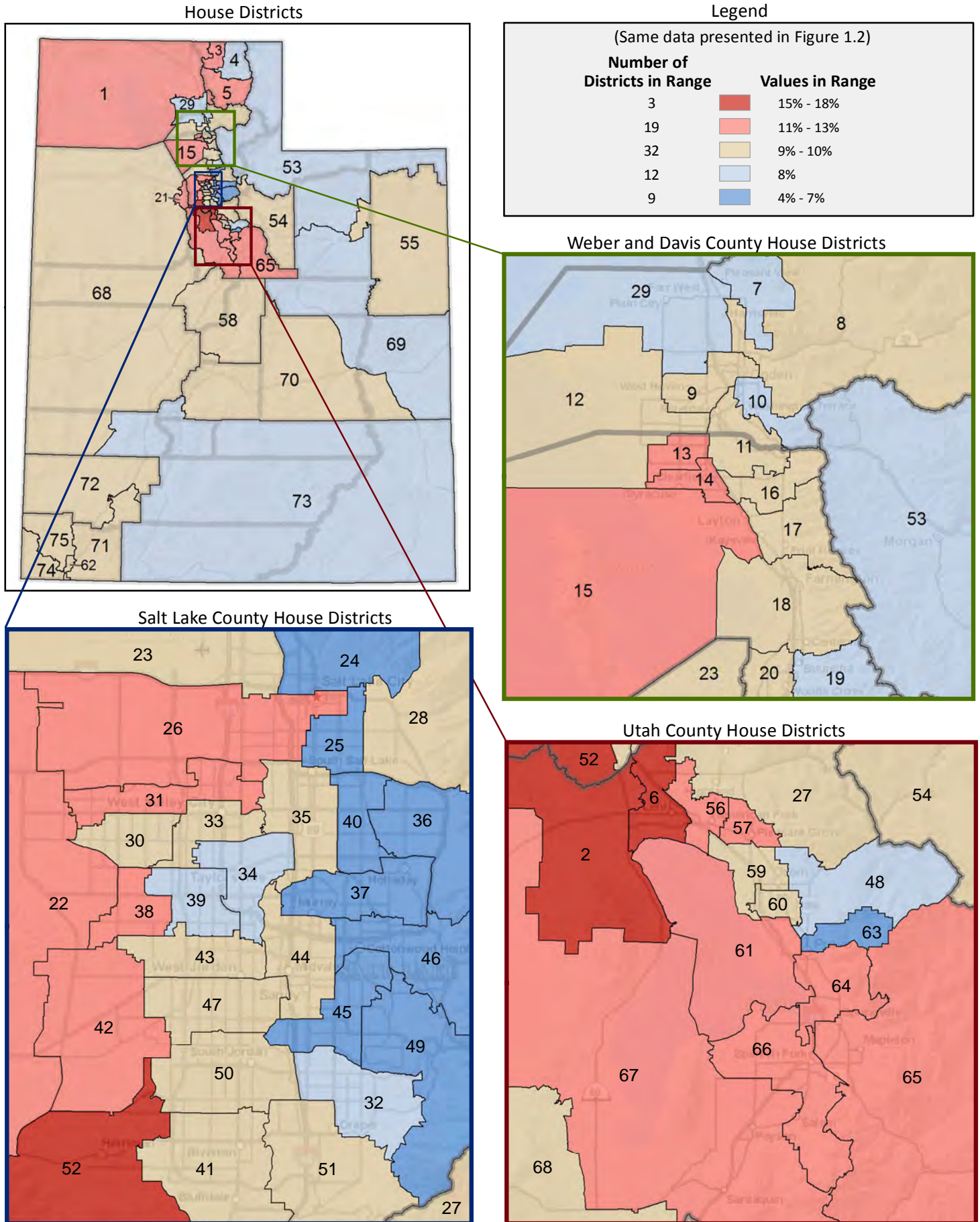


Figure 1.4 - AGE

(Second category in Figure 1.1; same data presented in Figure 1.6; additional data in Table 1 of the appendix)

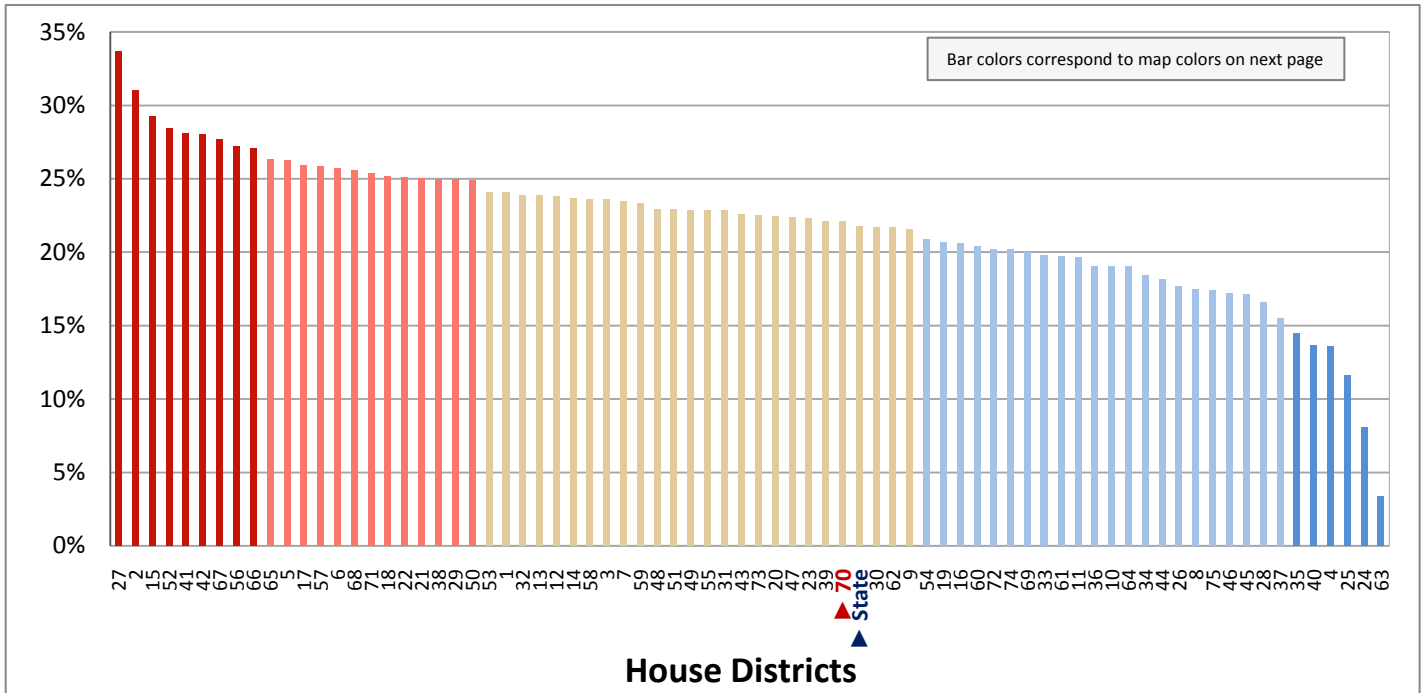


Figure 1.5- AGE

(Last category in Figure 1.1; additional data in Table 1 of the appendix)

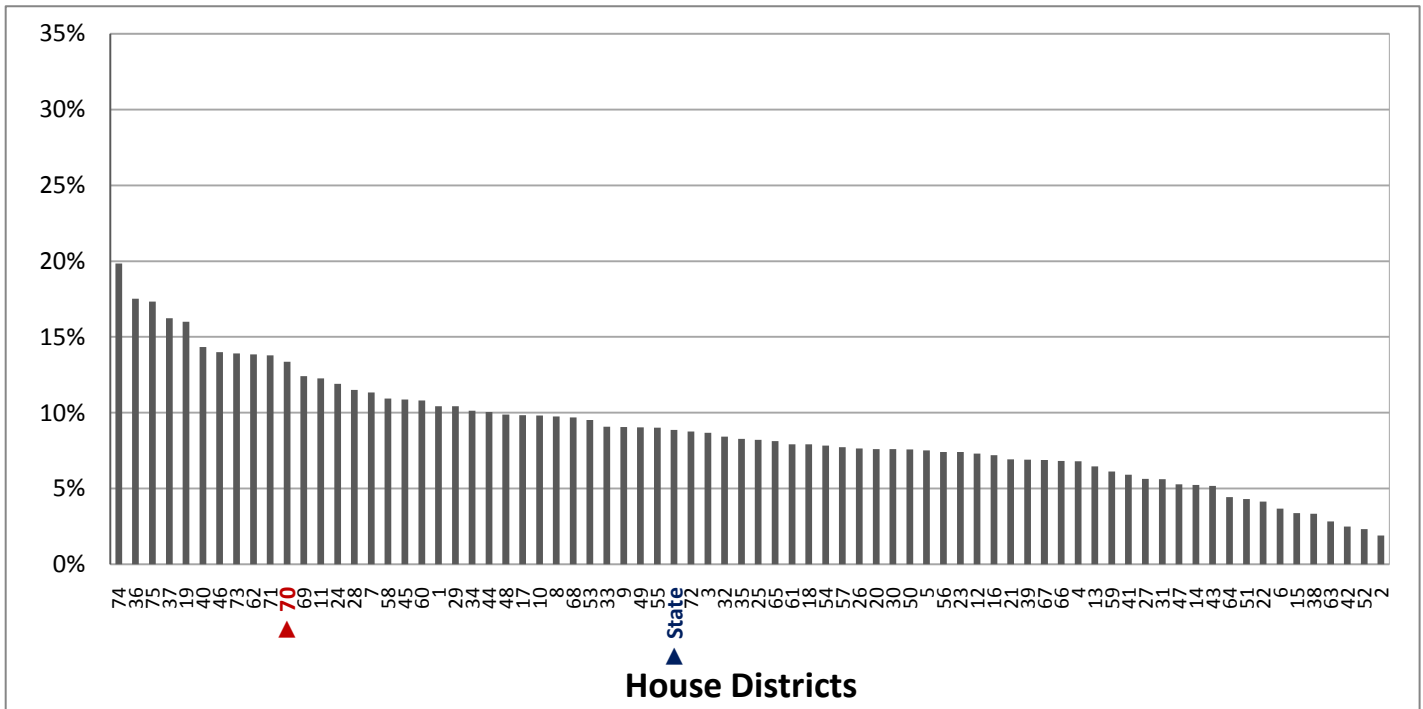


Figure 1.6 - AGE

Percentage of Population Who are School Age Children (Age 5-17)

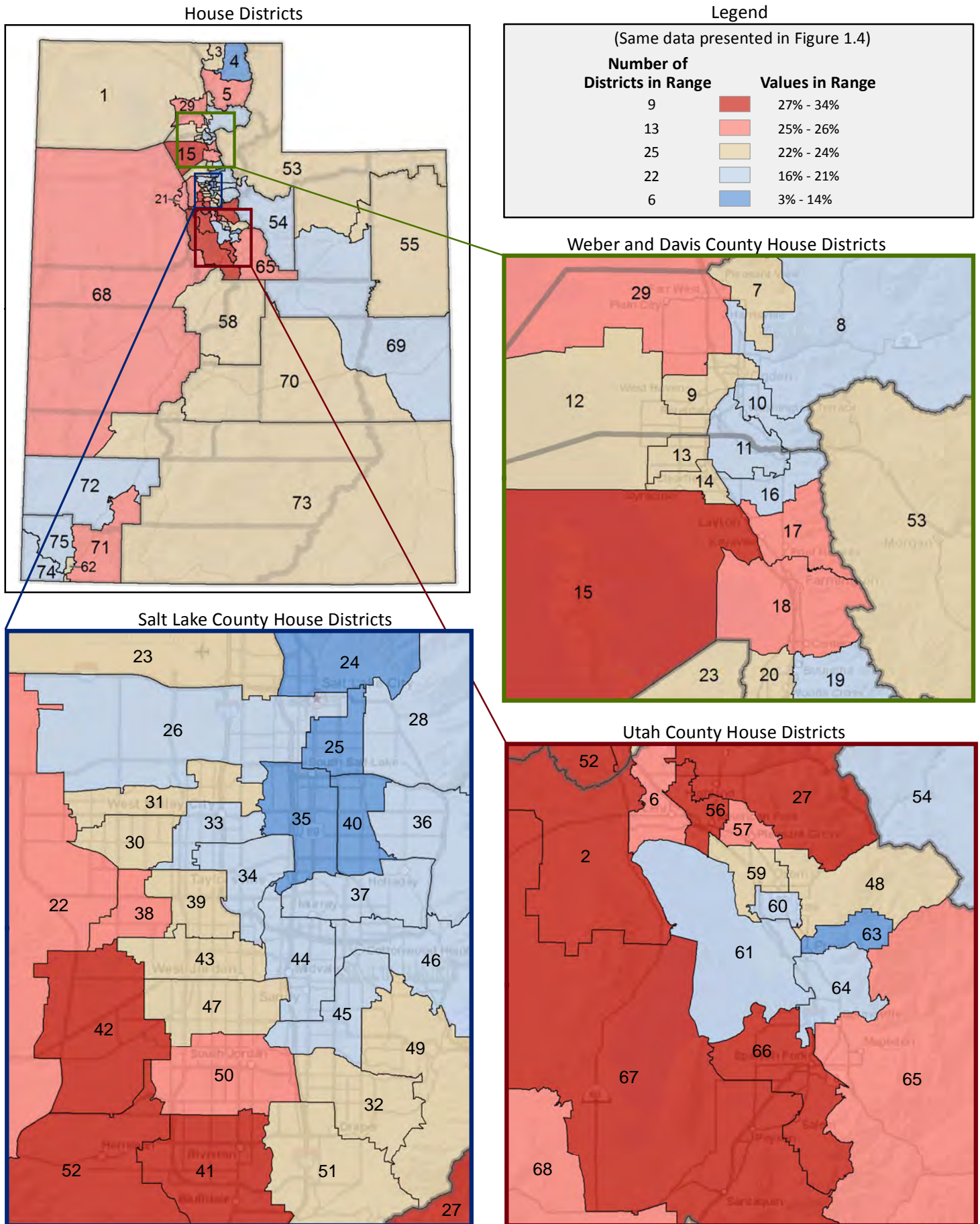


Figure 2.1 - RACE

 (Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)

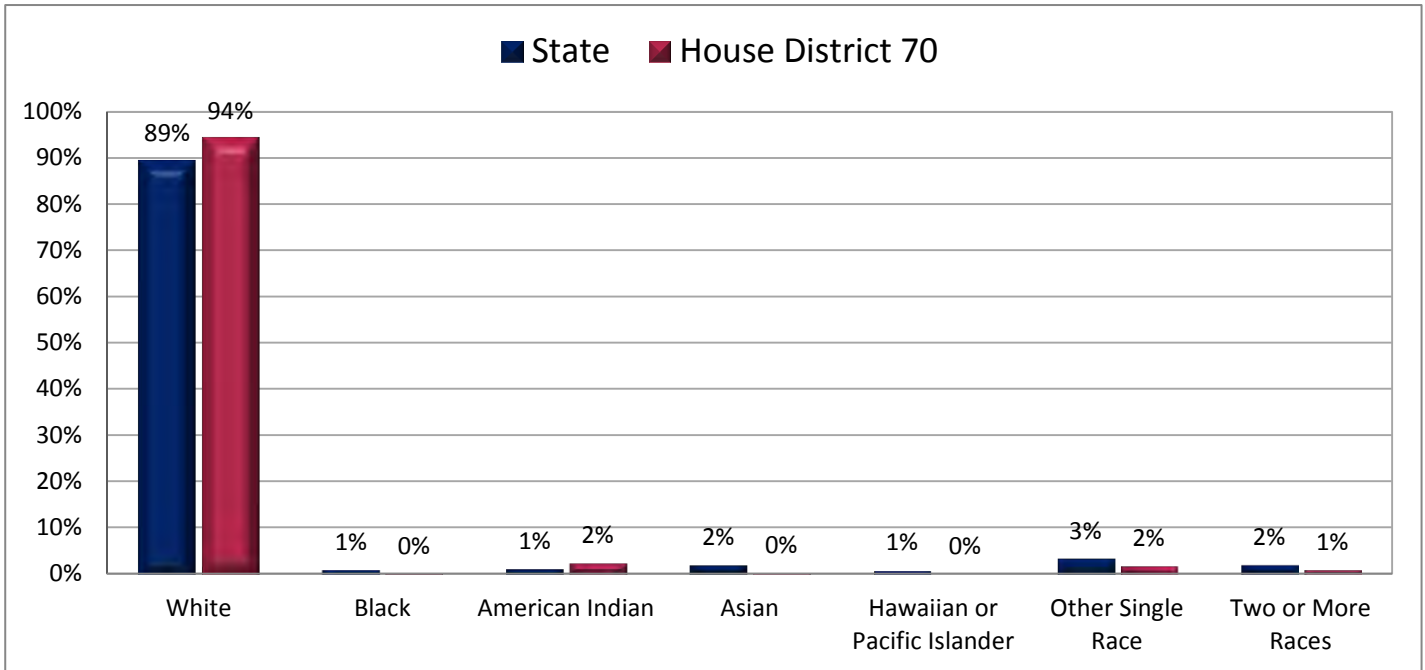
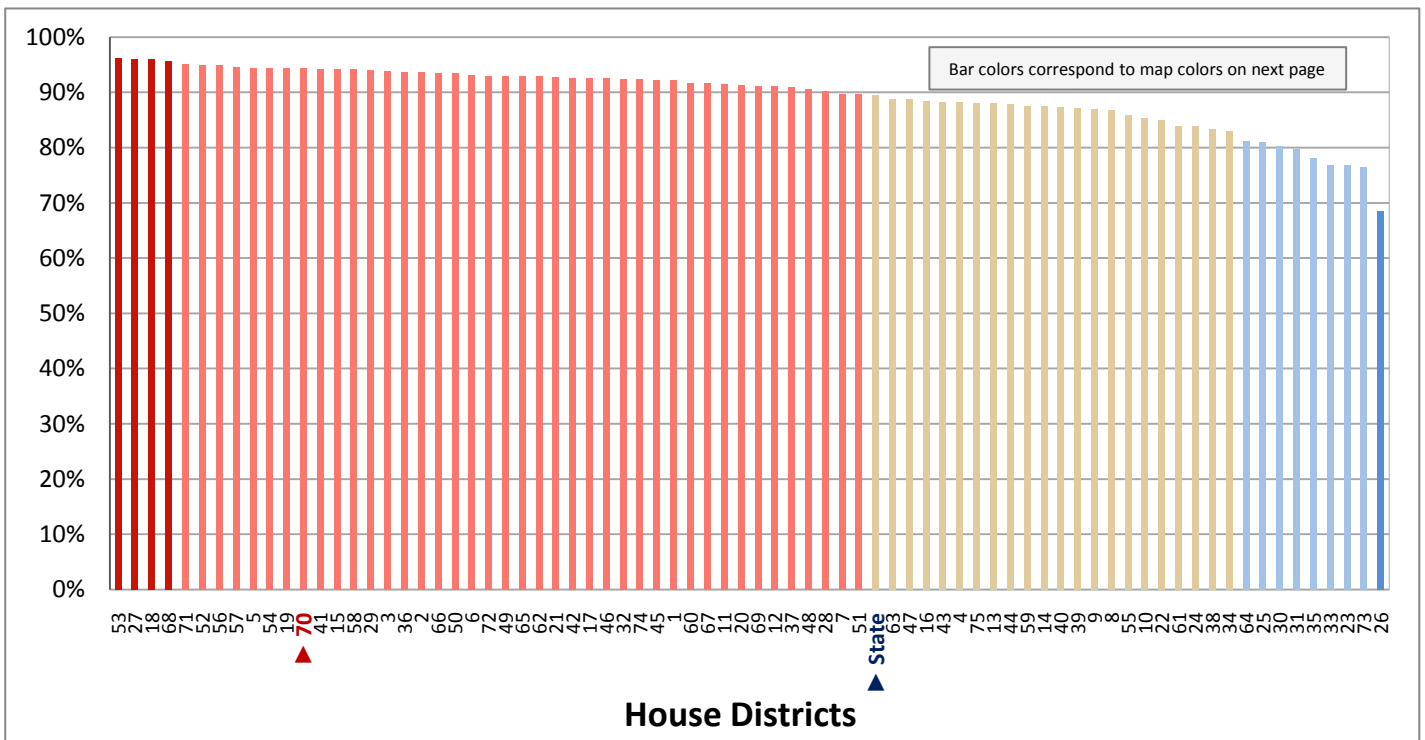


Figure 2.2 - RACE

Percentage of Population Who are White

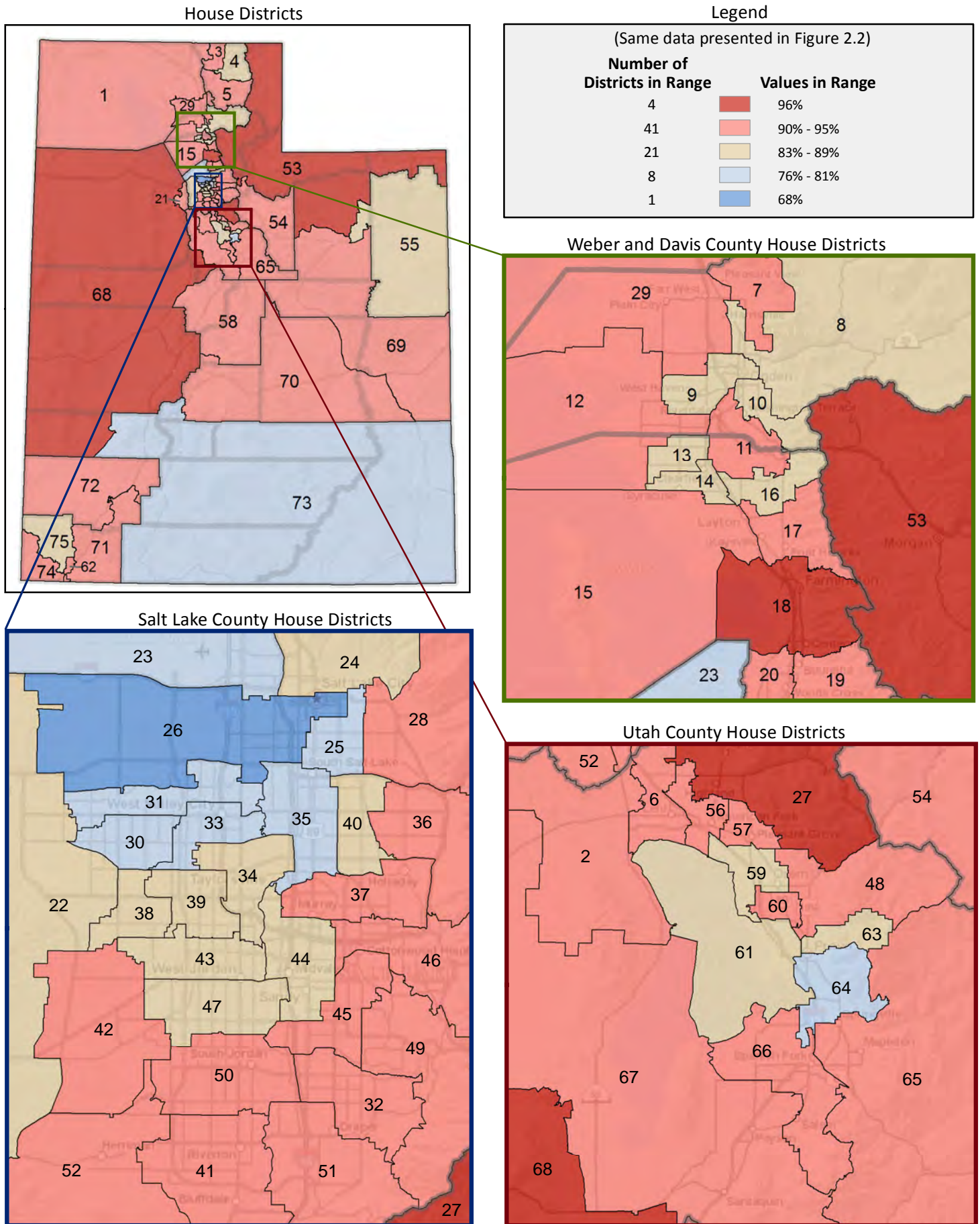


Figure 3.1 - HISPANIC OR LATINO

 (Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)

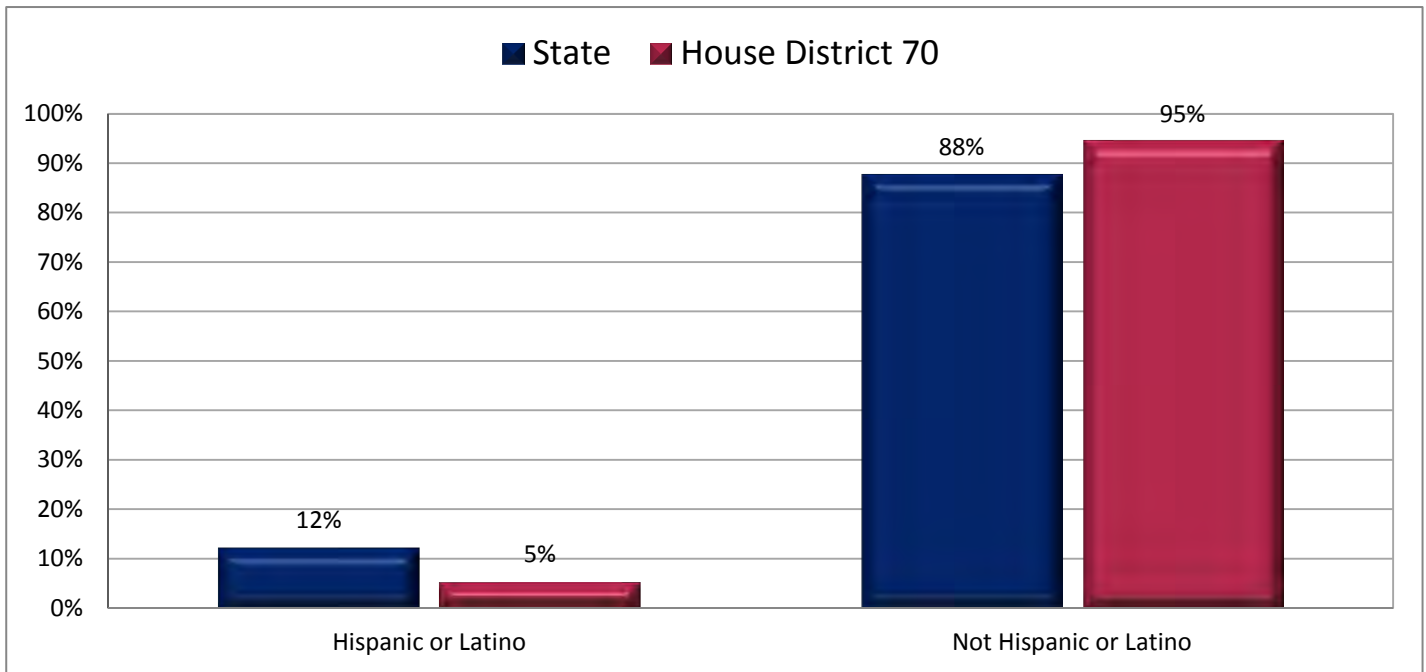
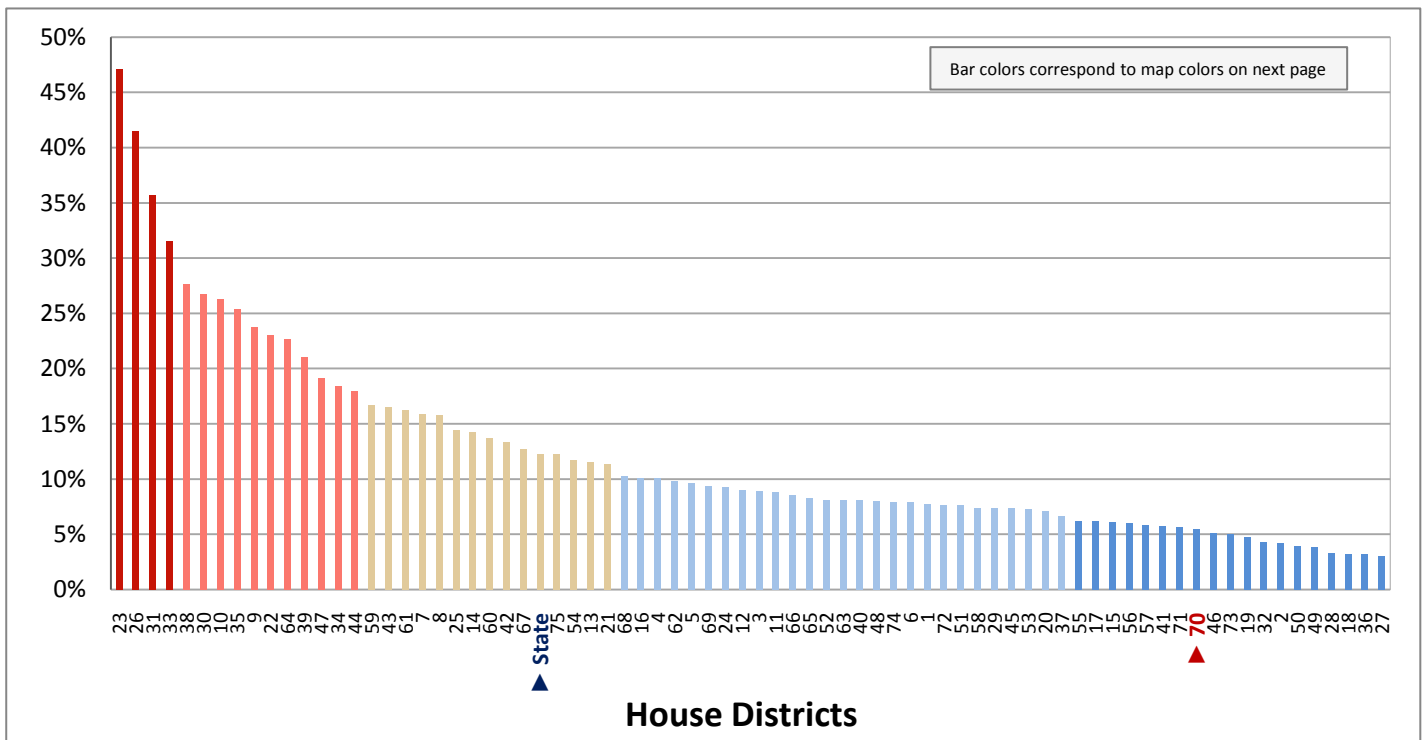


Figure 3.2 - HISPANIC OR LATINO

Percentage of Population Who are Hispanic or Latino

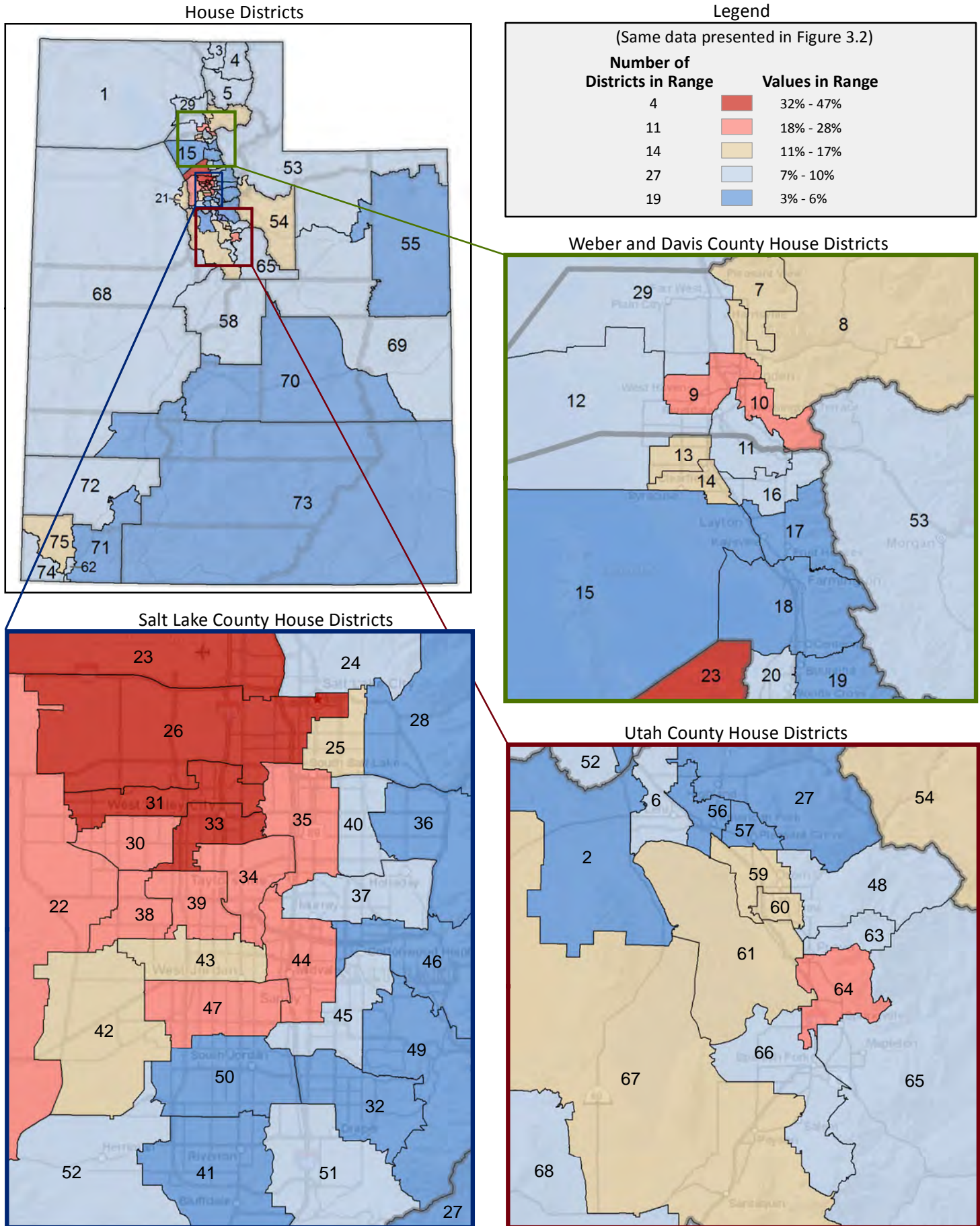


Figure 4.1 - LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME

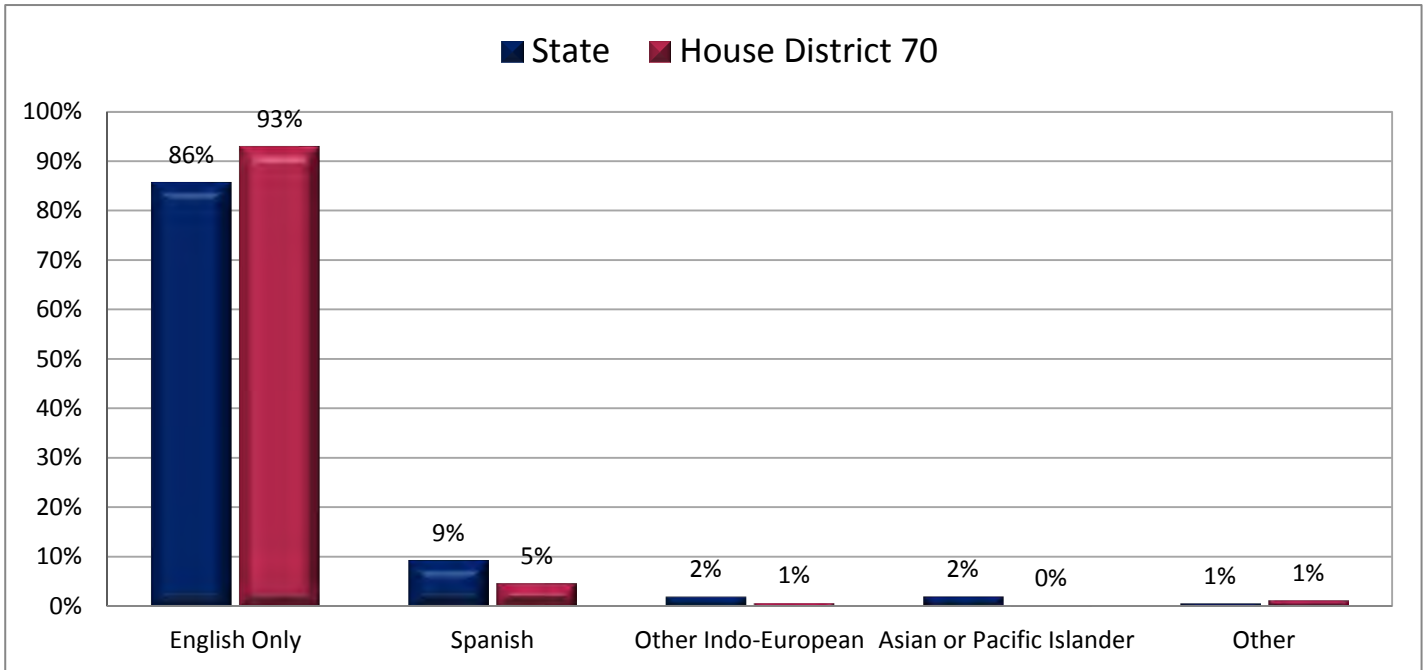


Figure 4.2 - LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME

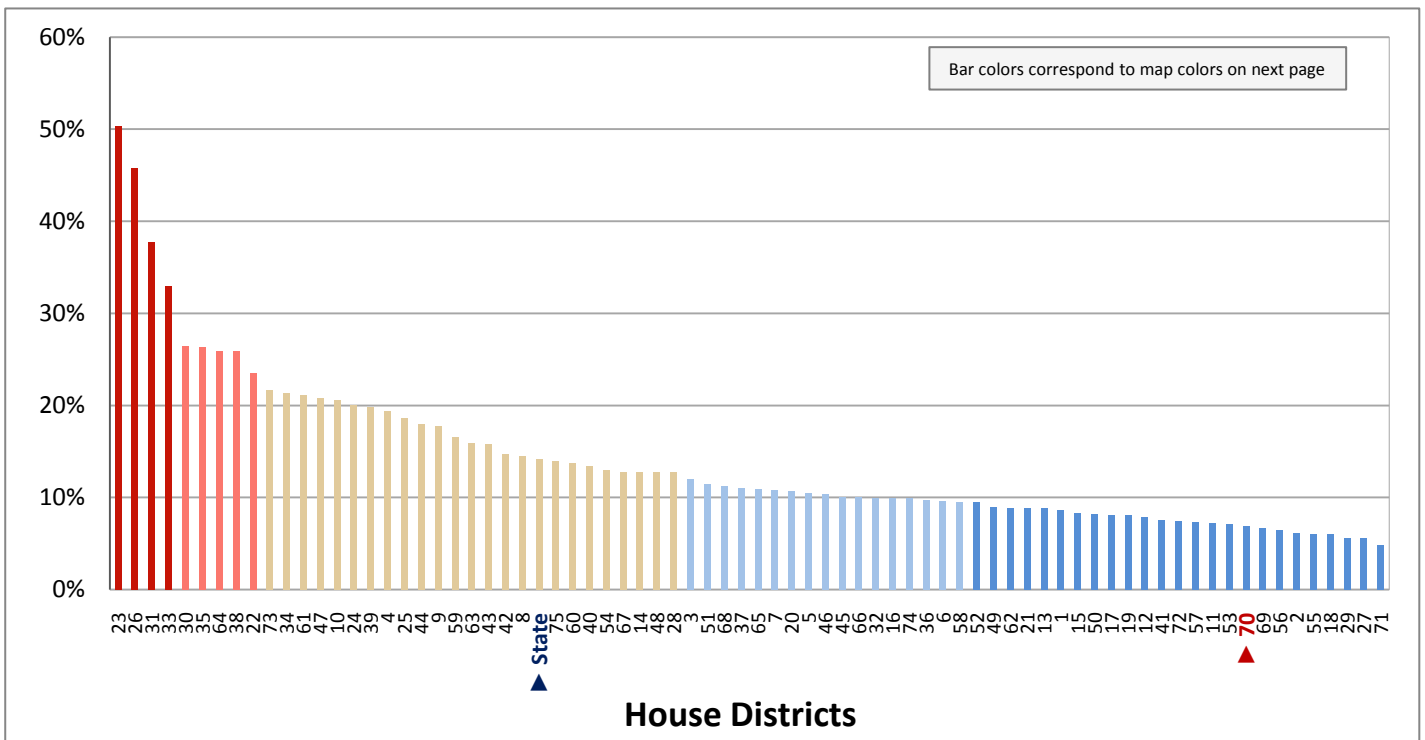


Figure 4.3 - LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME
 Percentage of Population Age 5+ Who Do Not Speak English at Home

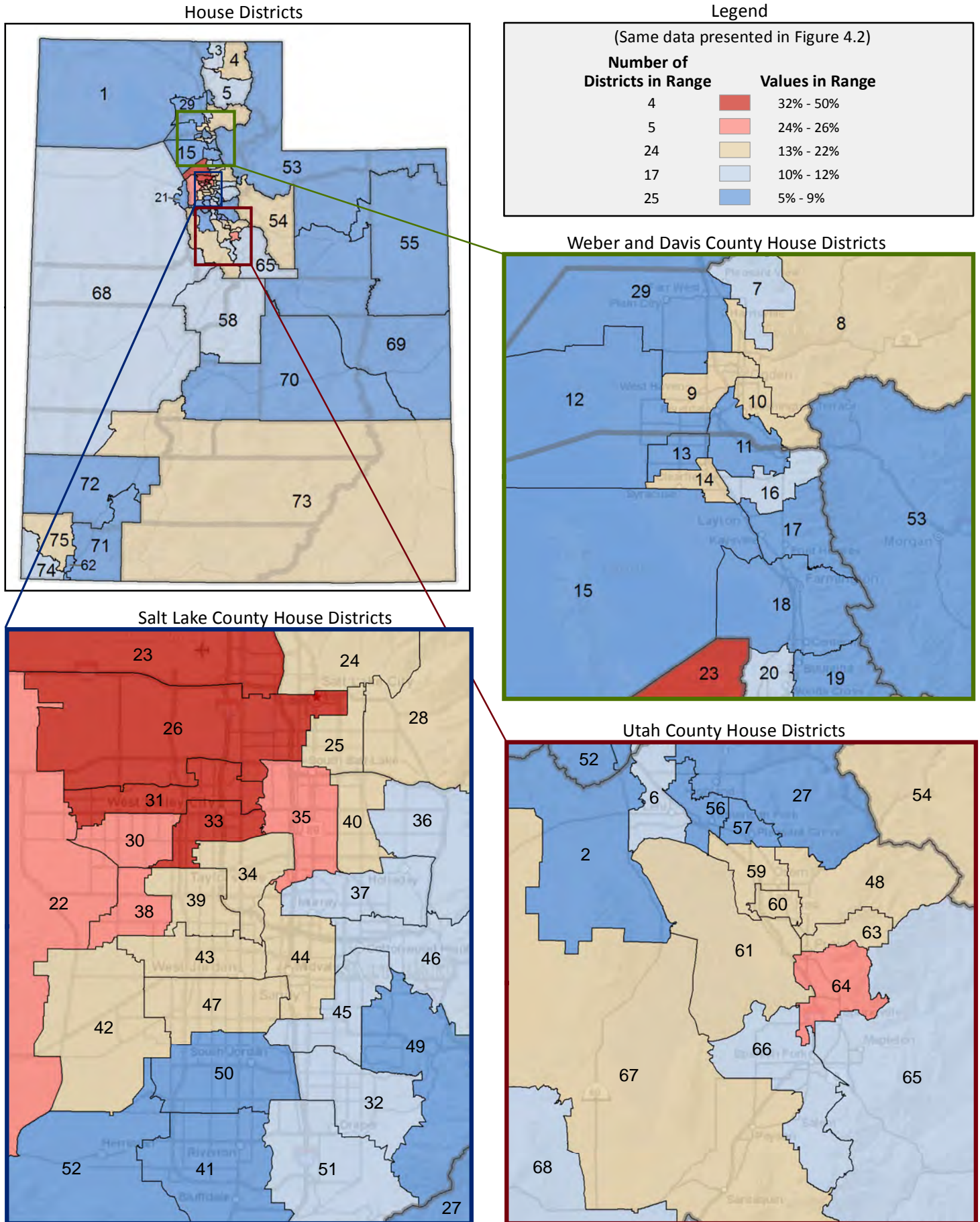


Figure 5.1 - BIRTHPLACE AND CITIZENSHIP

 (Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)

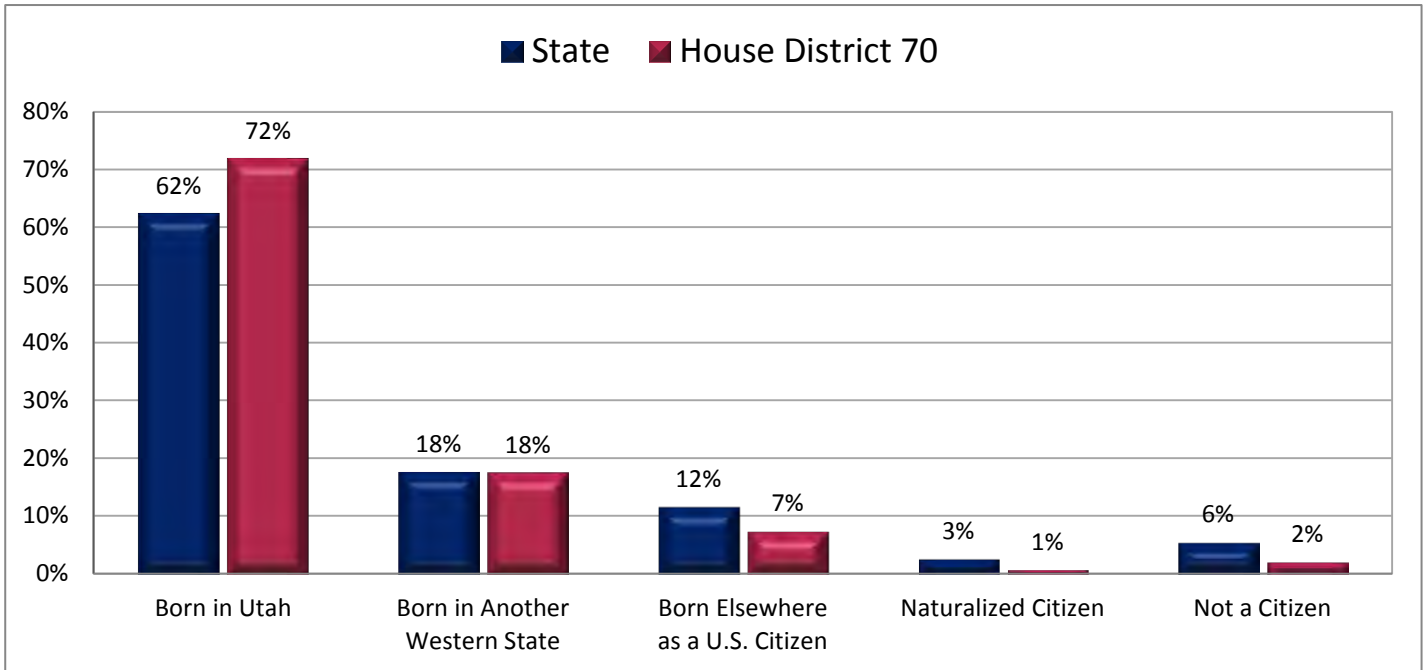


Figure 5.2 - BIRTHPLACE AND CITIZENSHIP

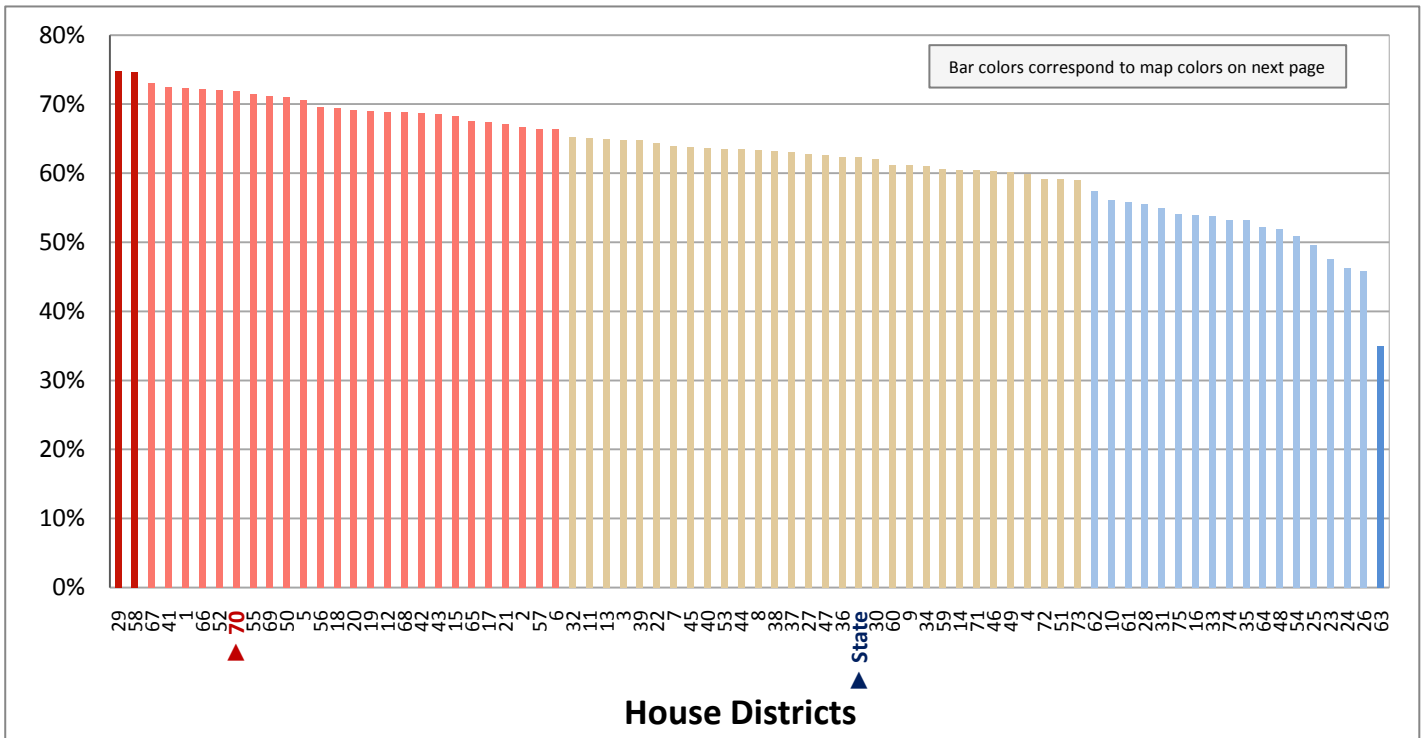


Figure 5.3 - BIRTHPLACE AND CITIZENSHIP

 (First category in Figure 5.1; same data presented in Figure 5.3; additional data in Table 5 of the appendix)

Percentage of Population Born in Utah

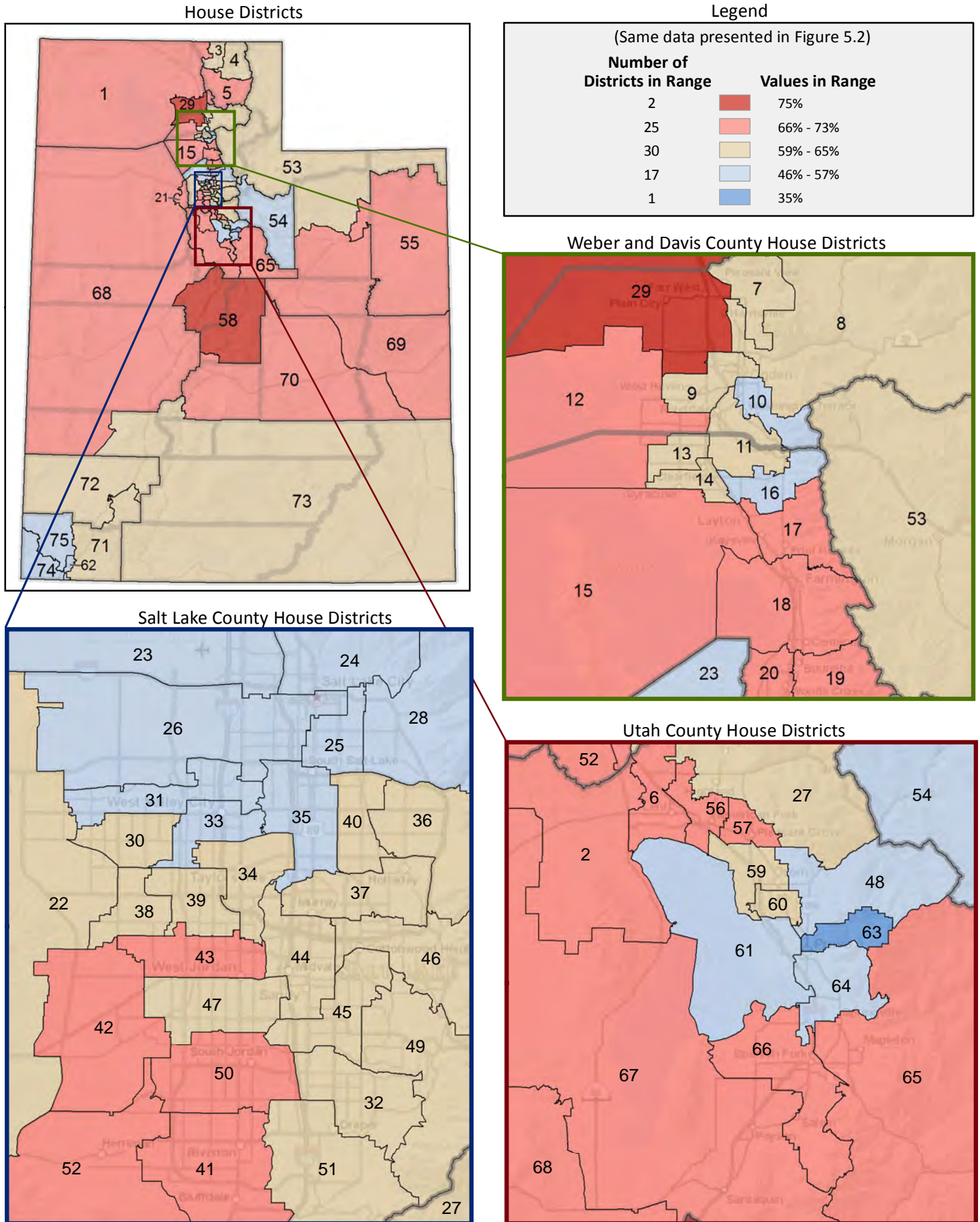


Figure 5.4 - BIRTHPLACE AND CITIZENSHIP

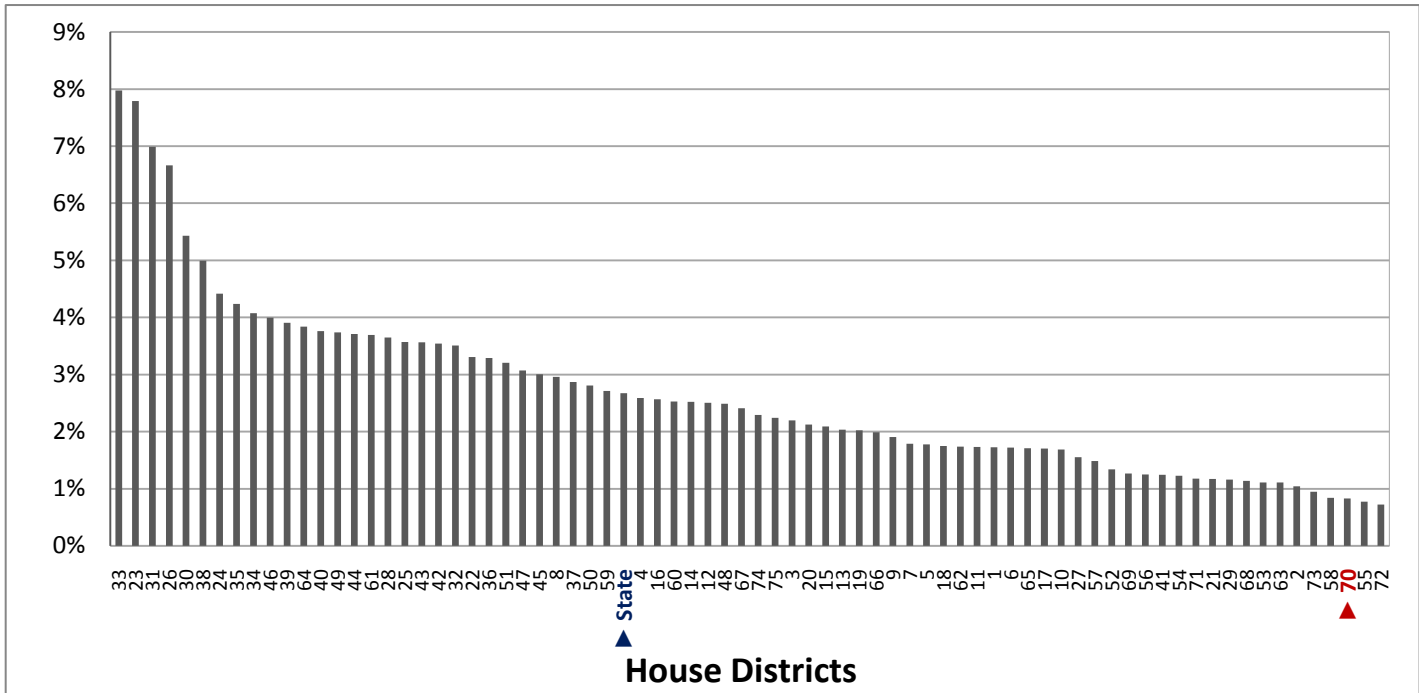


Figure 5.5 - BIRTHPLACE AND CITIZENSHIP

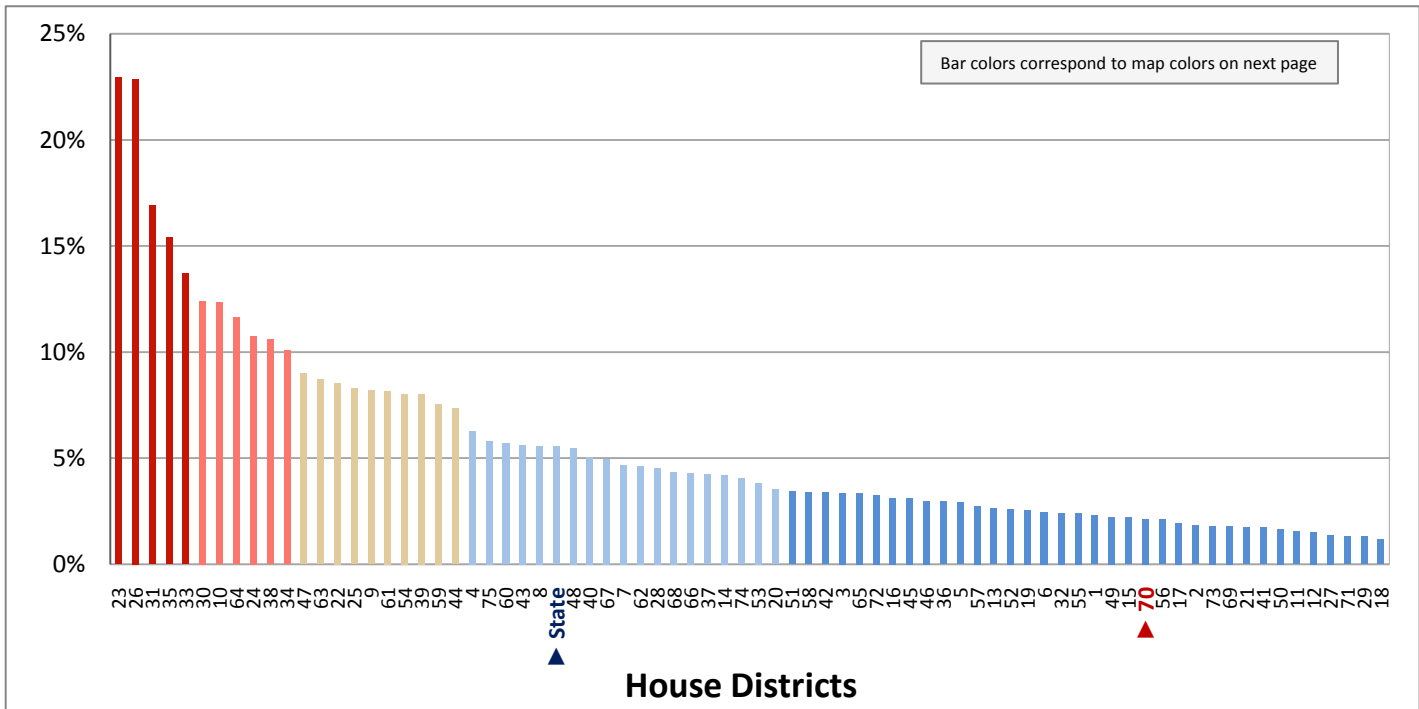


Figure 5.6 - BIRTHPLACE AND CITIZENSHIP

(Last category in Figure 5.1; same data presented in Figure 5.6; additional data in Table 5 of the appendix)

Percentage of Population Who are Not Citizens

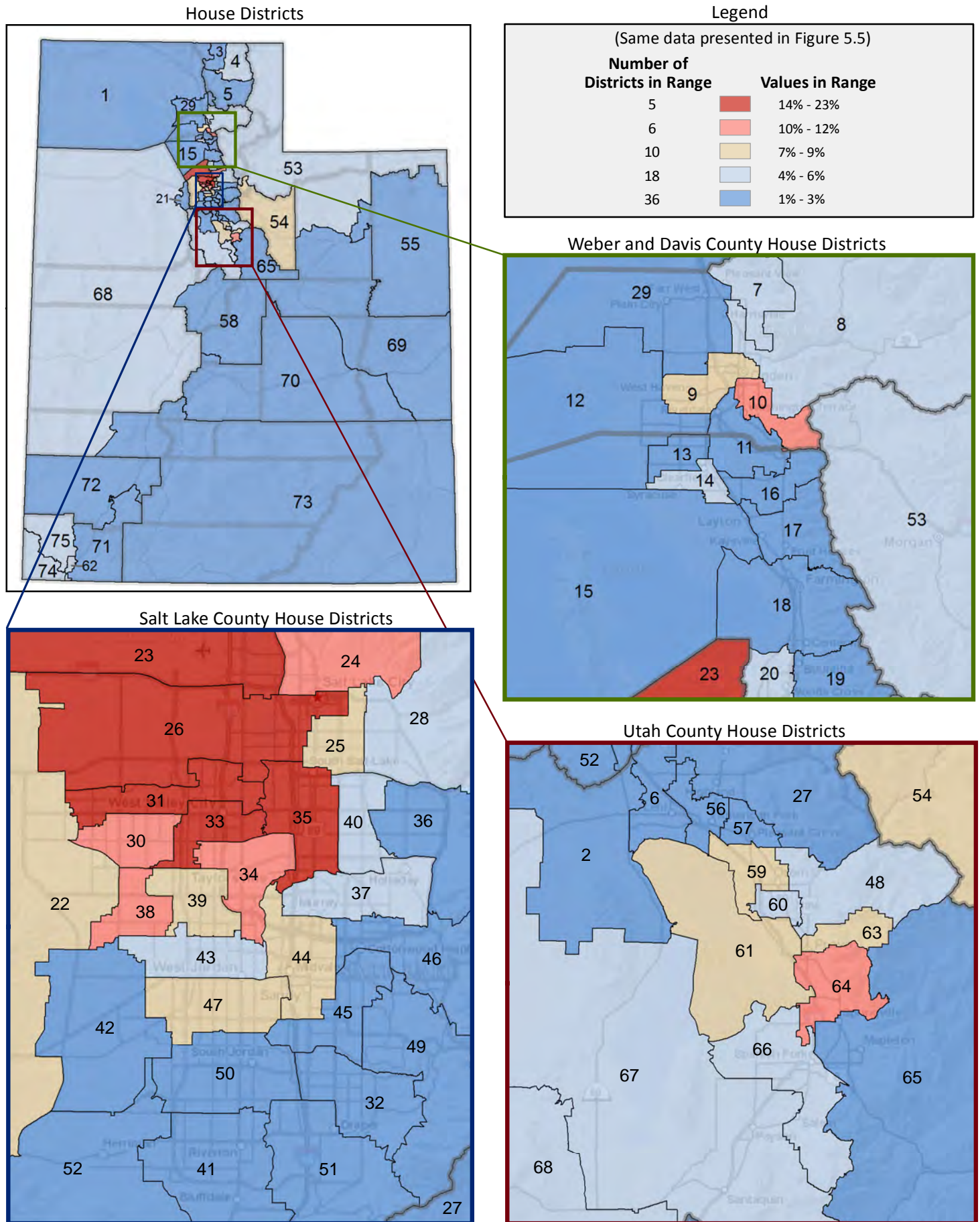


Figure 6.1 - HOUSEHOLD TYPE

 (Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)

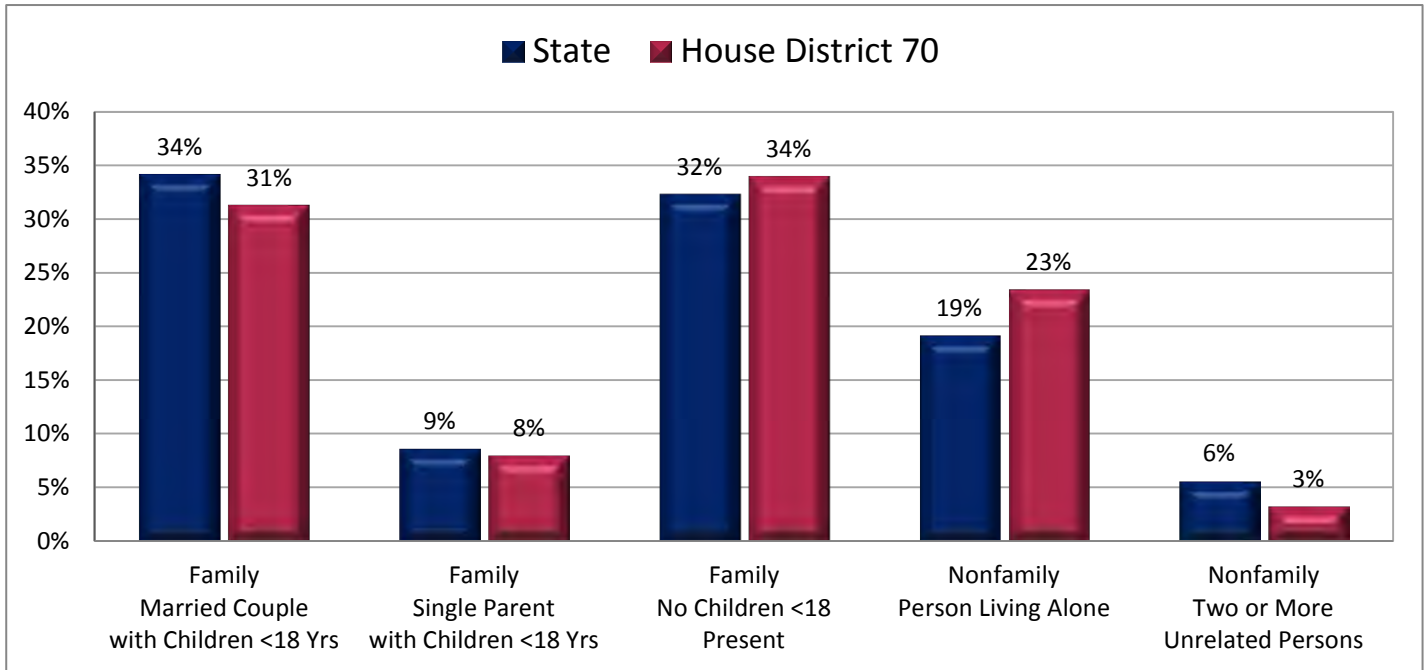
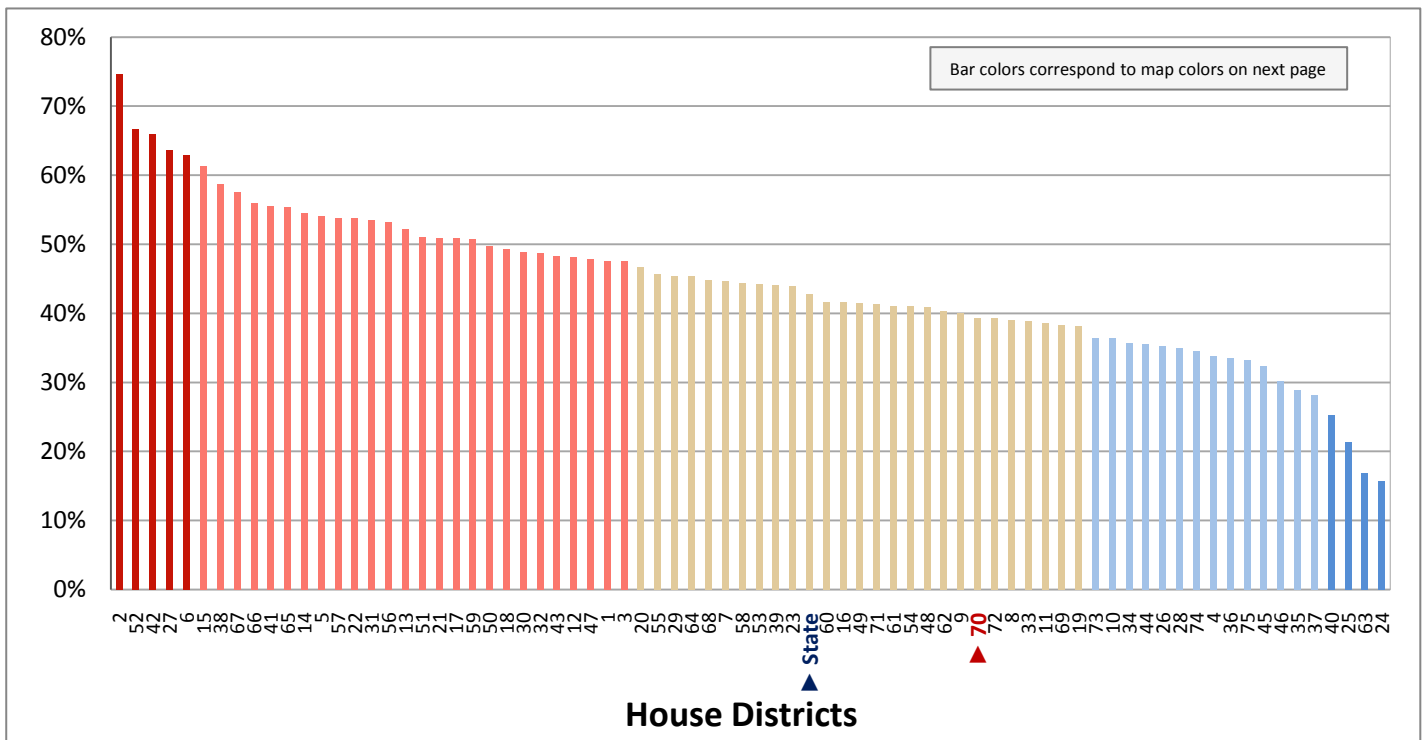


Figure 6.2 - HOUSEHOLD TYPE

Percentage of Households That are a Family with a Child Under Age 18 Present

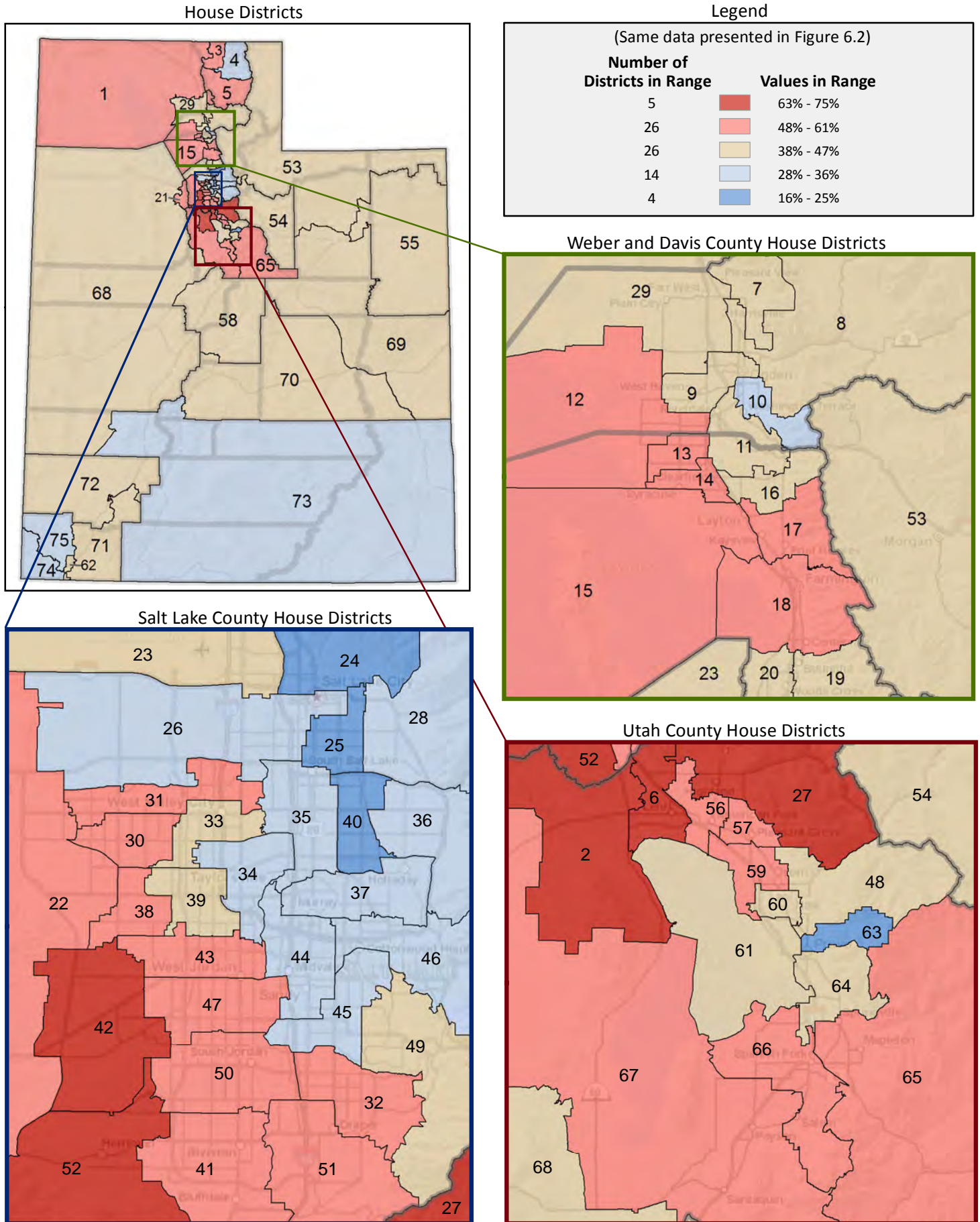


Figure 7.1 - HOUSEHOLD TYPE AND SIZE

 (Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)

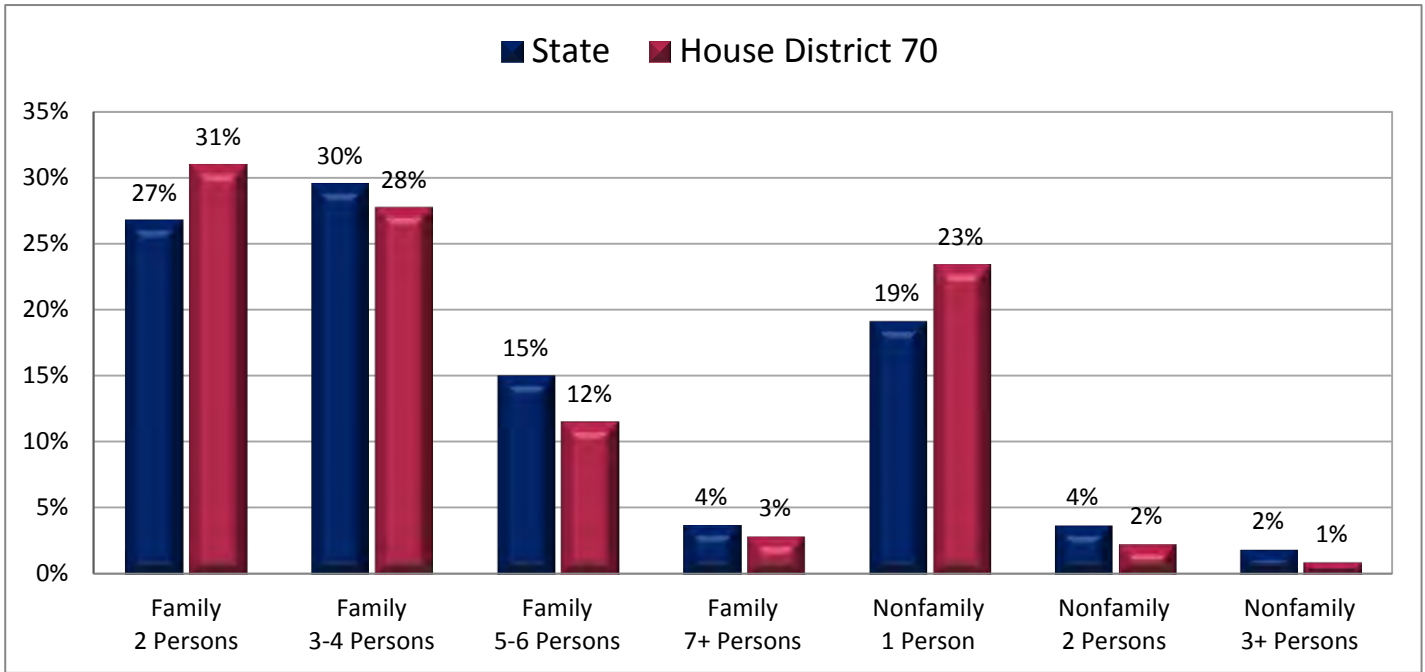
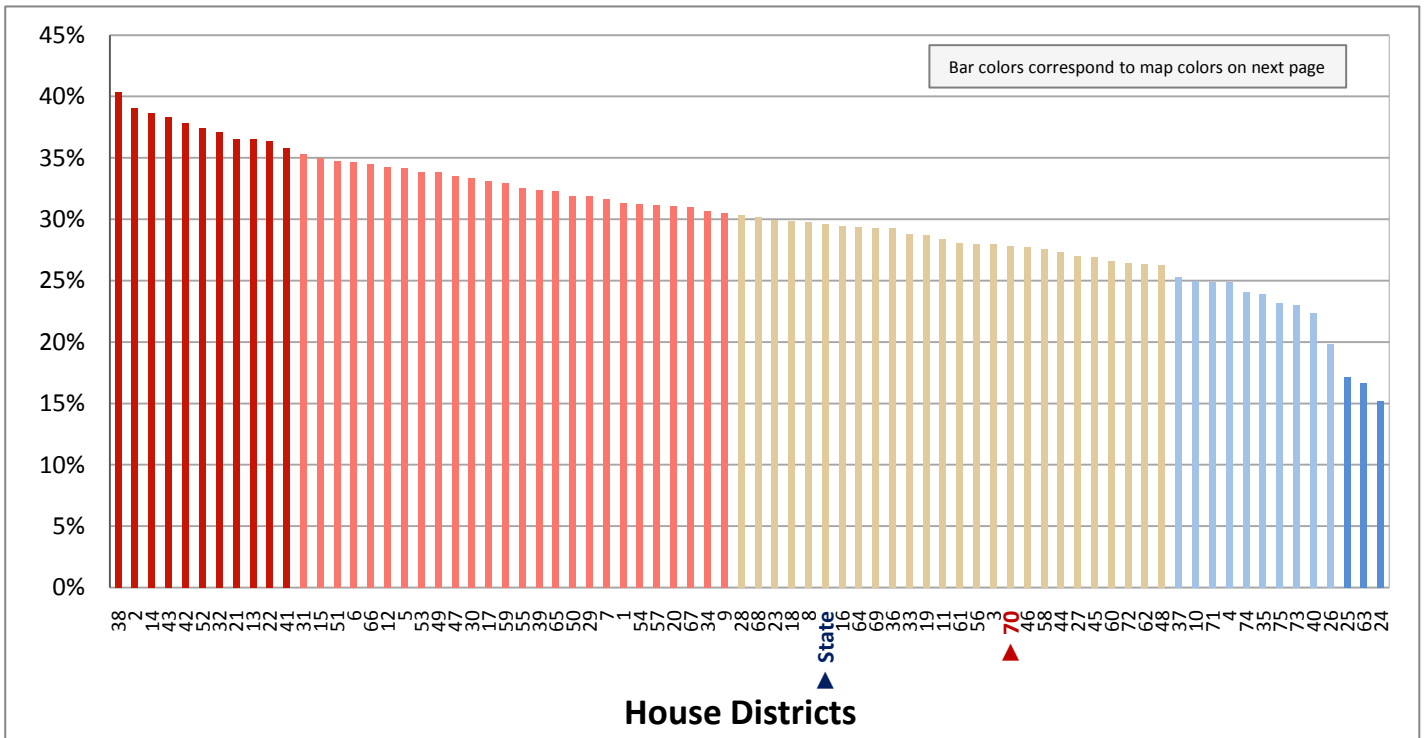


Figure 7.2 - HOUSEHOLD TYPE AND SIZE

Percentage of Households That are 3-4 Person Family Households

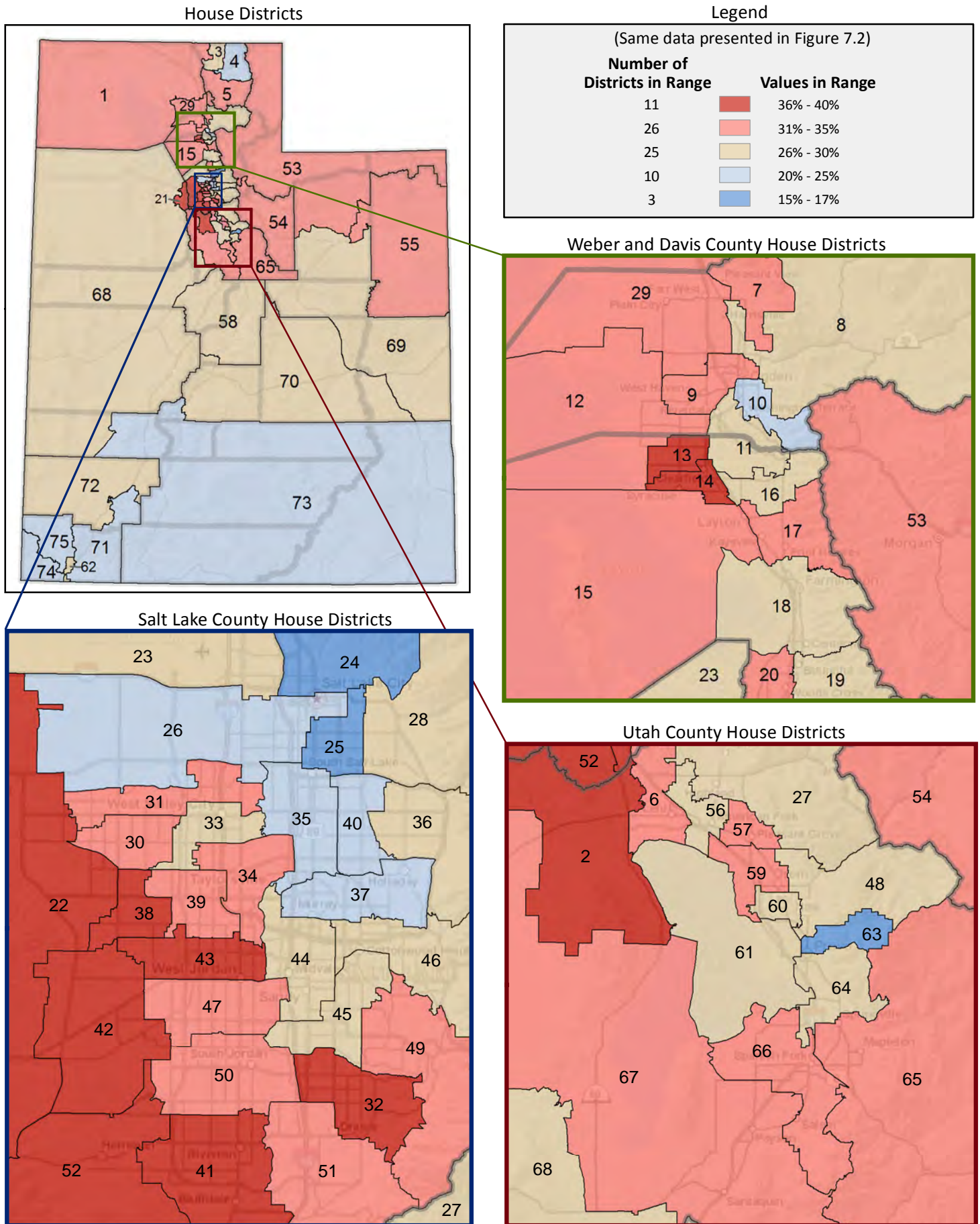


Figure 8.1 - MARITAL STATUS

 (Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)

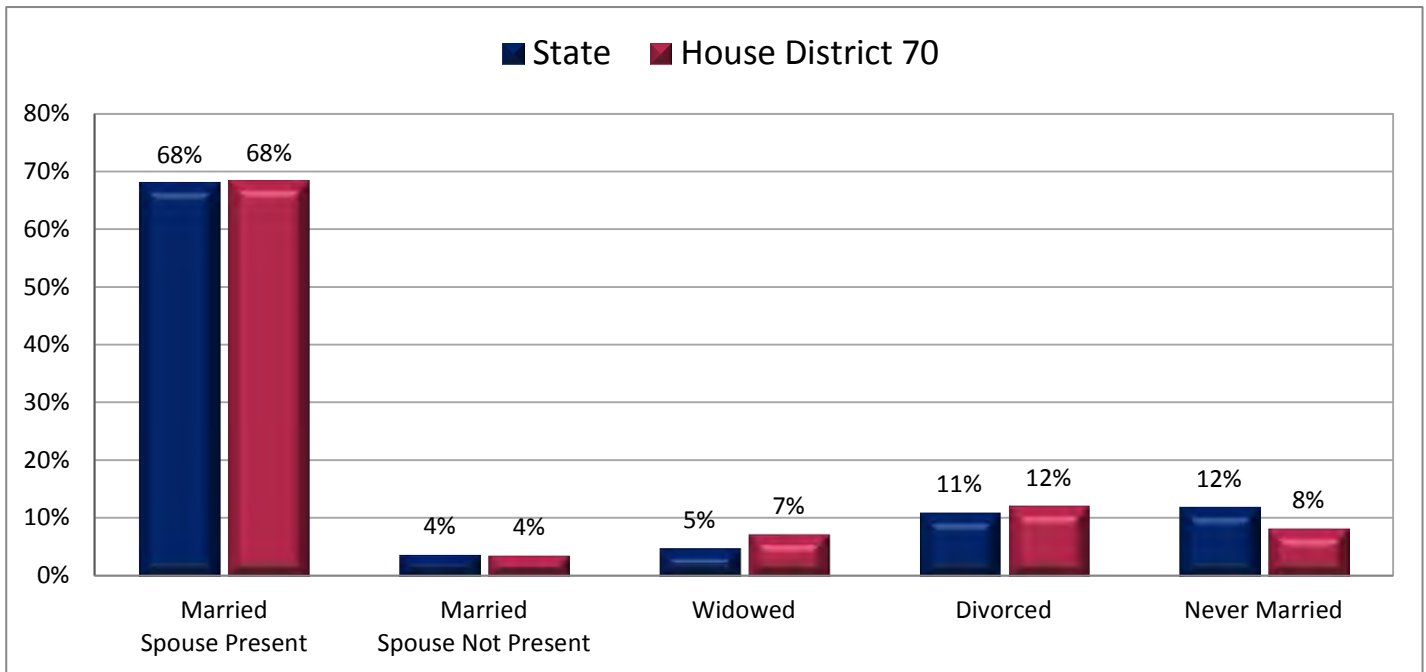


Figure 8.2 - MARITAL STATUS

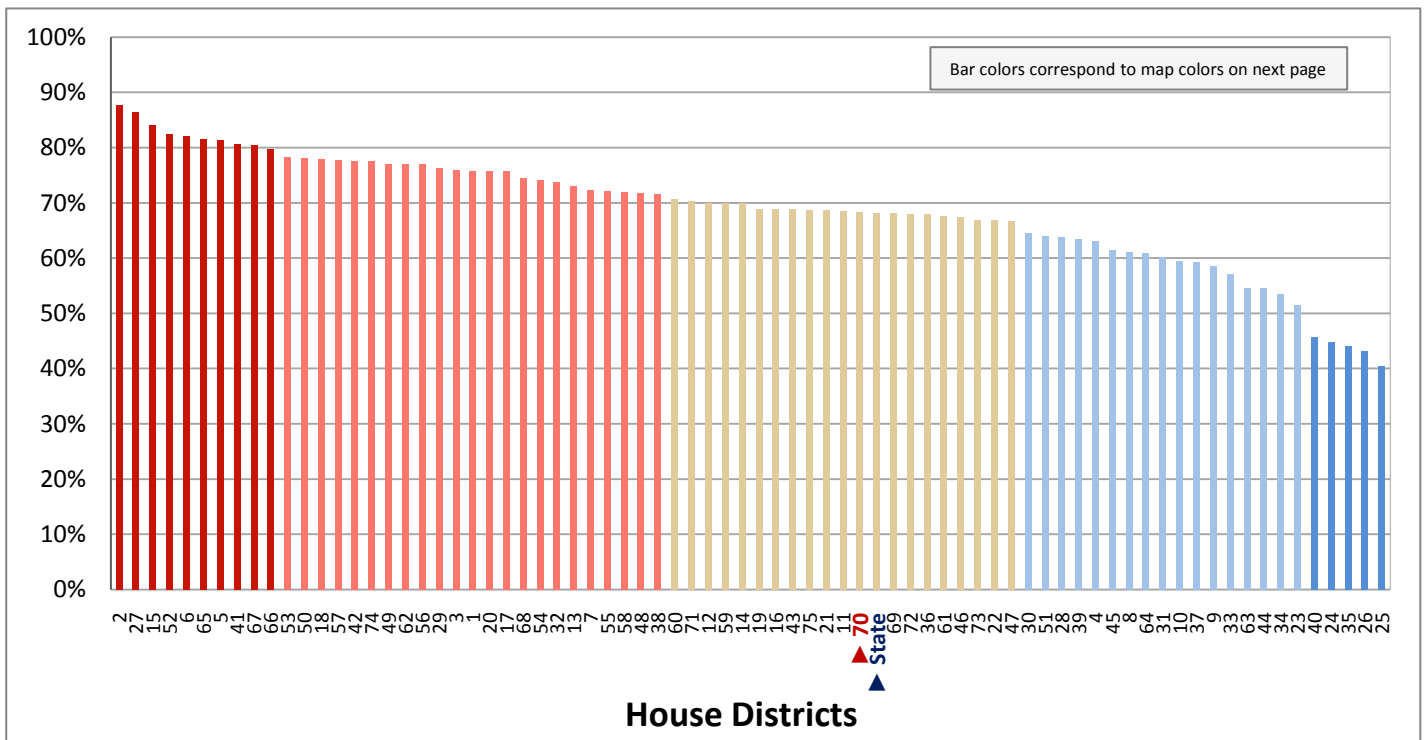


Figure 8.3 - MARITAL STATUS

 (First category in Figure 8.1; same data presented in Figure 8.3; additional data in Table 8 of the appendix)

Percentage of Population Age 25+ Who are Married with Spouse Present

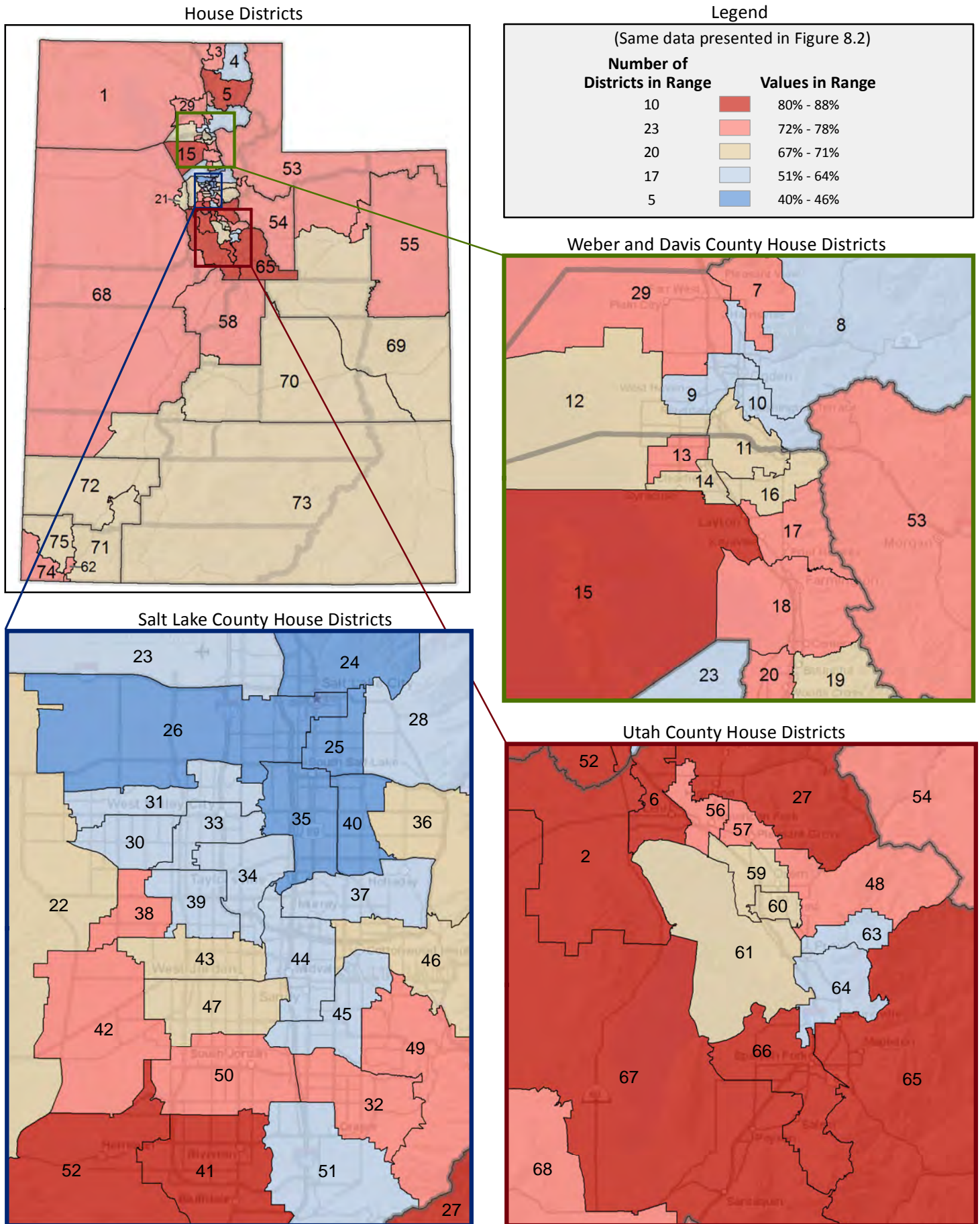


Figure 9.1 - WOMEN GIVING BIRTH

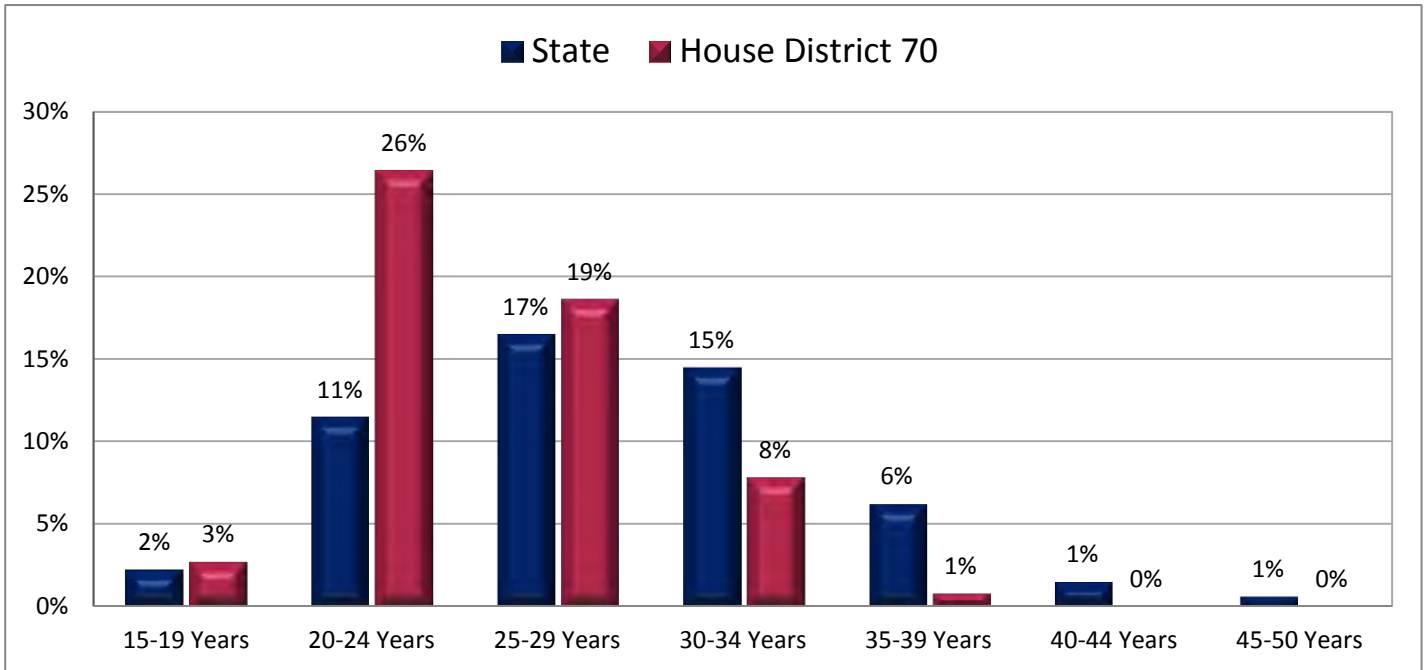


Figure 9.2 - WOMEN GIVING BIRTH

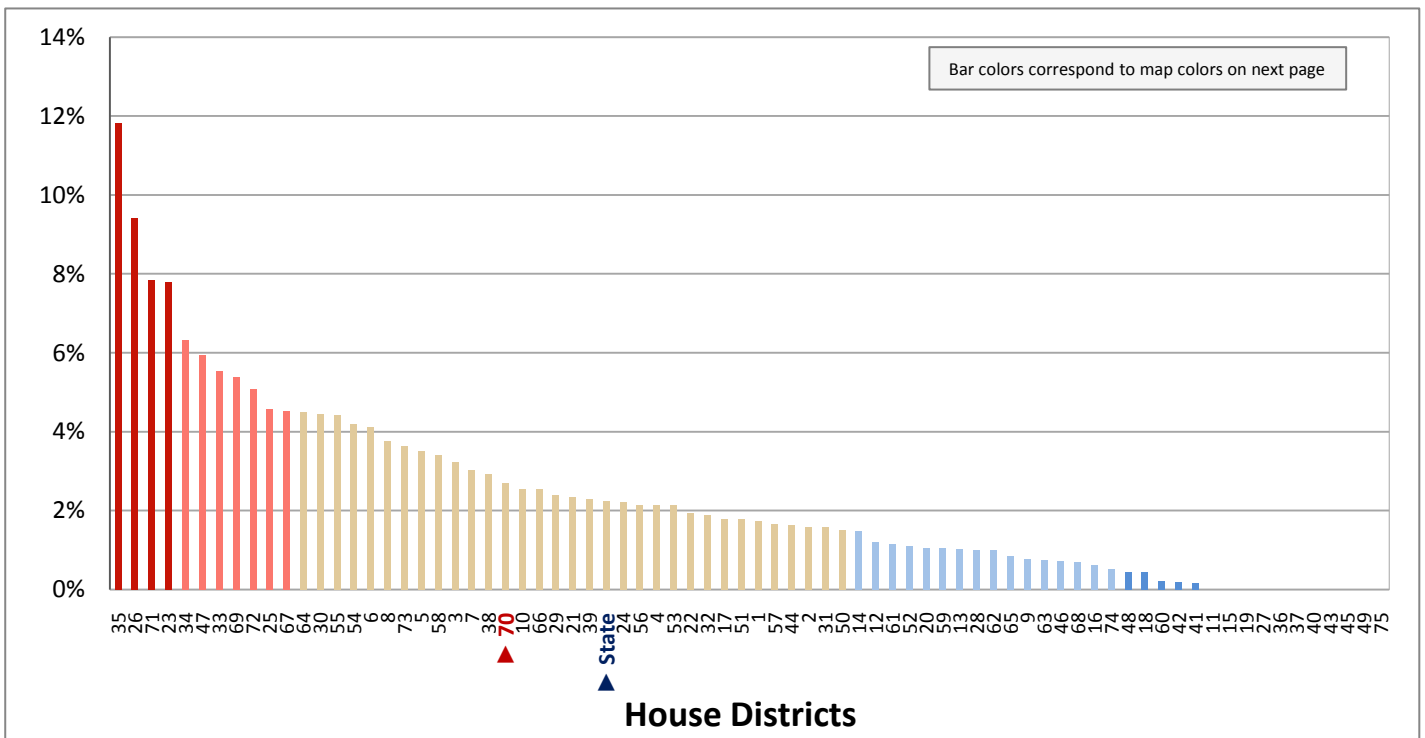


Figure 9.3 - WOMEN GIVING BIRTH
 Percentage of Women Age 15-19 Giving Birth in the Past 12 Months

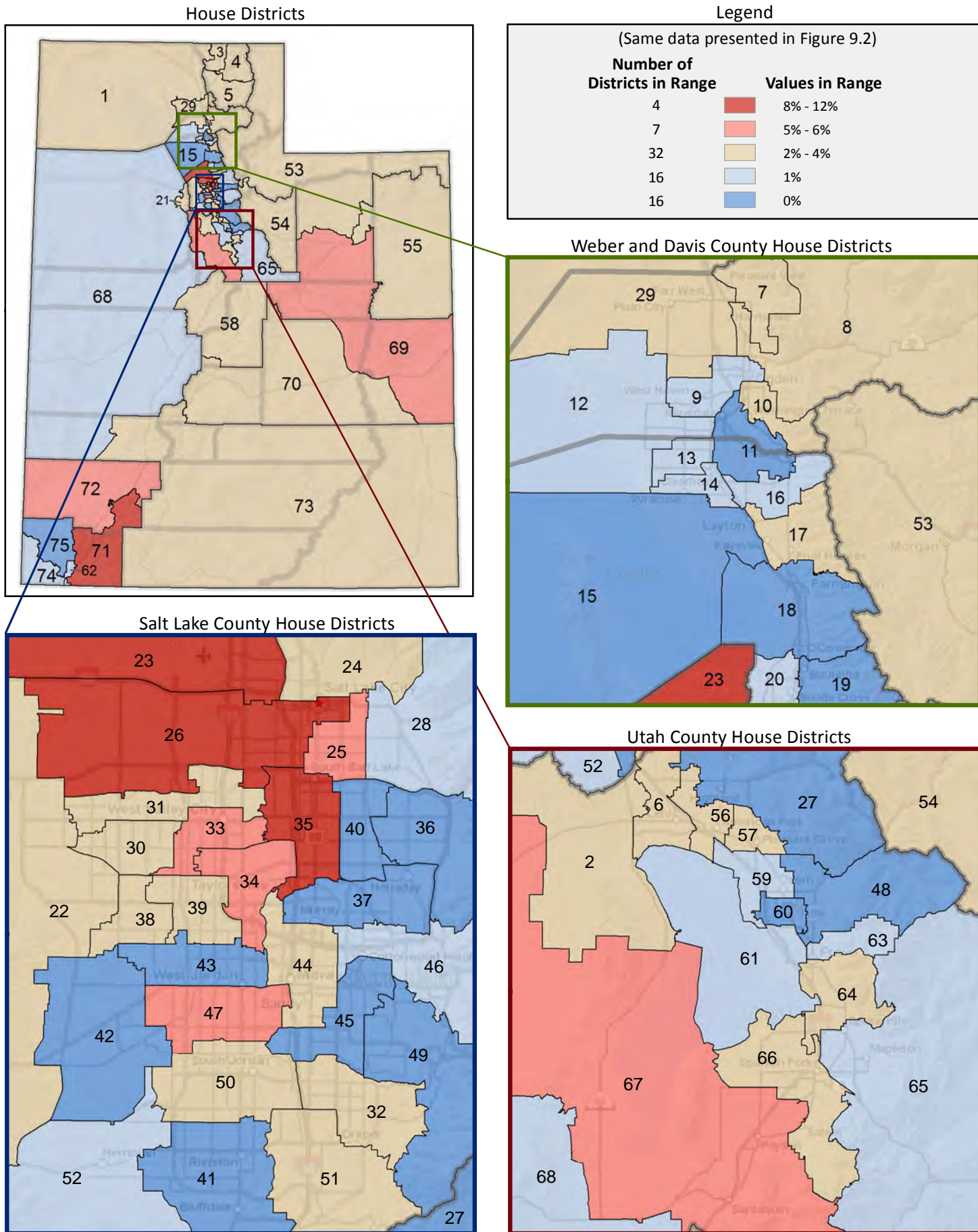


Figure 10.1 - CHILD LIVING ARRANGEMENTS

(Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)

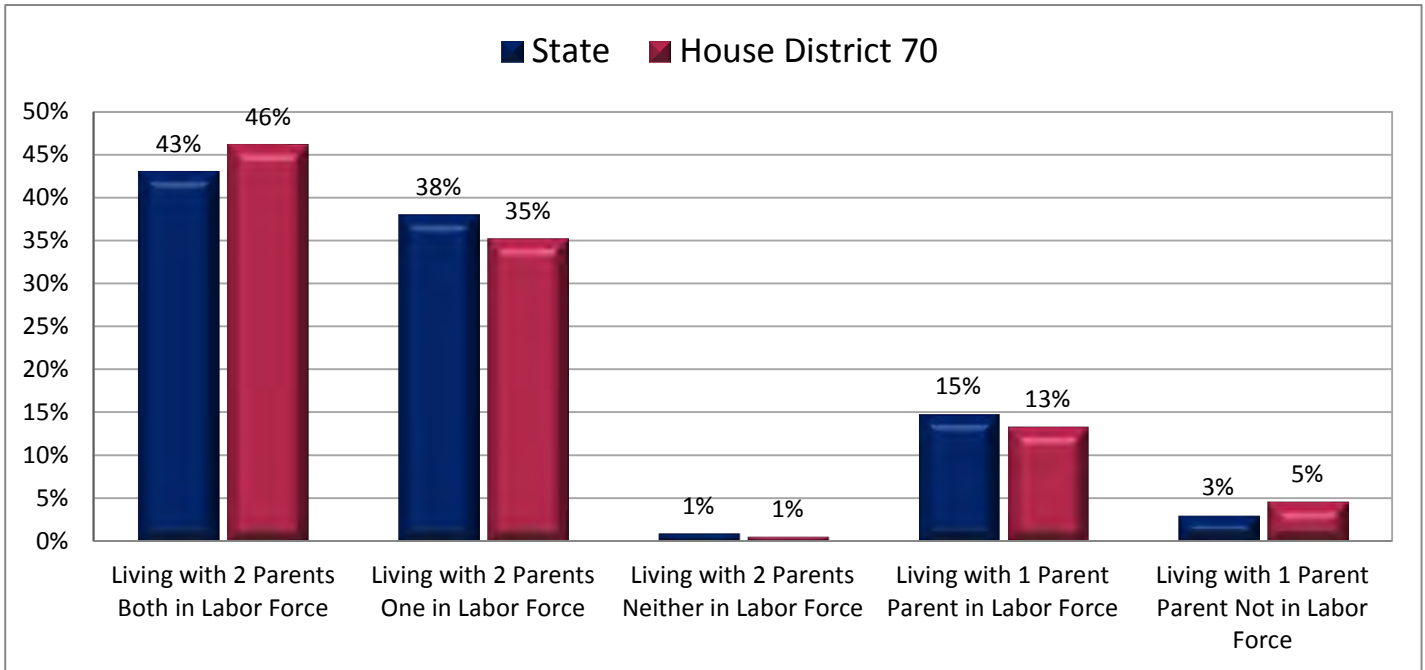


Figure 10.2 - CHILD LIVING ARRANGEMENTS

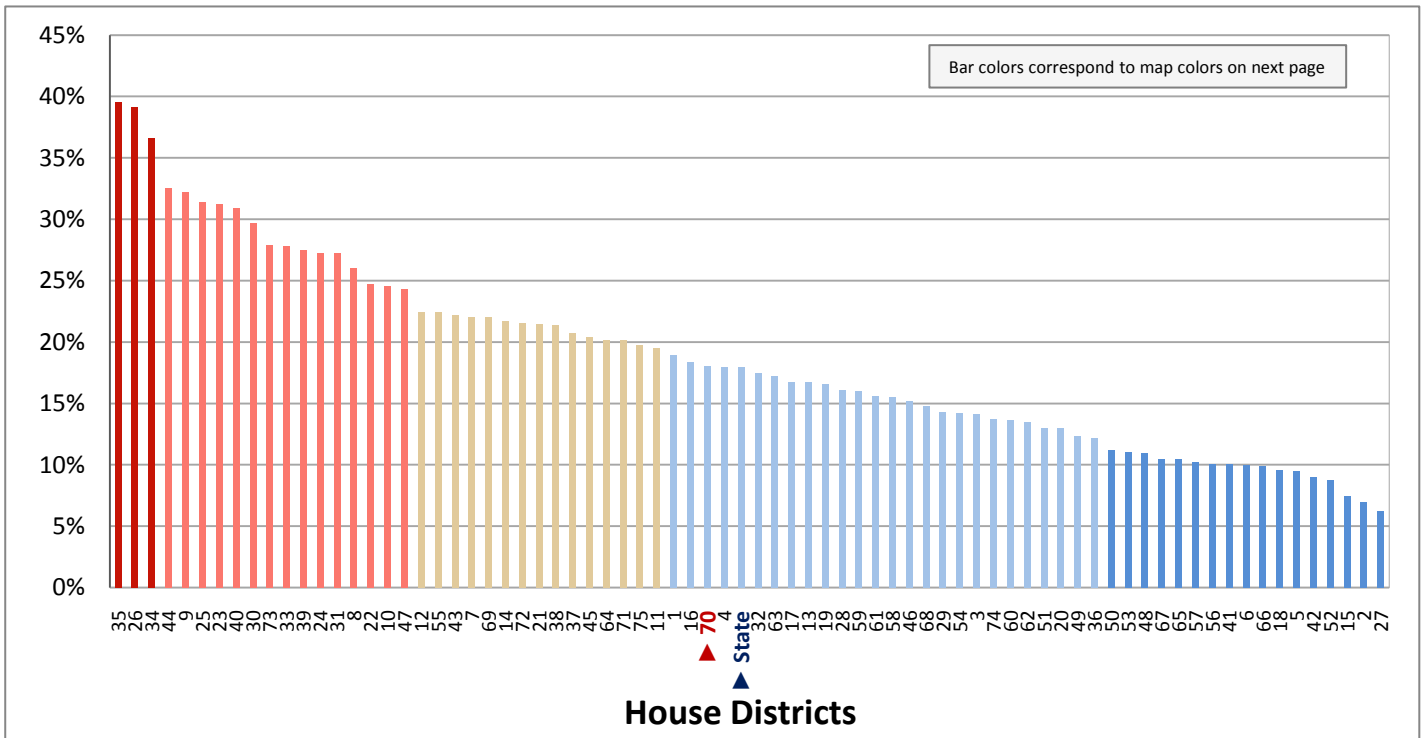


Figure 10.3 - CHILD LIVING ARRANGEMENTS
Percentage of Children Age 0-17 Living with One Parent

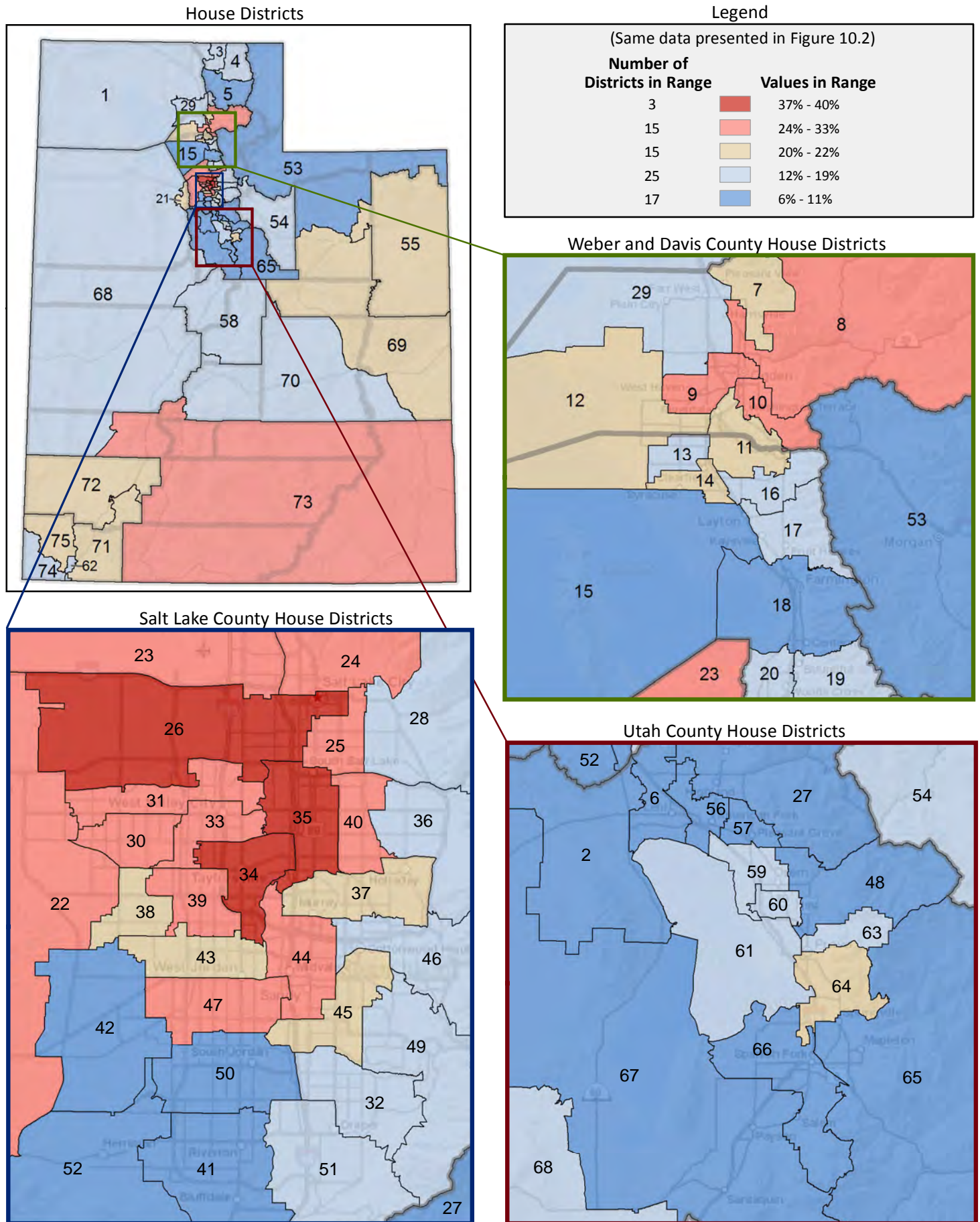


Figure 11.1 - GRANDPARENT LIVING WITH GRANDCHILD

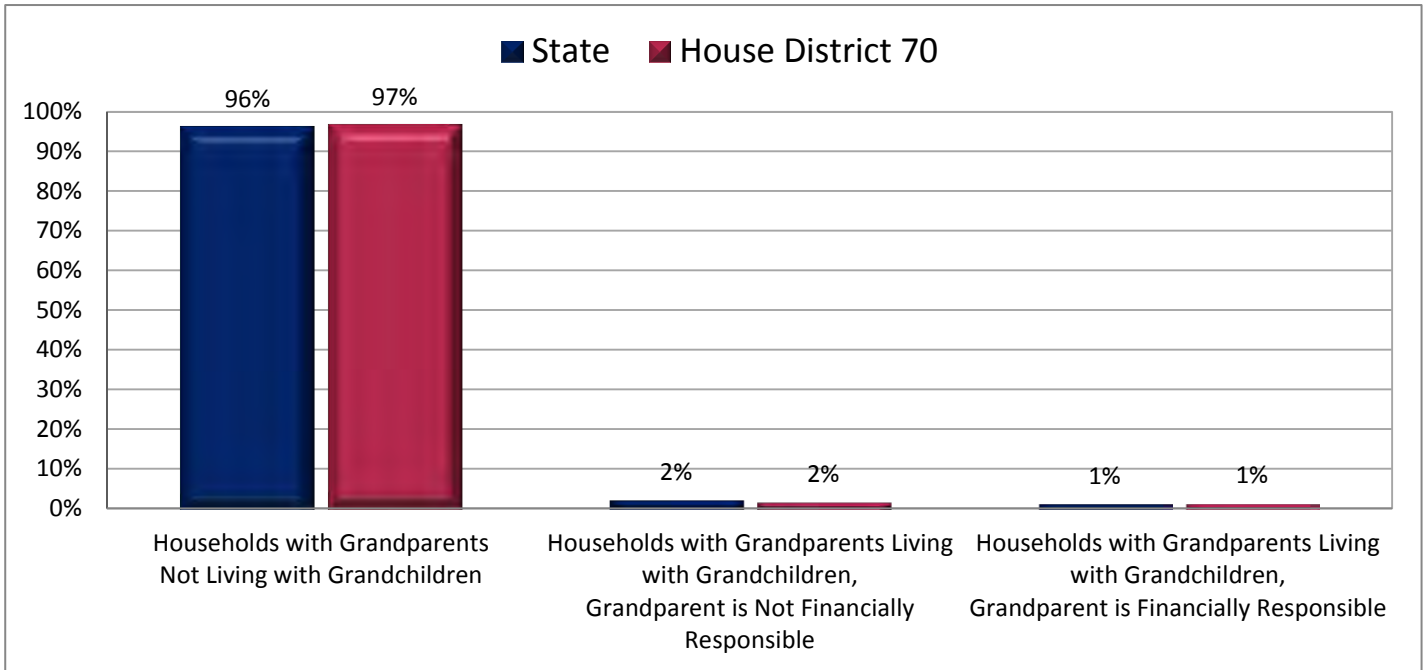
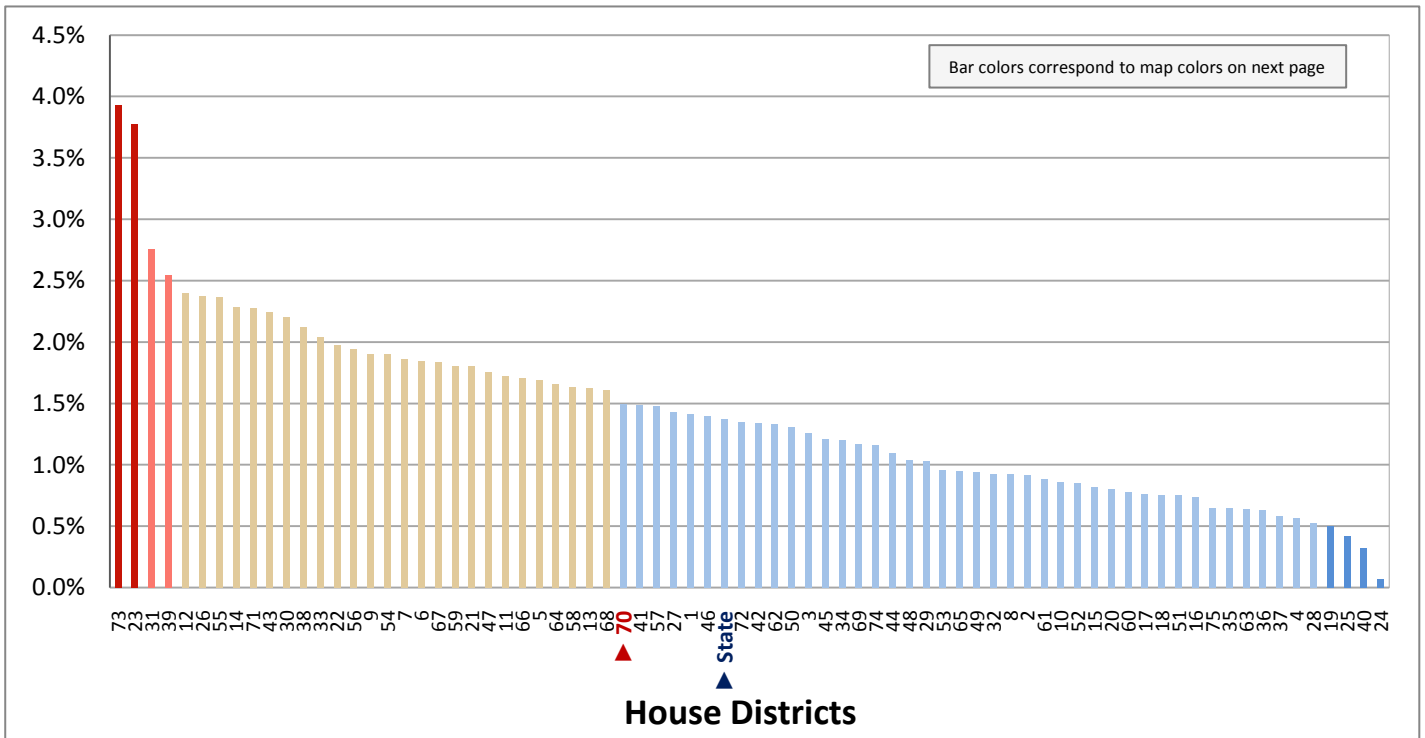


Figure 11.2 - GRANDPARENT LIVING WITH GRANDCHILD

Percentage of Households with a Grandparent Living with Grandchildren Age 0-17 and Grandparent is Financially Responsible

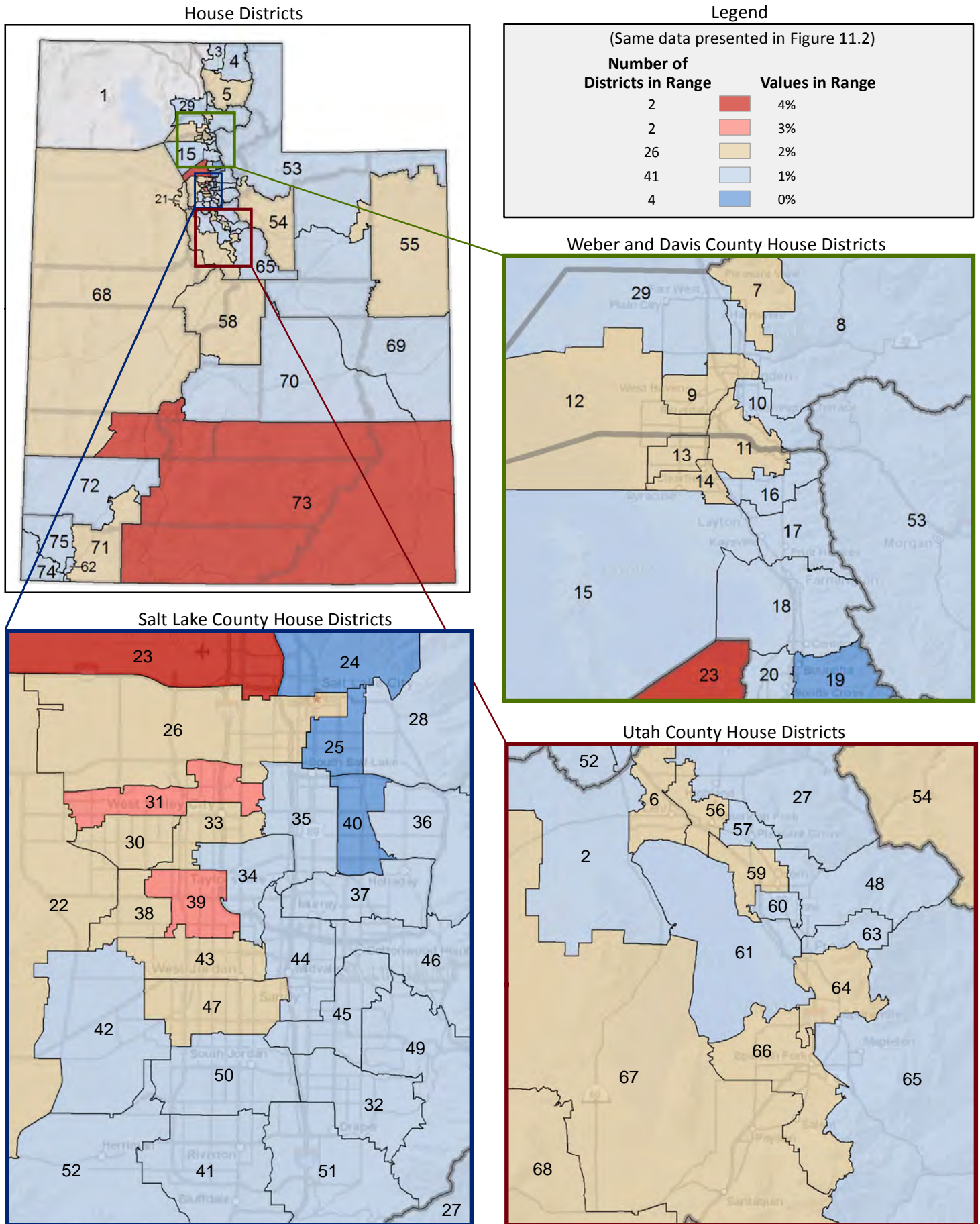


Figure 12.1 - EDUCATION - HIGHEST LEVEL OF ATTAINMENT

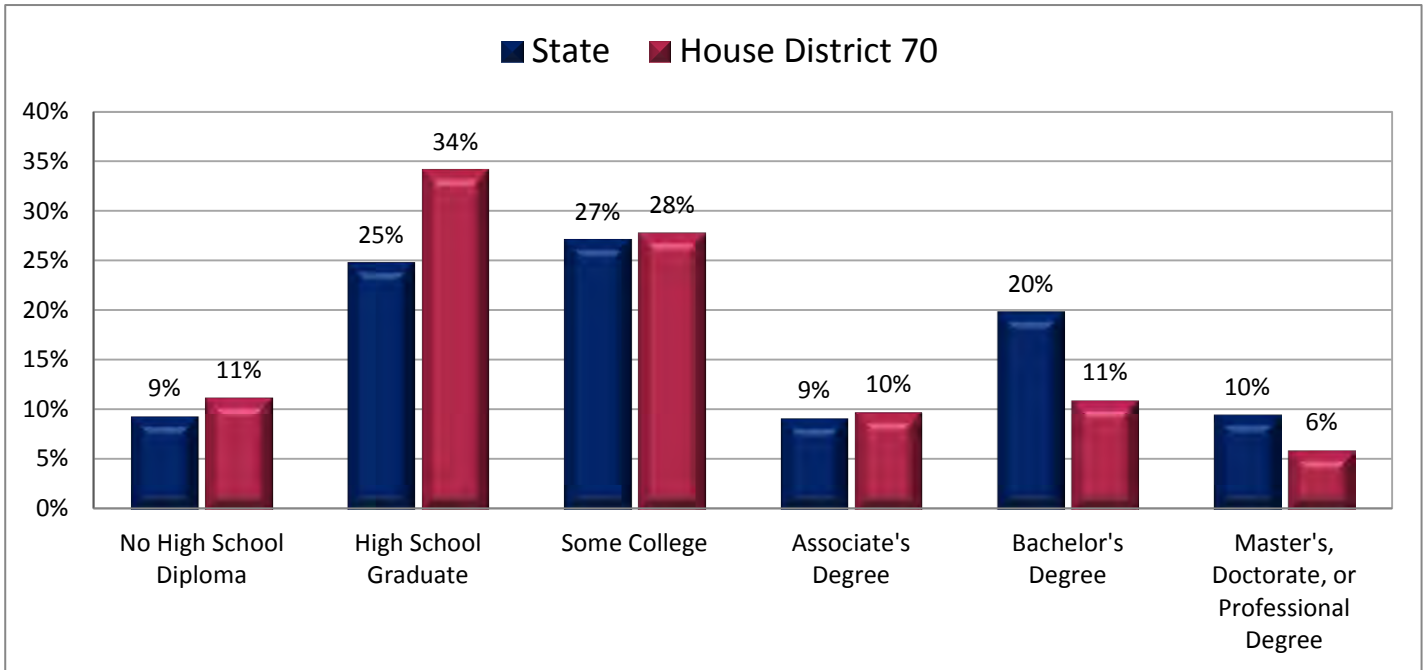


Figure 12.2 - EDUCATION - HIGHEST LEVEL OF ATTAINMENT

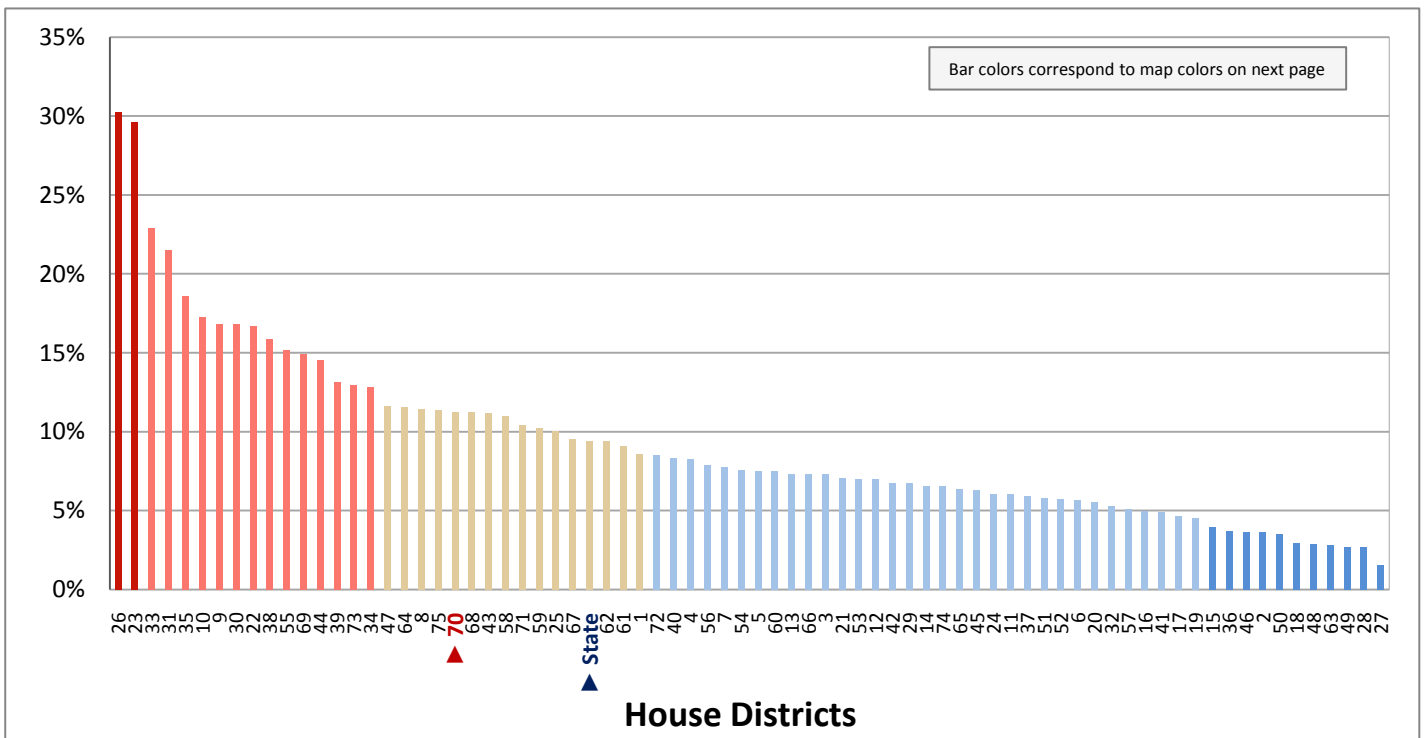


Figure 12.3 - EDUCATION - HIGHEST LEVEL OF ATTAINMENT
Percentage of Population Age 25+ without a High School Diploma

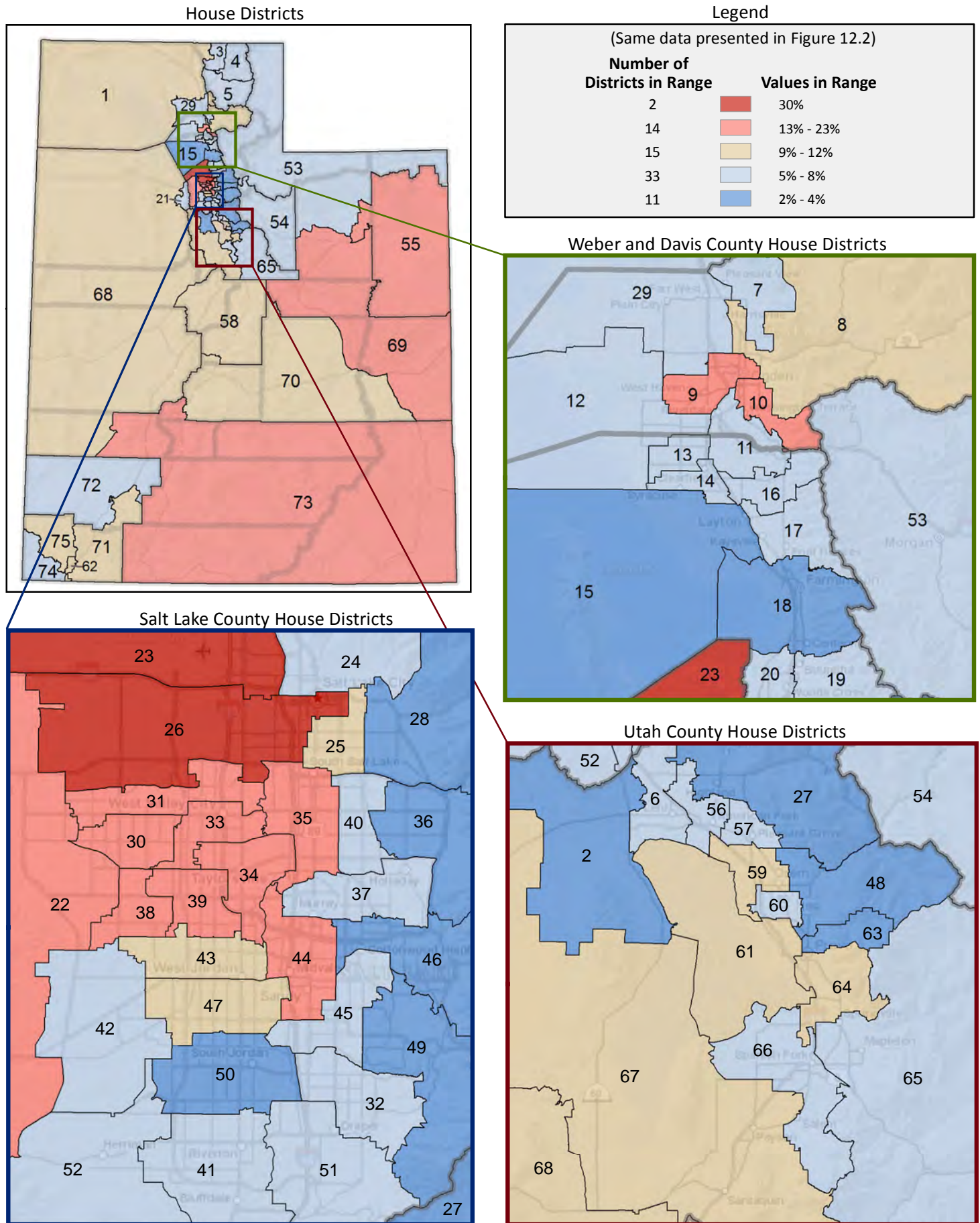


Figure 13.1 - BACHELOR'S DEGREE ATTAINMENT

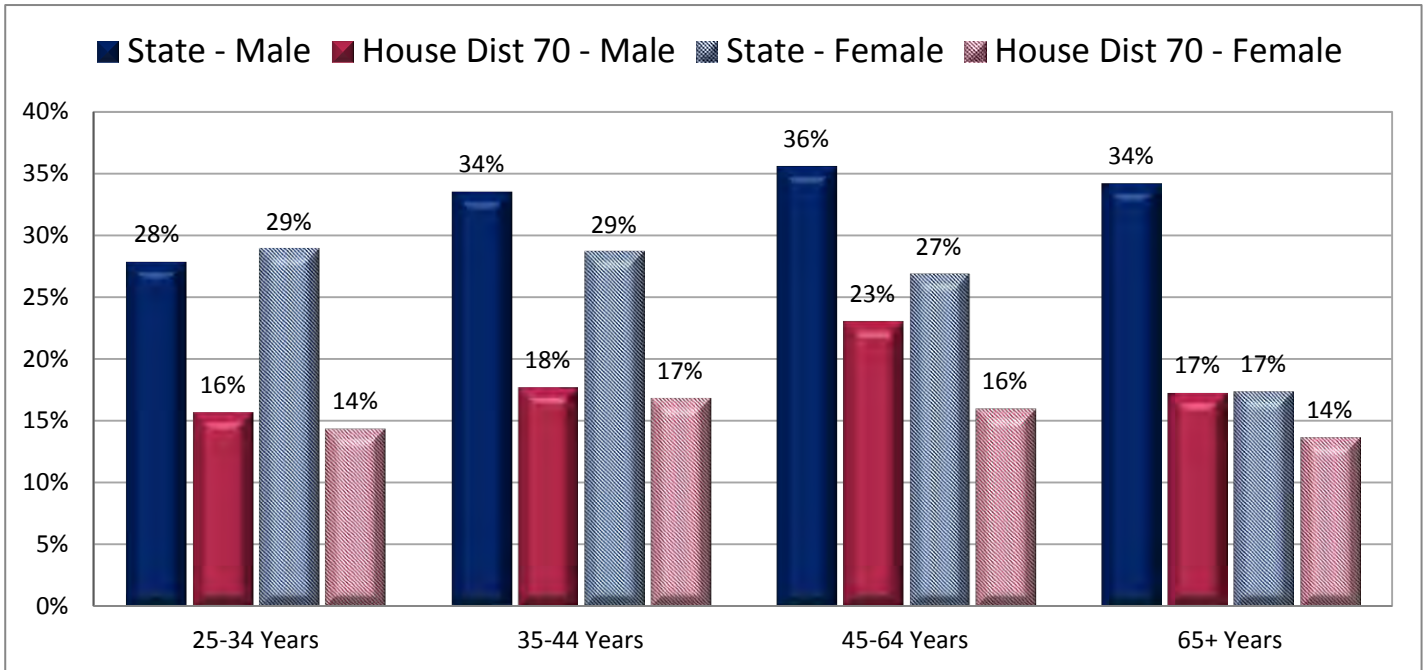


Figure 13.2 - BACHELOR'S DEGREE ATTAINMENT

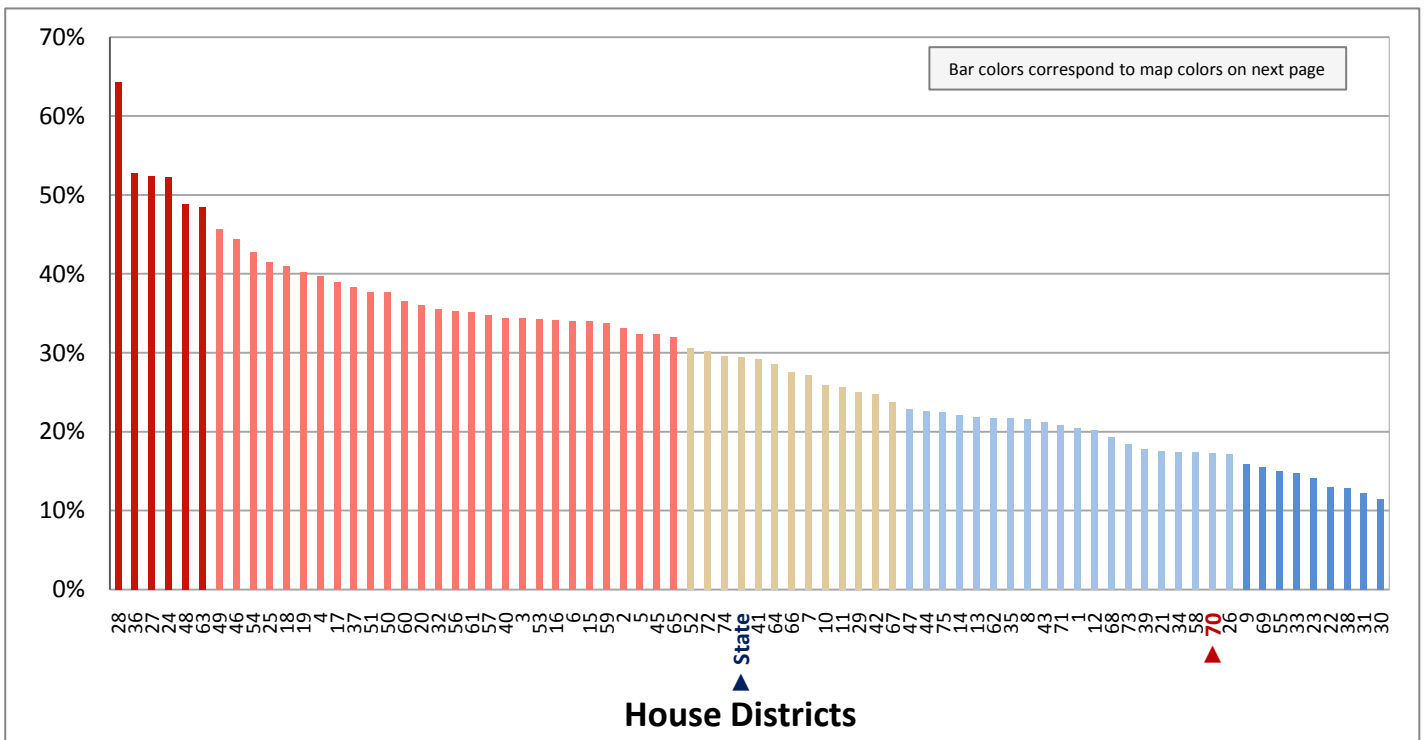


Figure 13.3 - BACHELOR'S DEGREE ATTAINMENT
Percentage of Population Age 25+ with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher

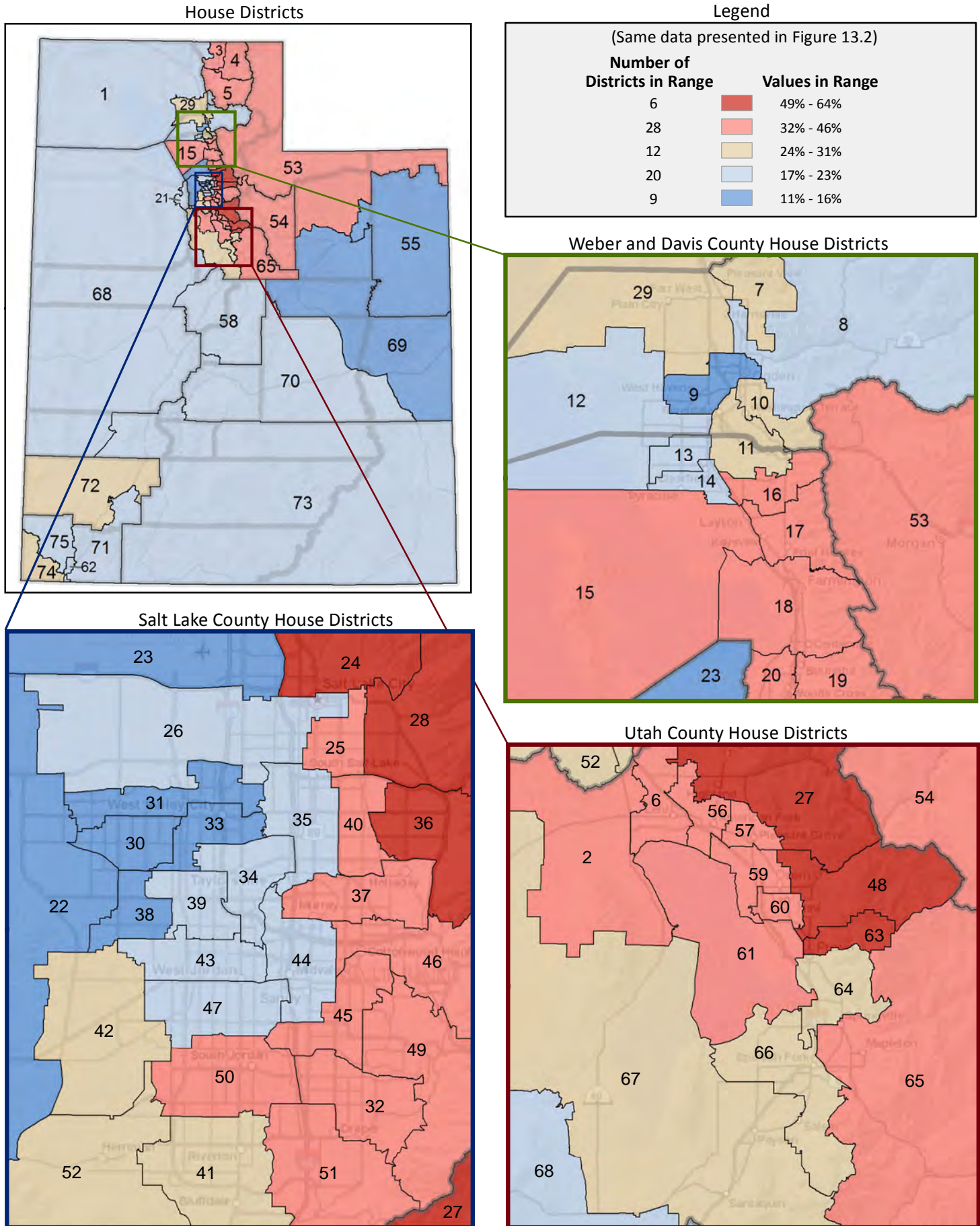


Figure 14.1 - VETERANS

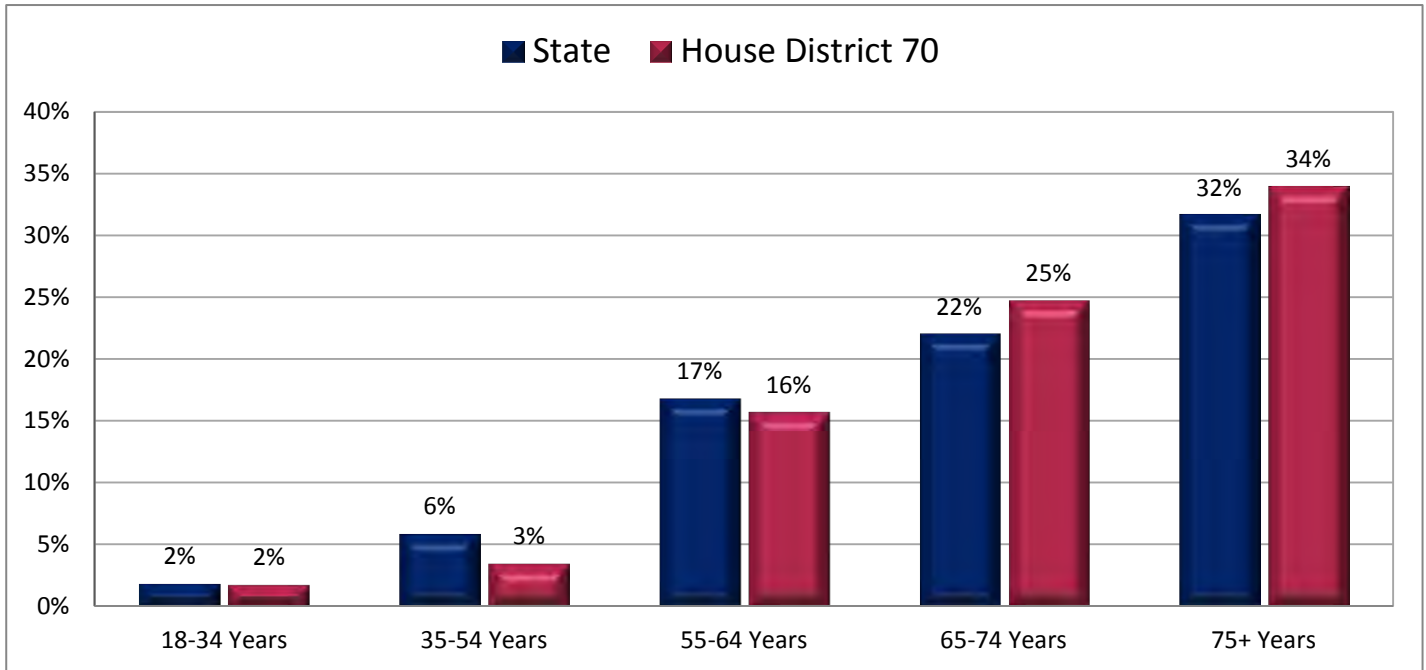
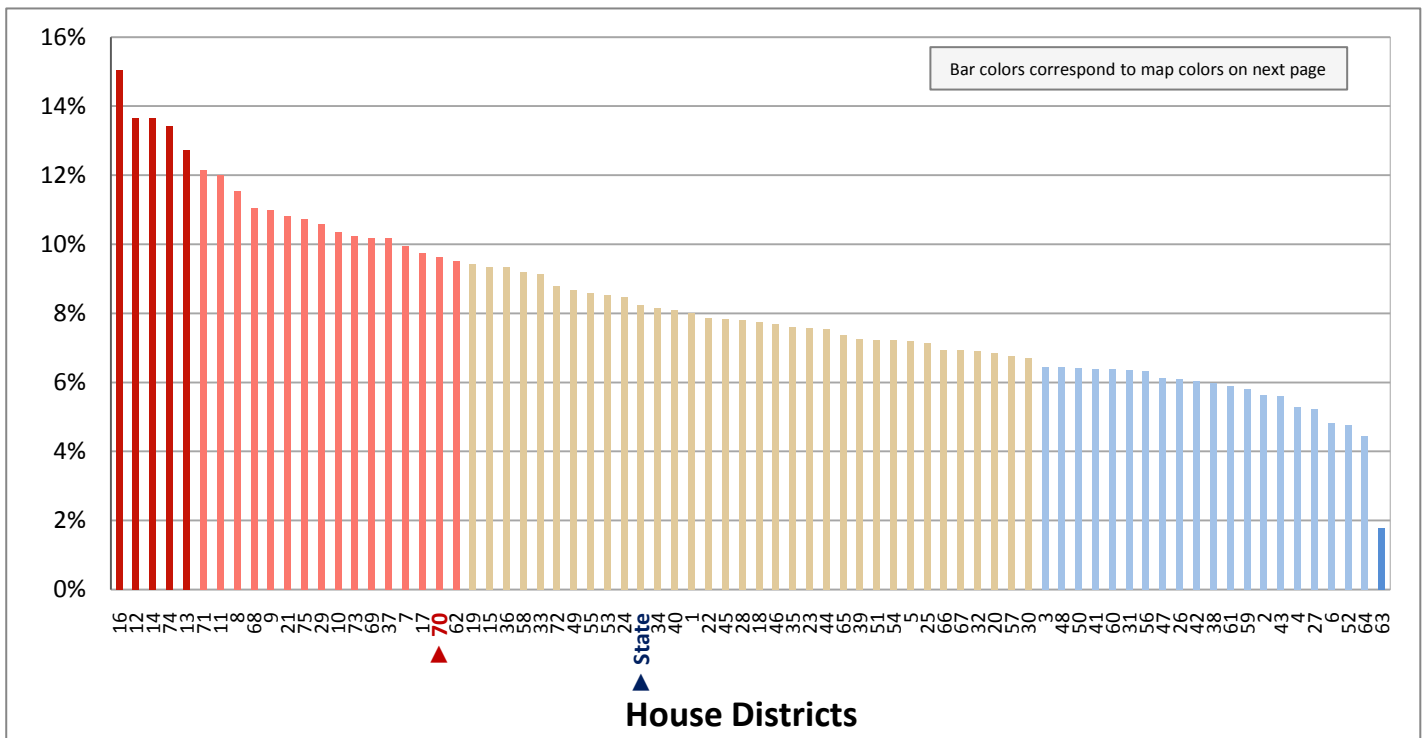


Figure 14.2 - VETERANS

Percentage of Civilians Age 18+ Who are Veterans

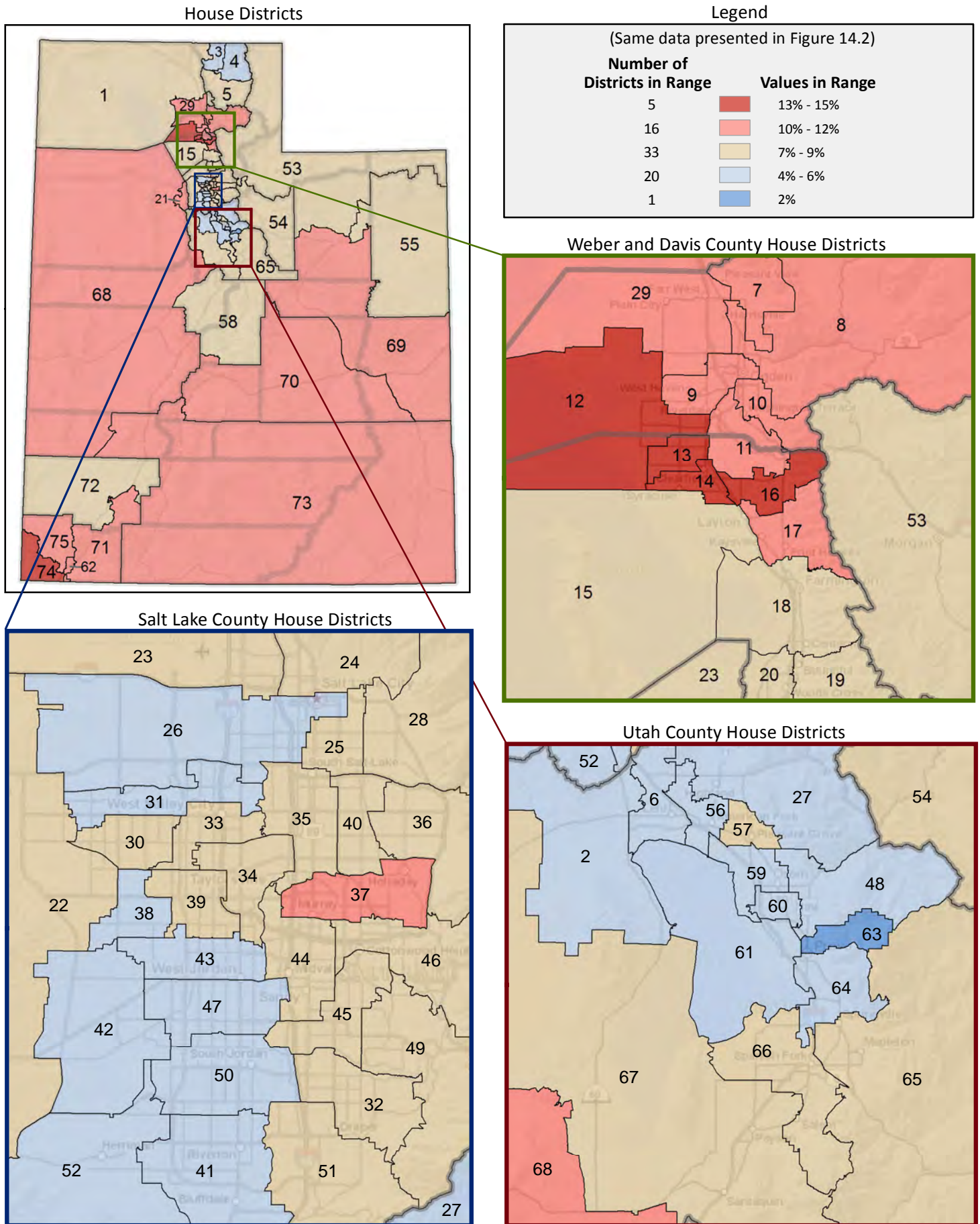


Figure 15.1 - EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY

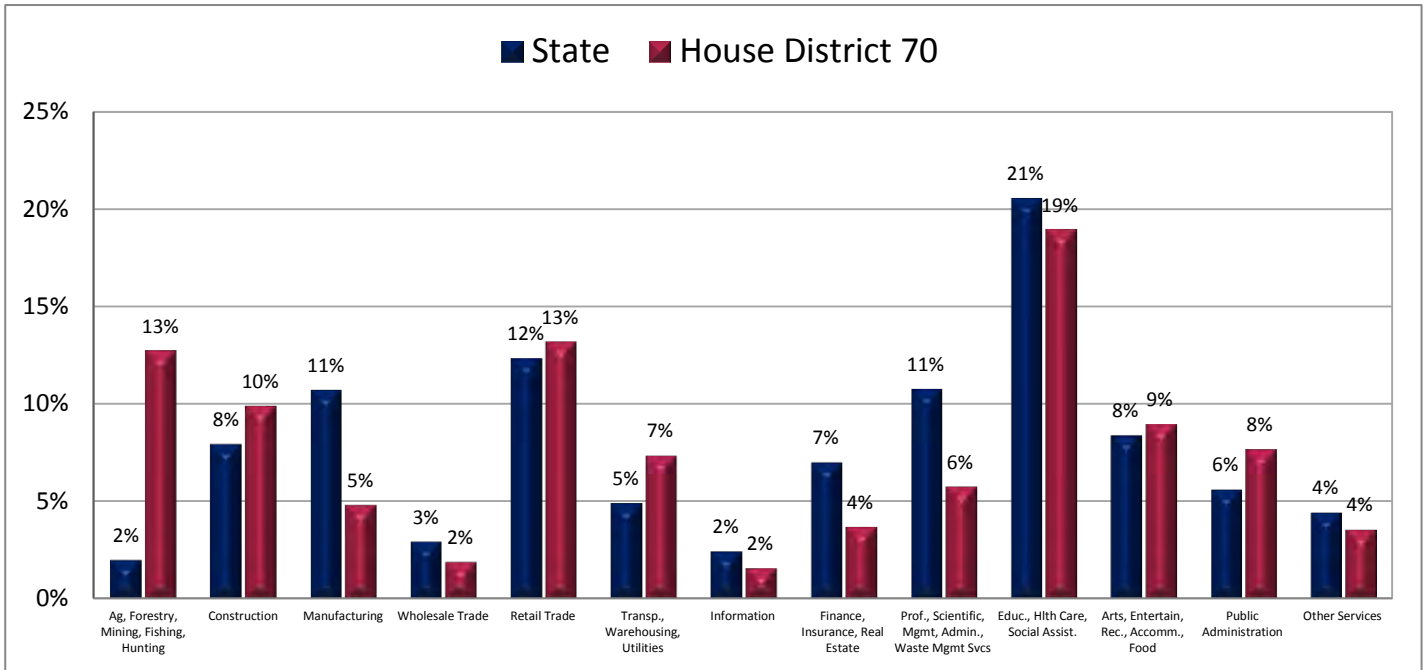
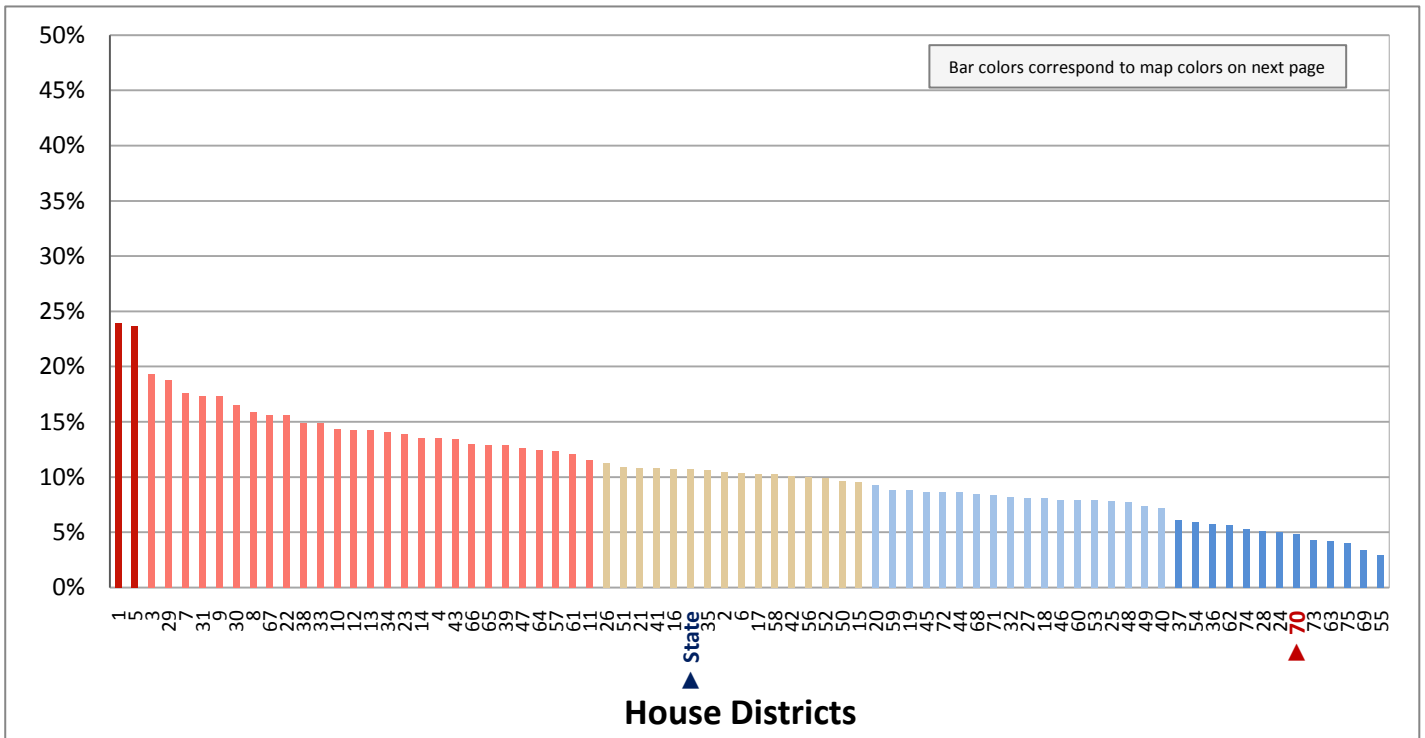


Figure 15.2 - EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY

 Who Work in Manufacturing**

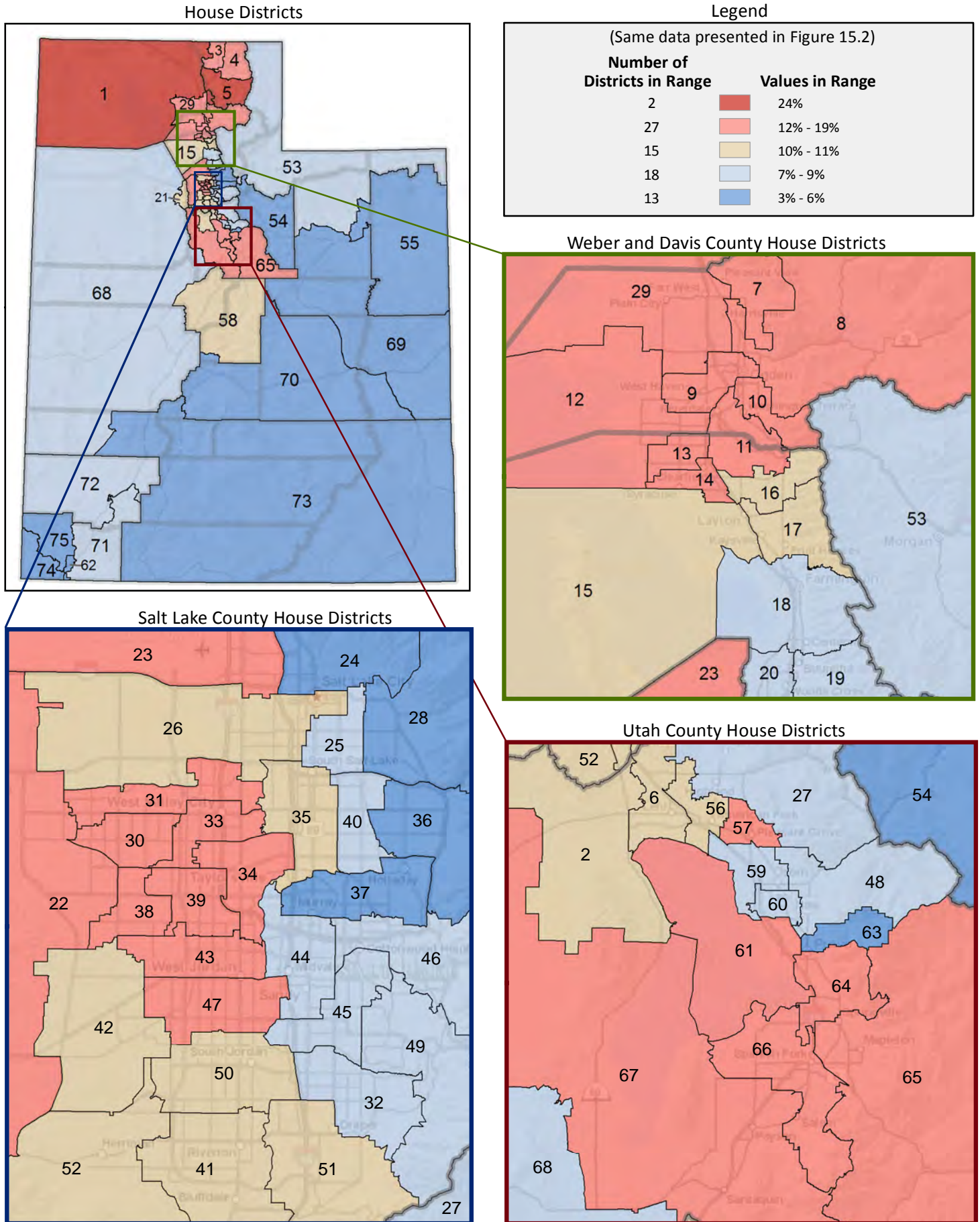


Figure 15.4 - EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY

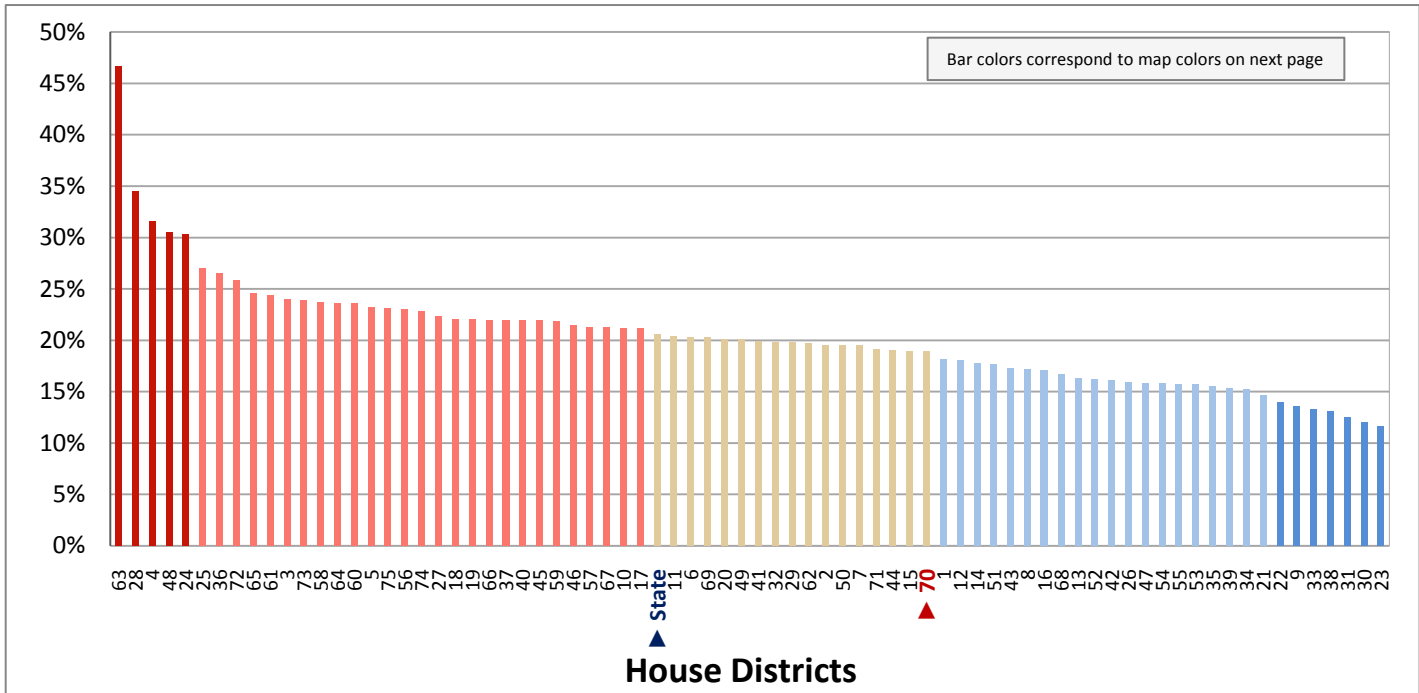
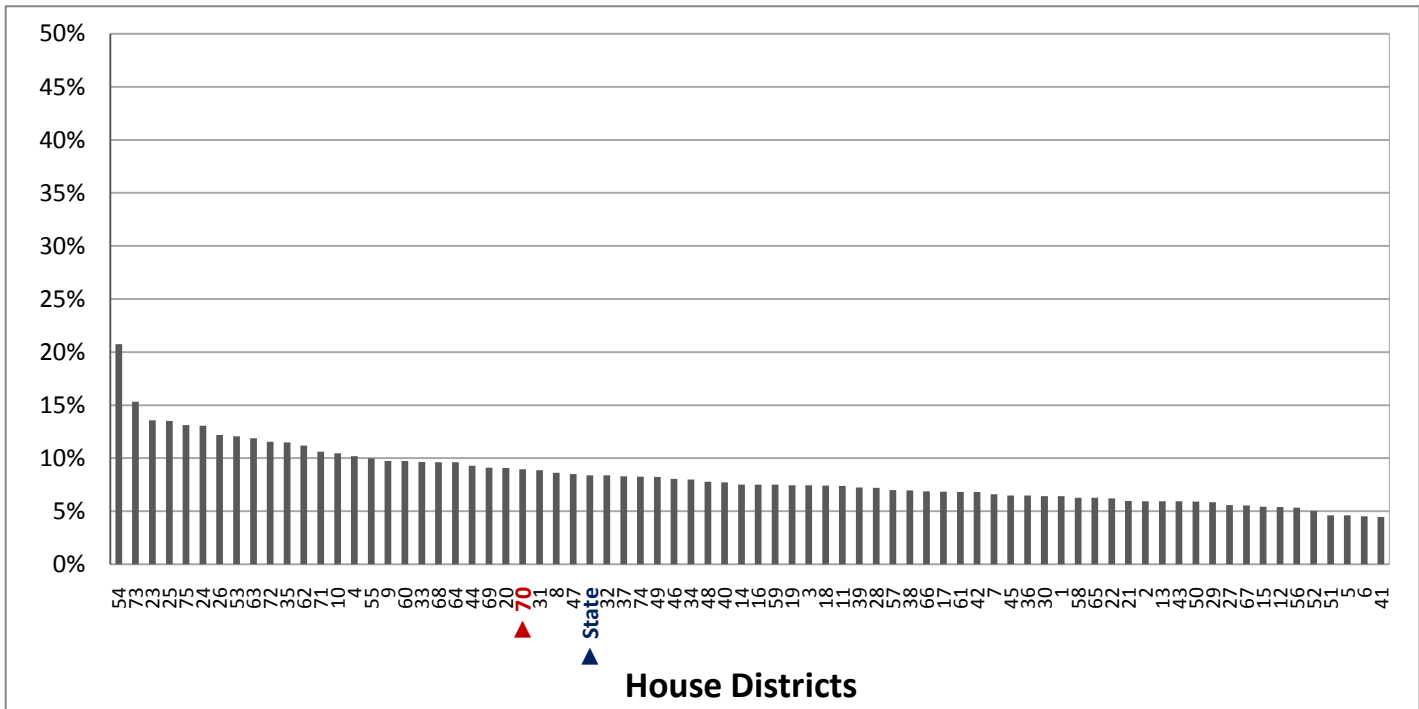


Figure 15.5 - EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY

Percentage of Civilian Employed Workers Age 16+ Who Work in Education, and Health and Social Assistance

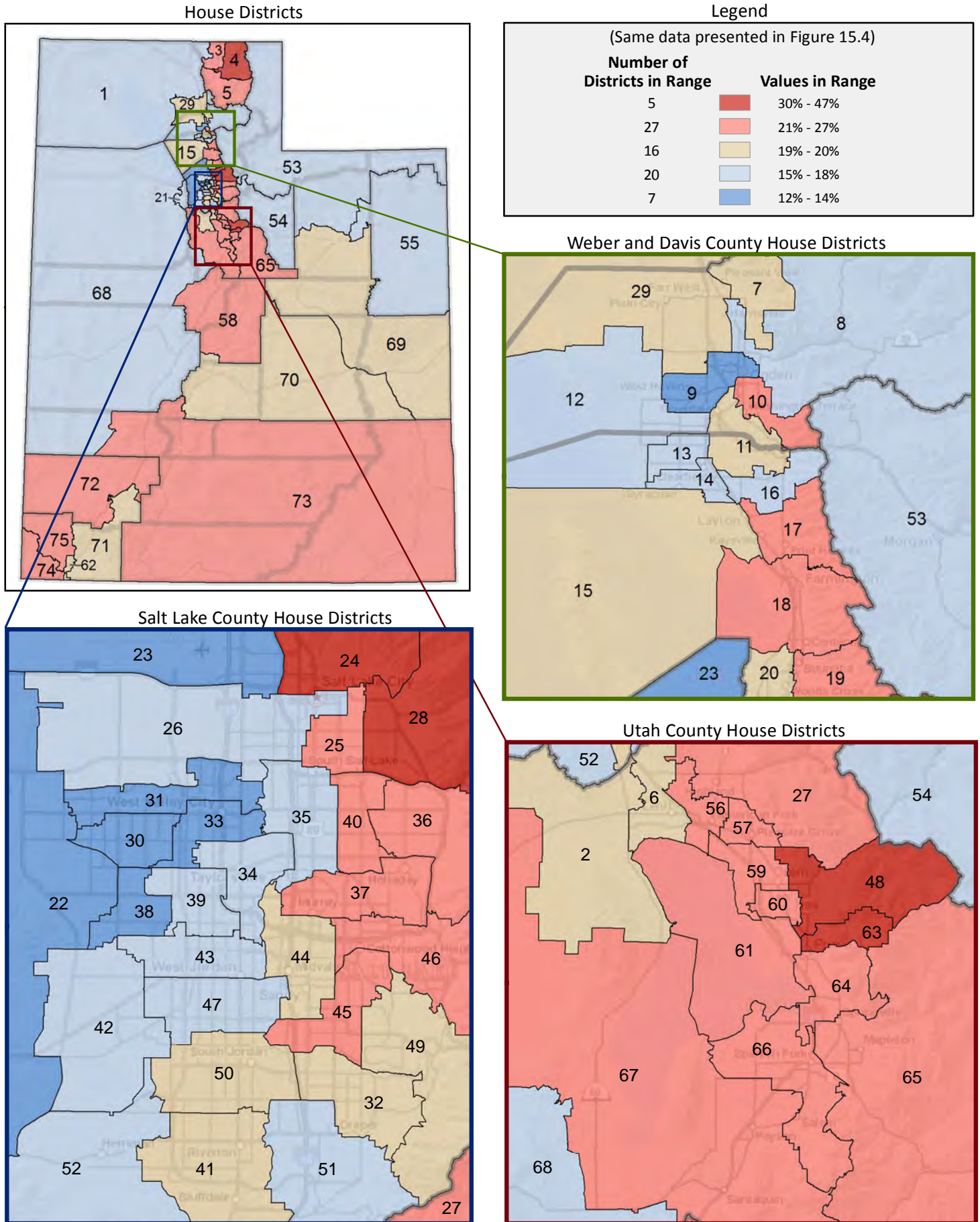


Figure 16.1 - MEANS OF TRANSPORTATION TO WORK

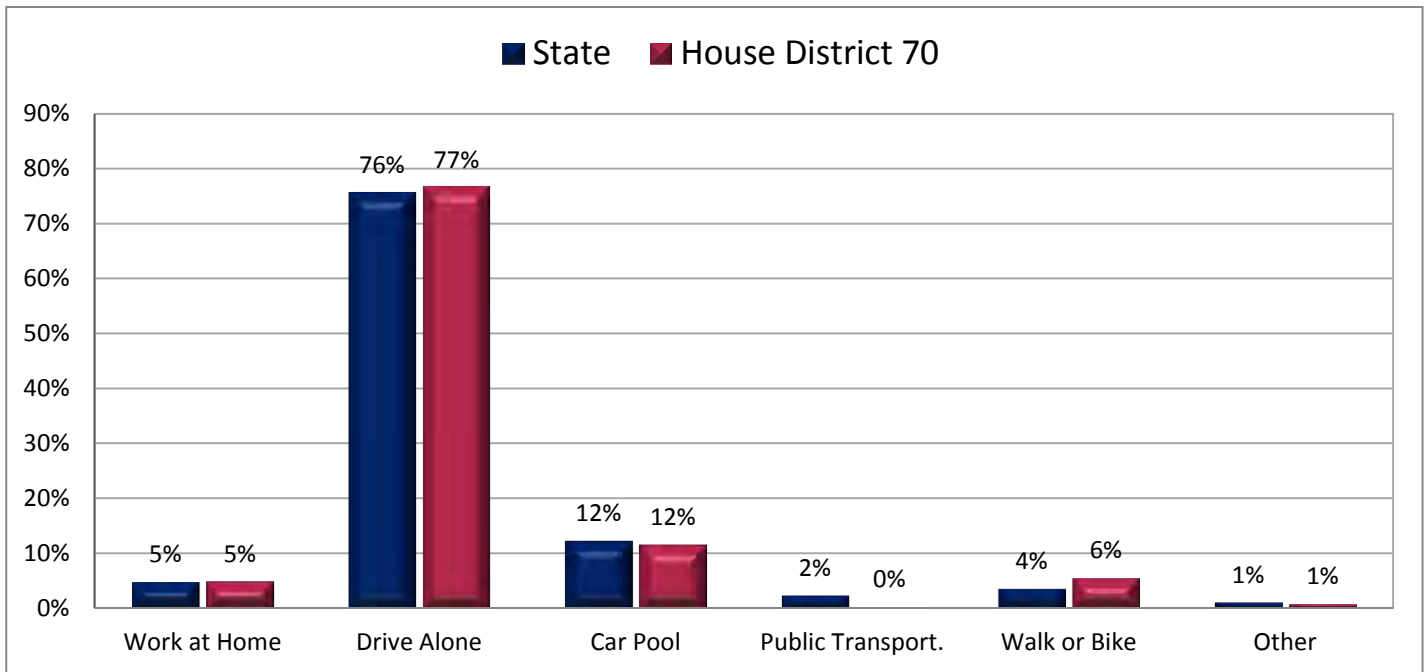


Figure 16.2 - MEANS OF TRANSPORTATION TO WORK

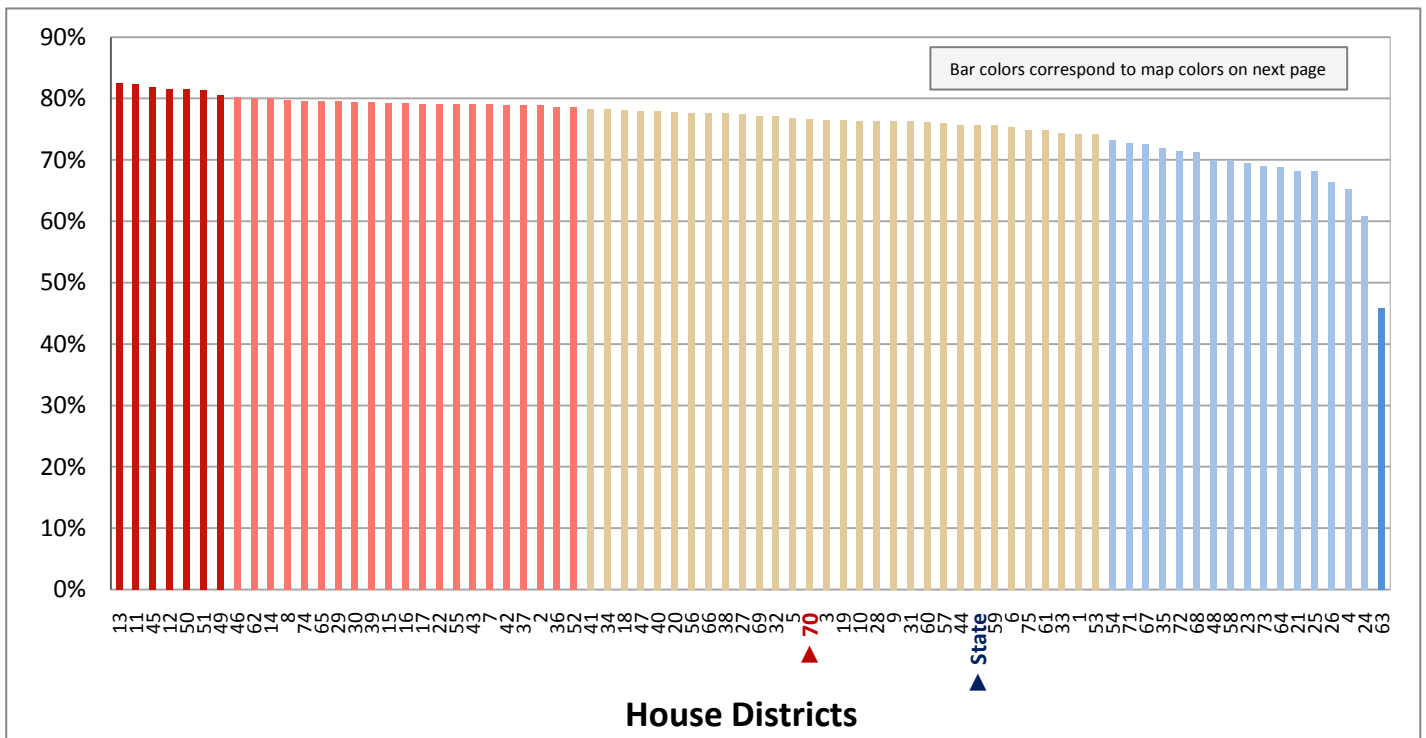


Figure 16.3 - MEANS OF TRANSPORTATION TO WORK

 (Second category in Figure 16.1; same data presented in Figure 16.3; additional data in Table 16 of the appendix)

Percentage of Workers Age 16+ Who Drive Alone to Work

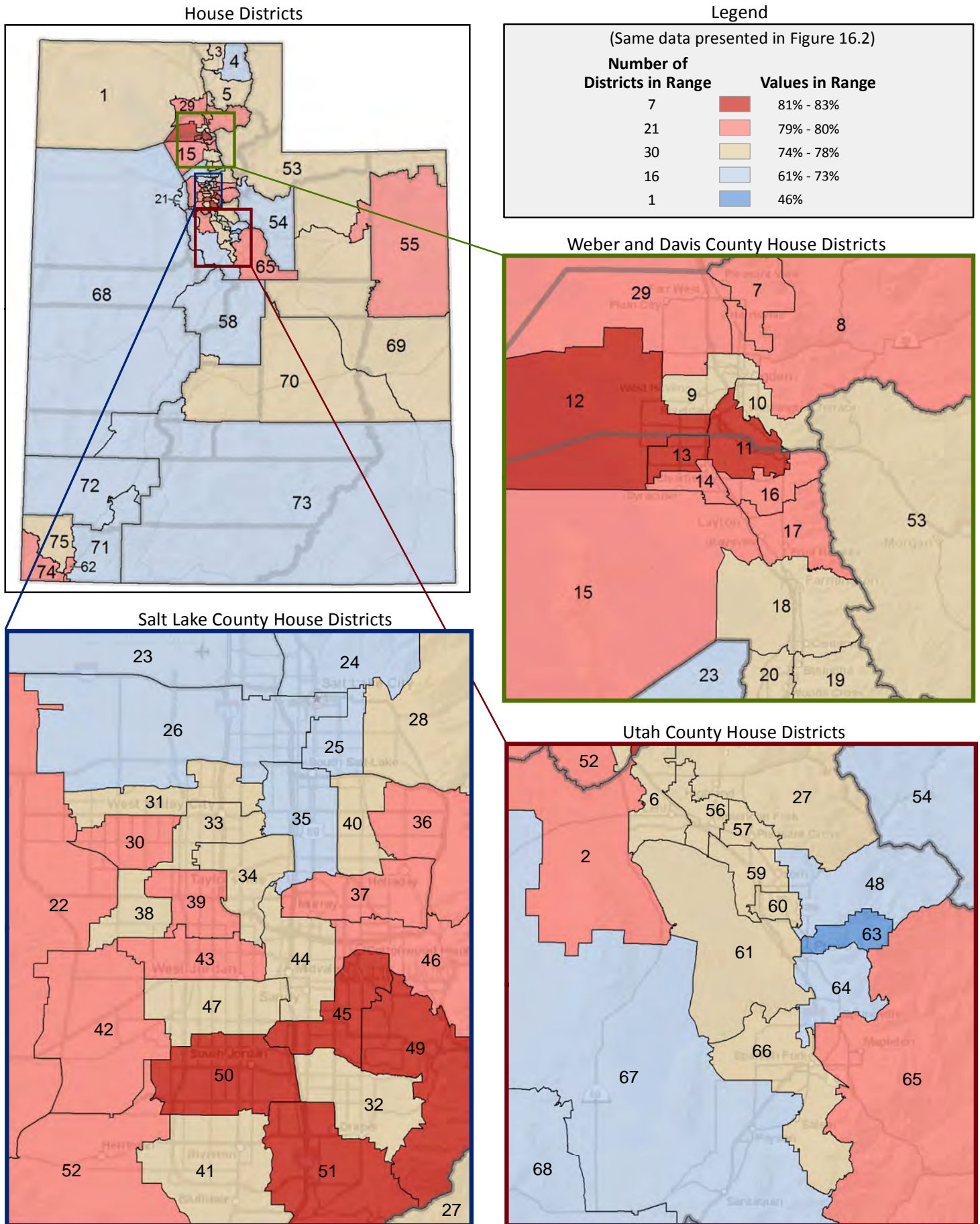


Figure 17.1 - TRAVEL TIME TO WORK

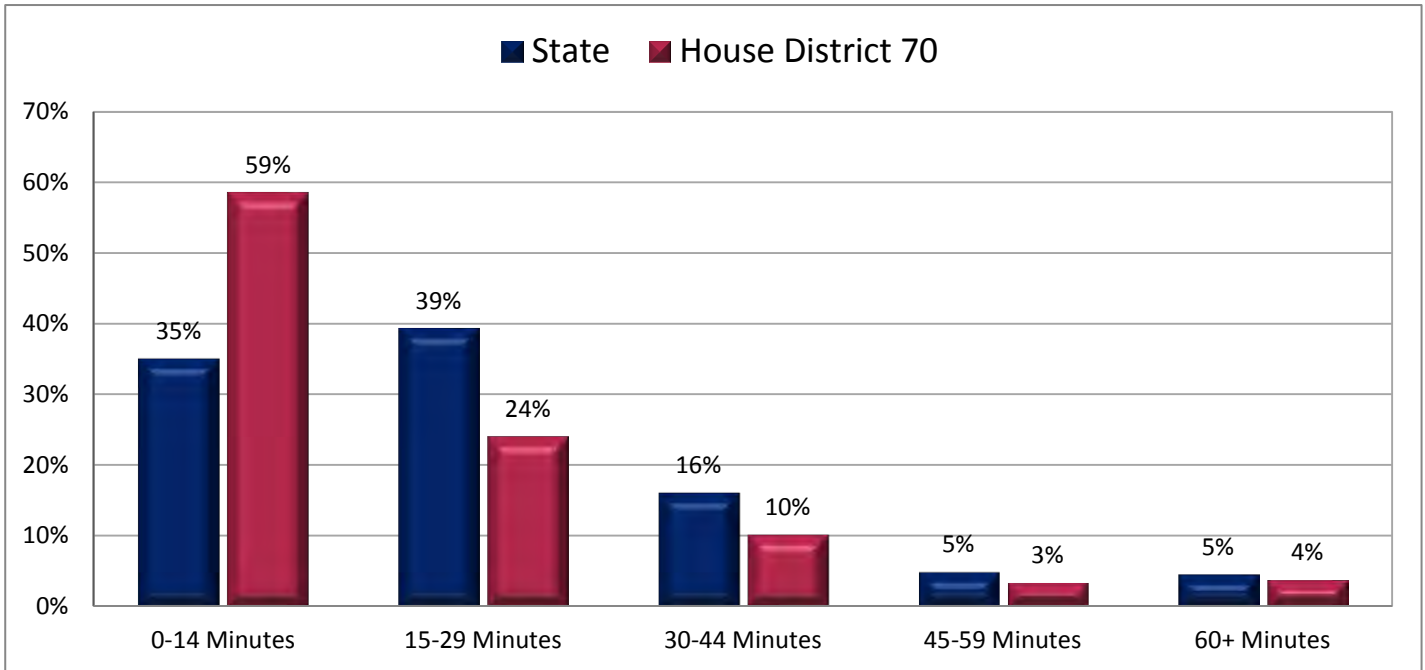


Figure 17.2 - TRAVEL TIME TO WORK

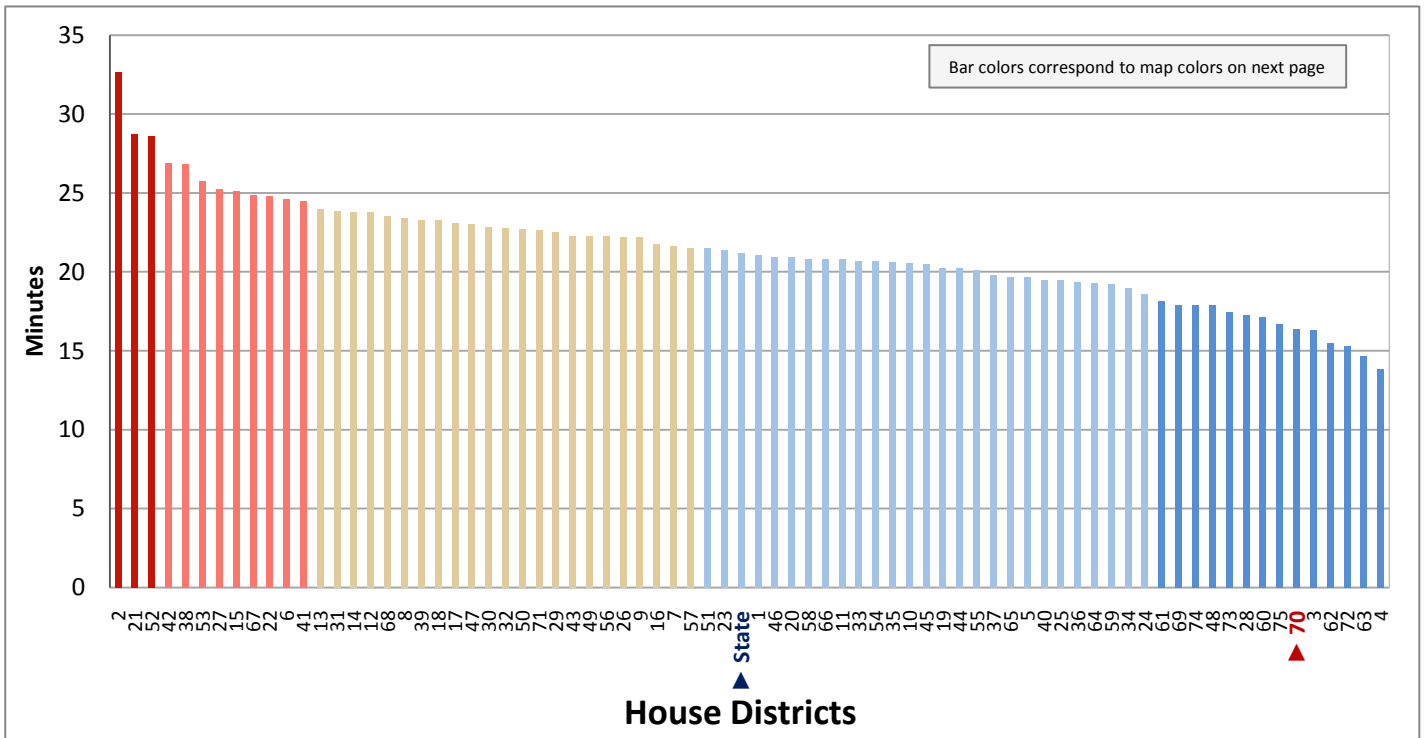


Figure 17.3 - TRAVEL TIME TO WORK
Average Travel Time to Work of Workers Age 16+ Who Do Not Work at Home

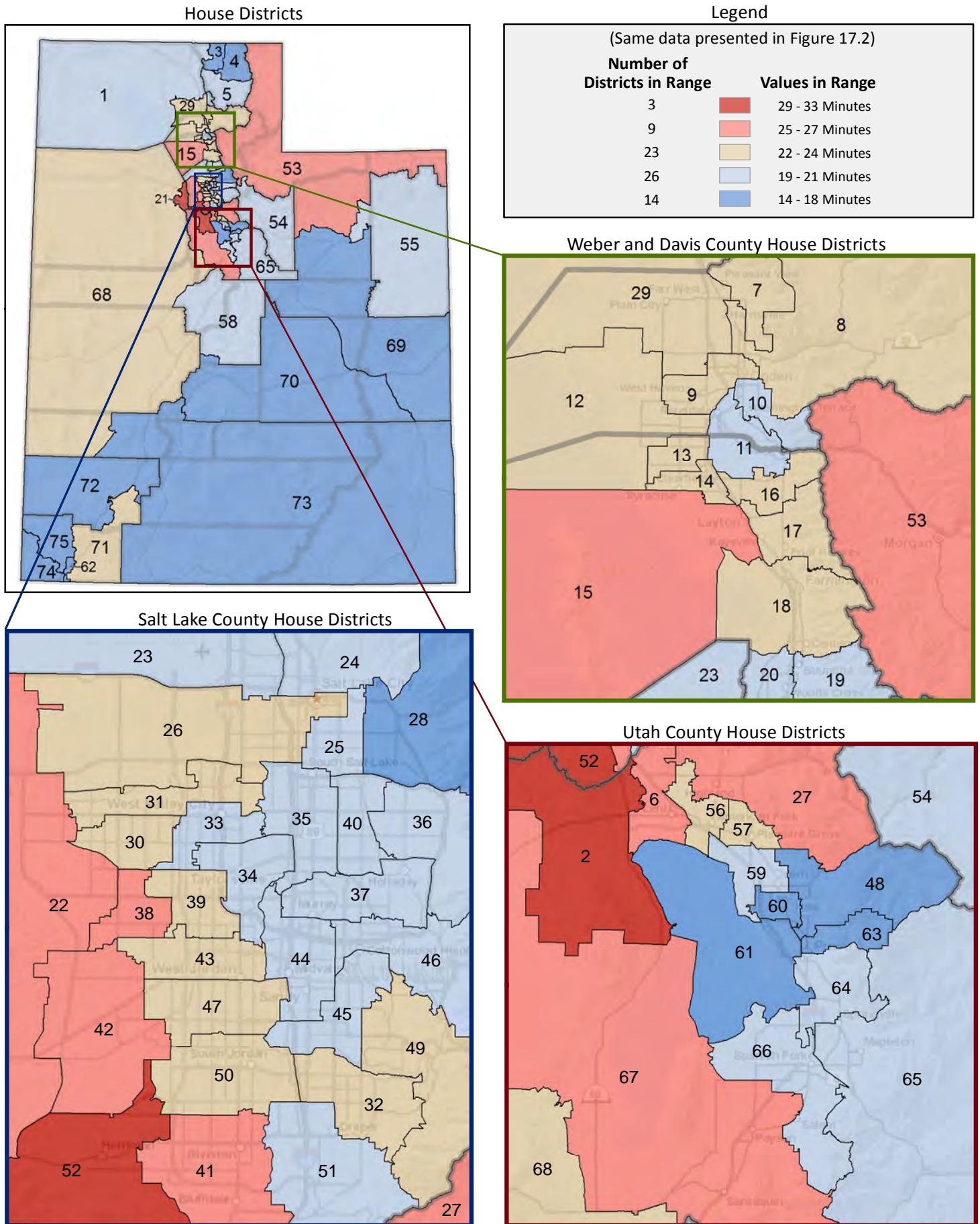


Figure 18.1 - SOURCES OF HOUSEHOLD INCOME

 (Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)

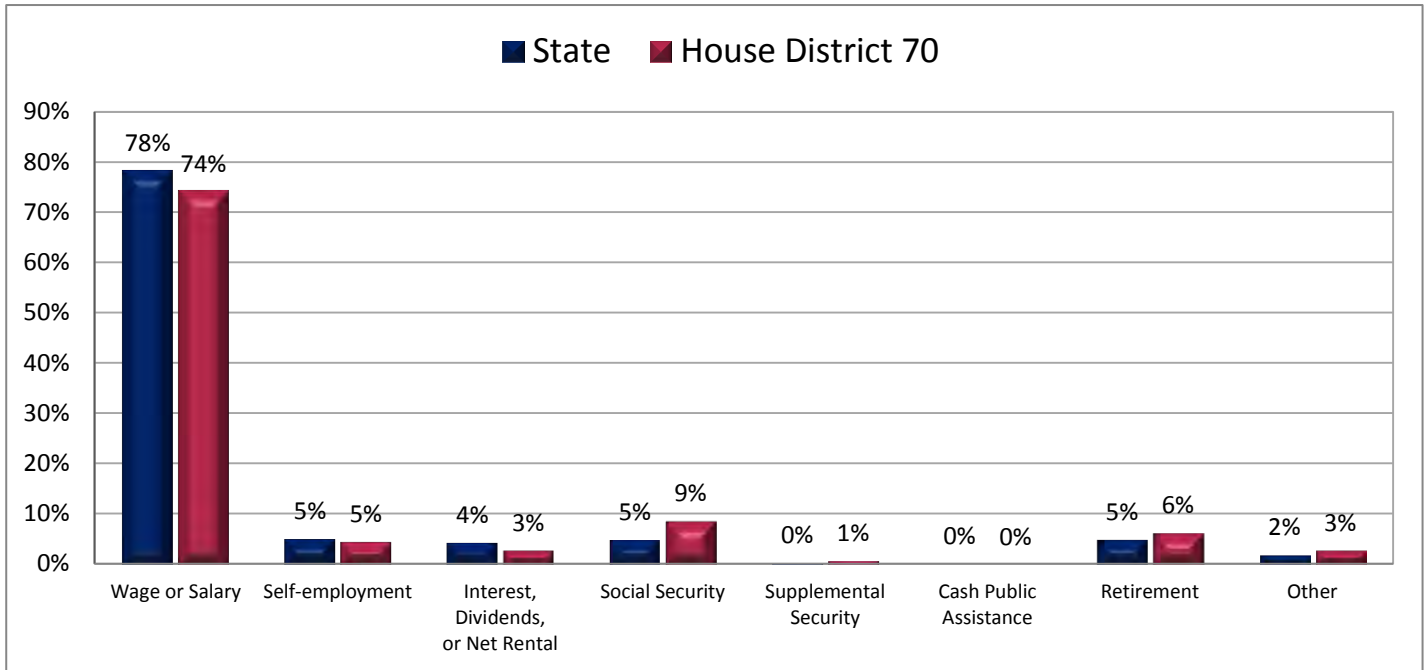
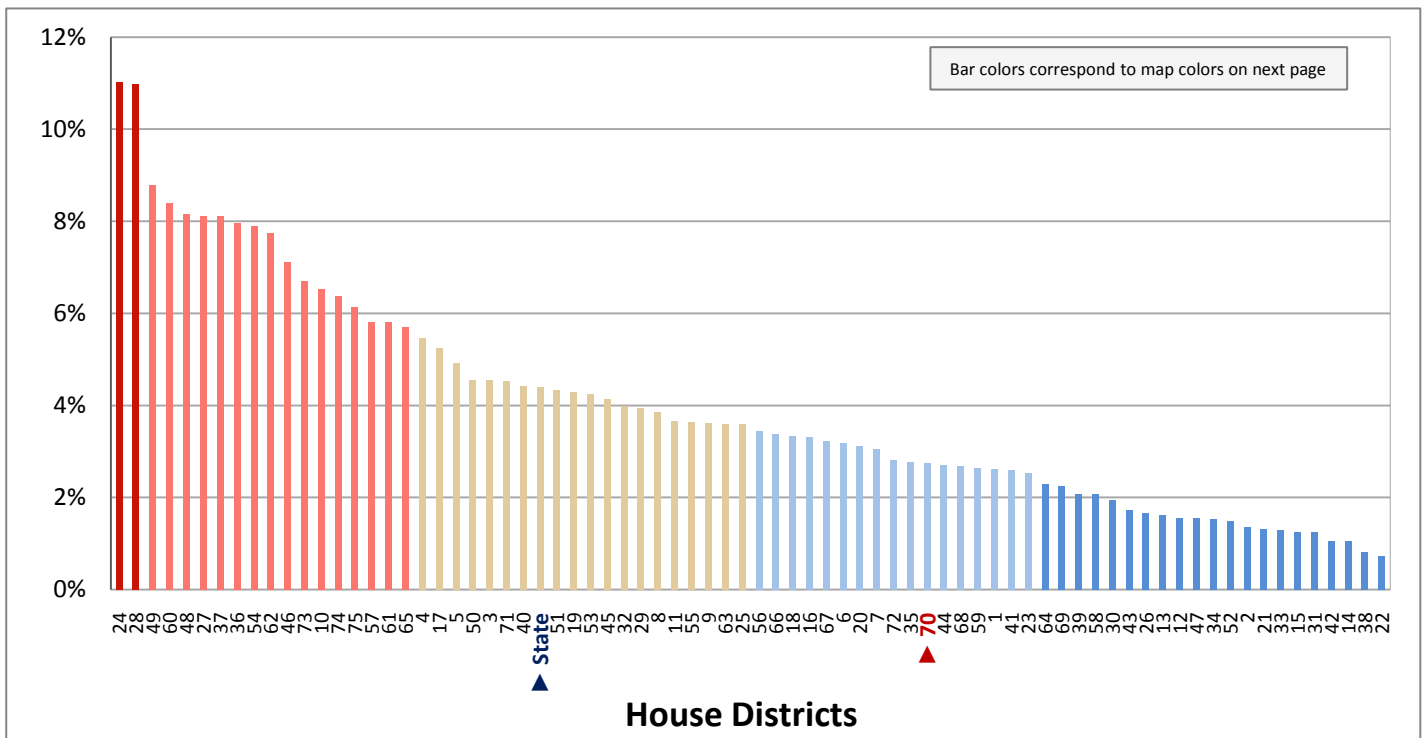


Figure 18.2 - SOURCES OF HOUSEHOLD INCOME

Percentage of Aggregate Household Income from Interest, Dividends, or Net Rental Income

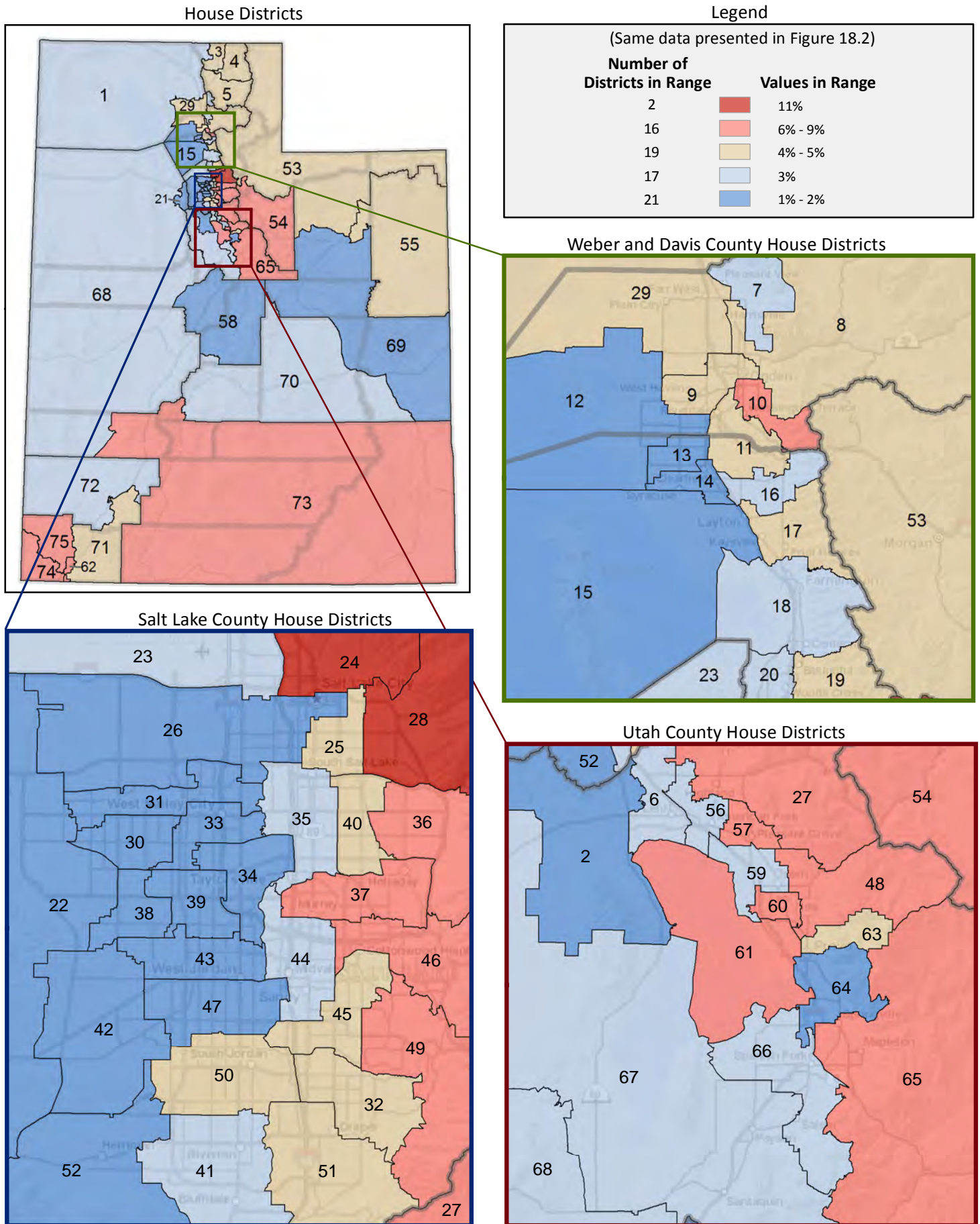


Figure 19.1 - HOUSEHOLD INCOME

 (Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)

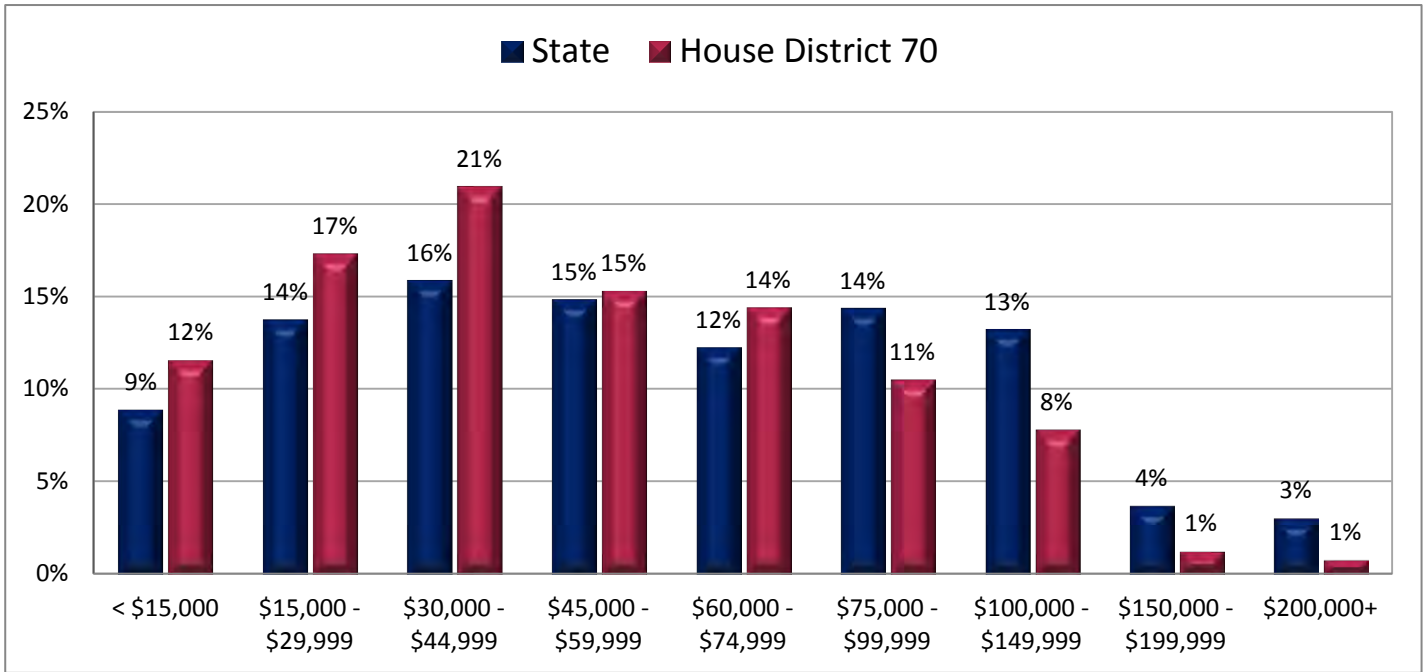


Figure 19.2 - HOUSEHOLD INCOME

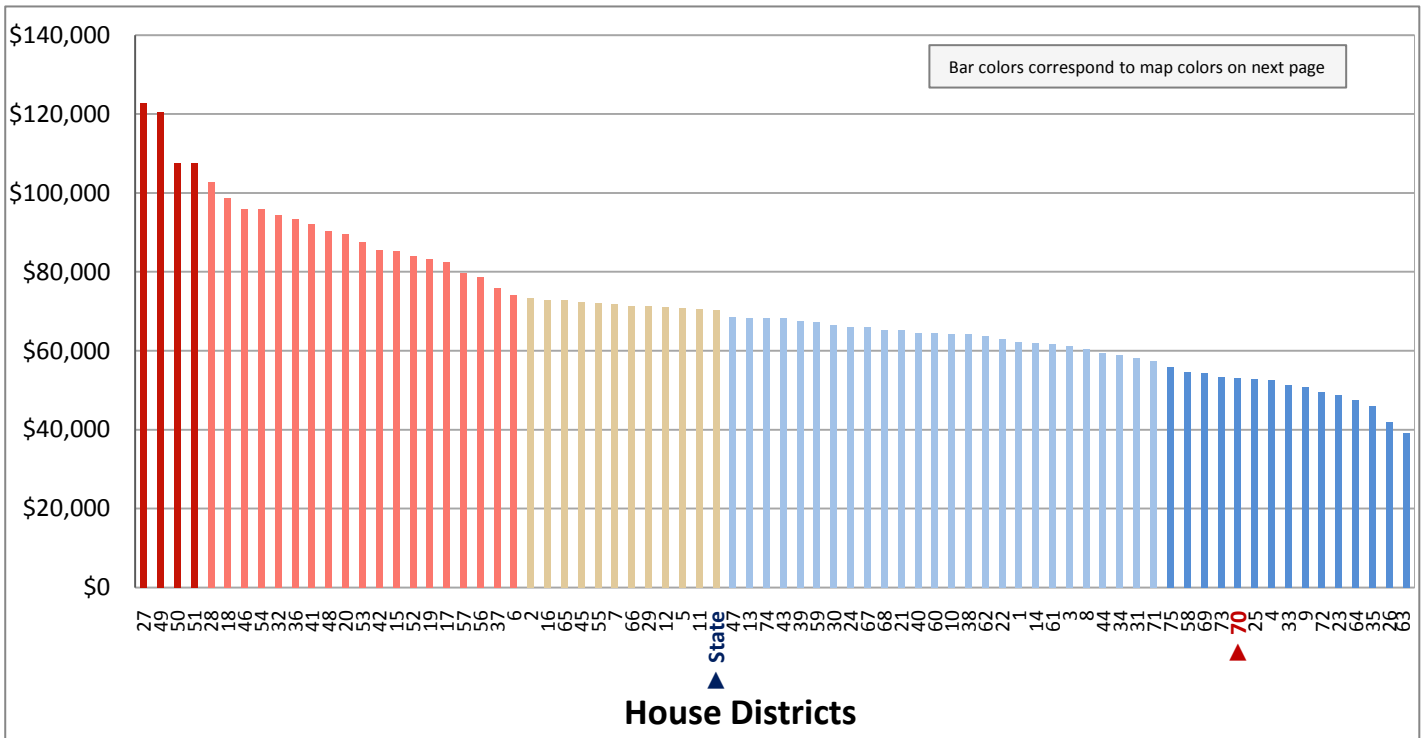


Figure 19.3 - HOUSEHOLD INCOME
Average Household Income

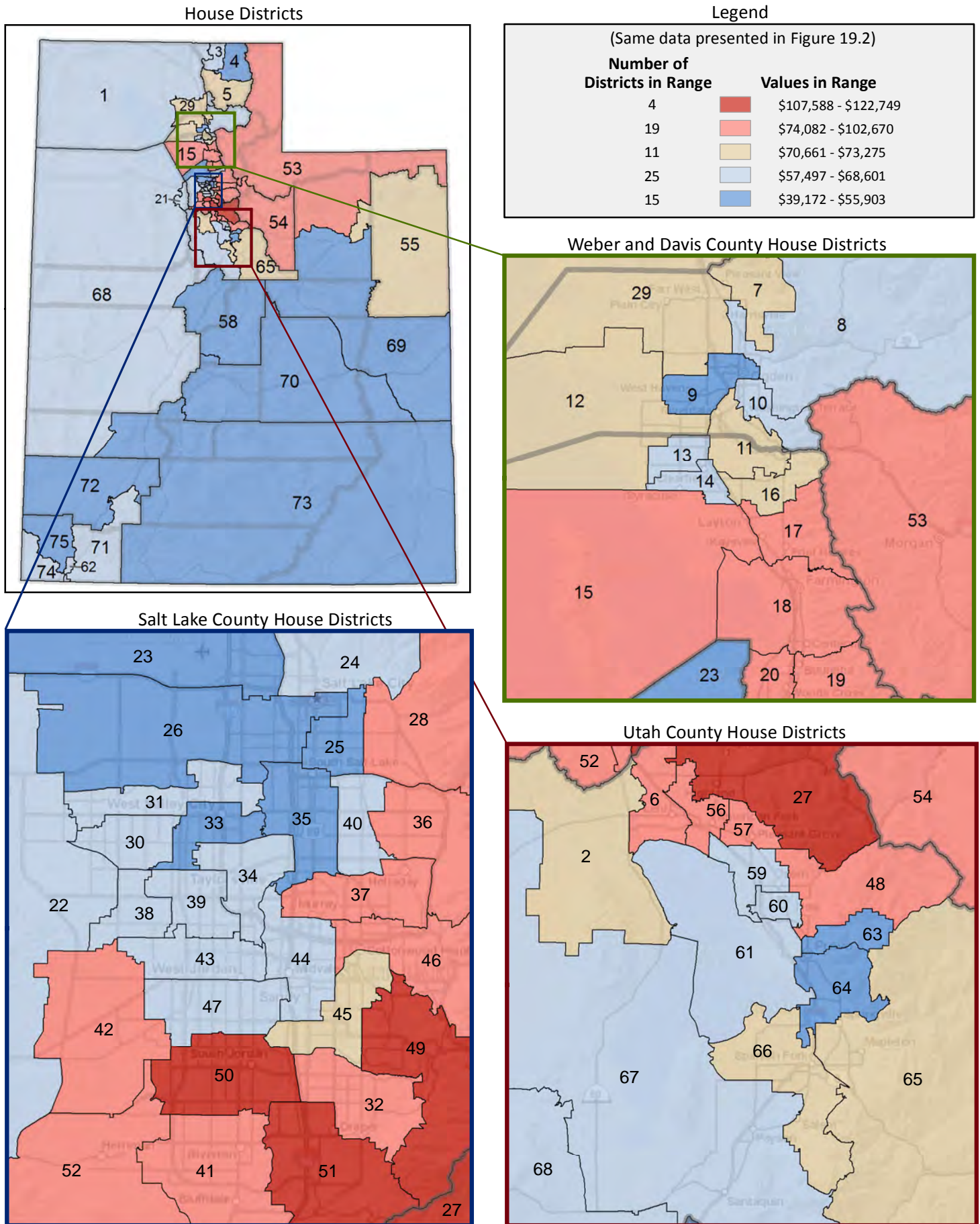


Figure 20.1 - POVERTY

 (Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)

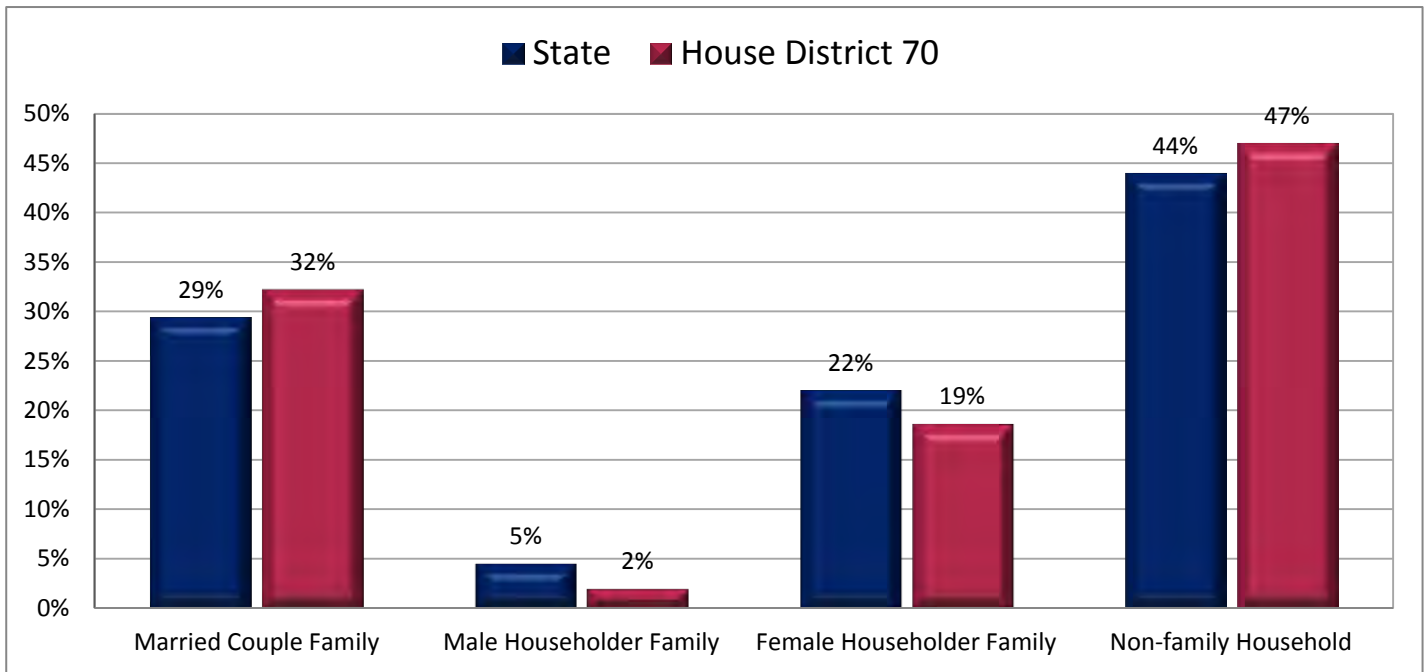
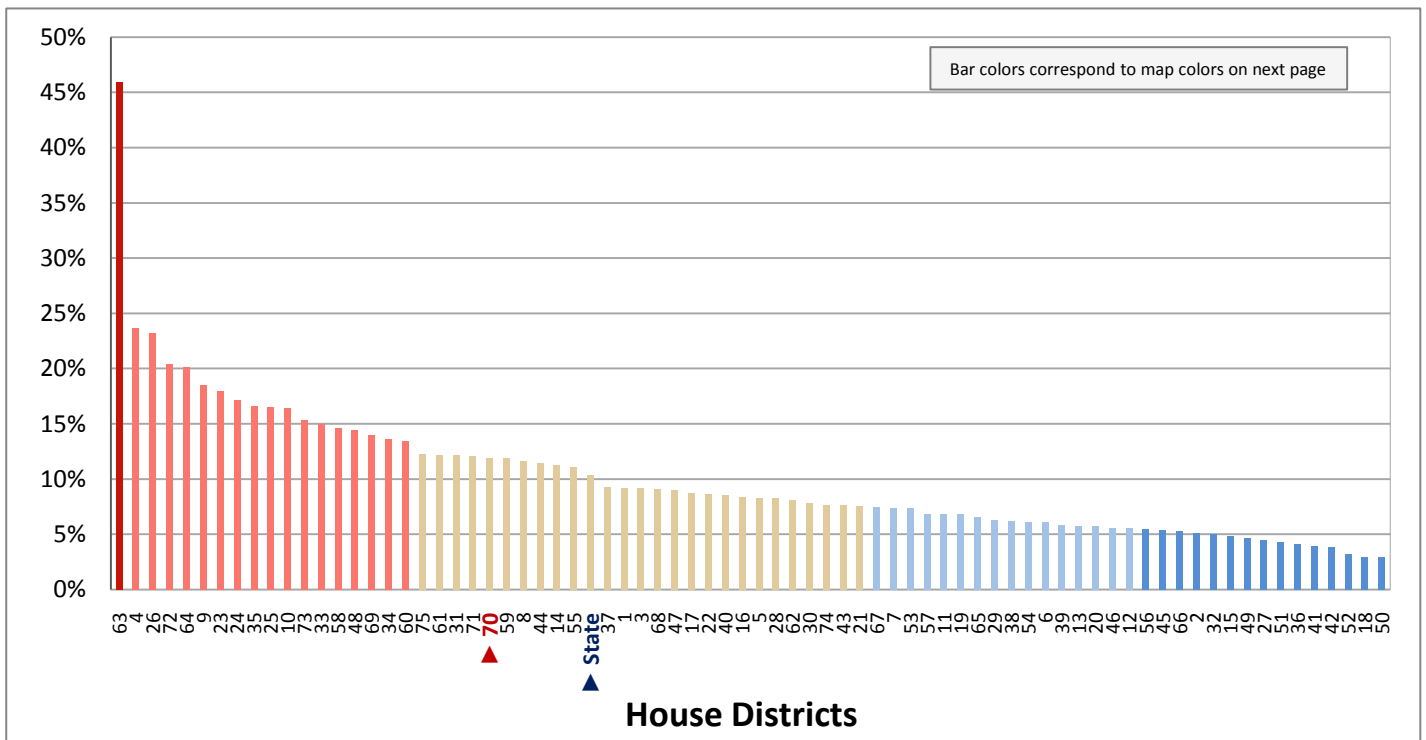


Figure 20.2 - POVERTY

Percentage of Total Households in Poverty

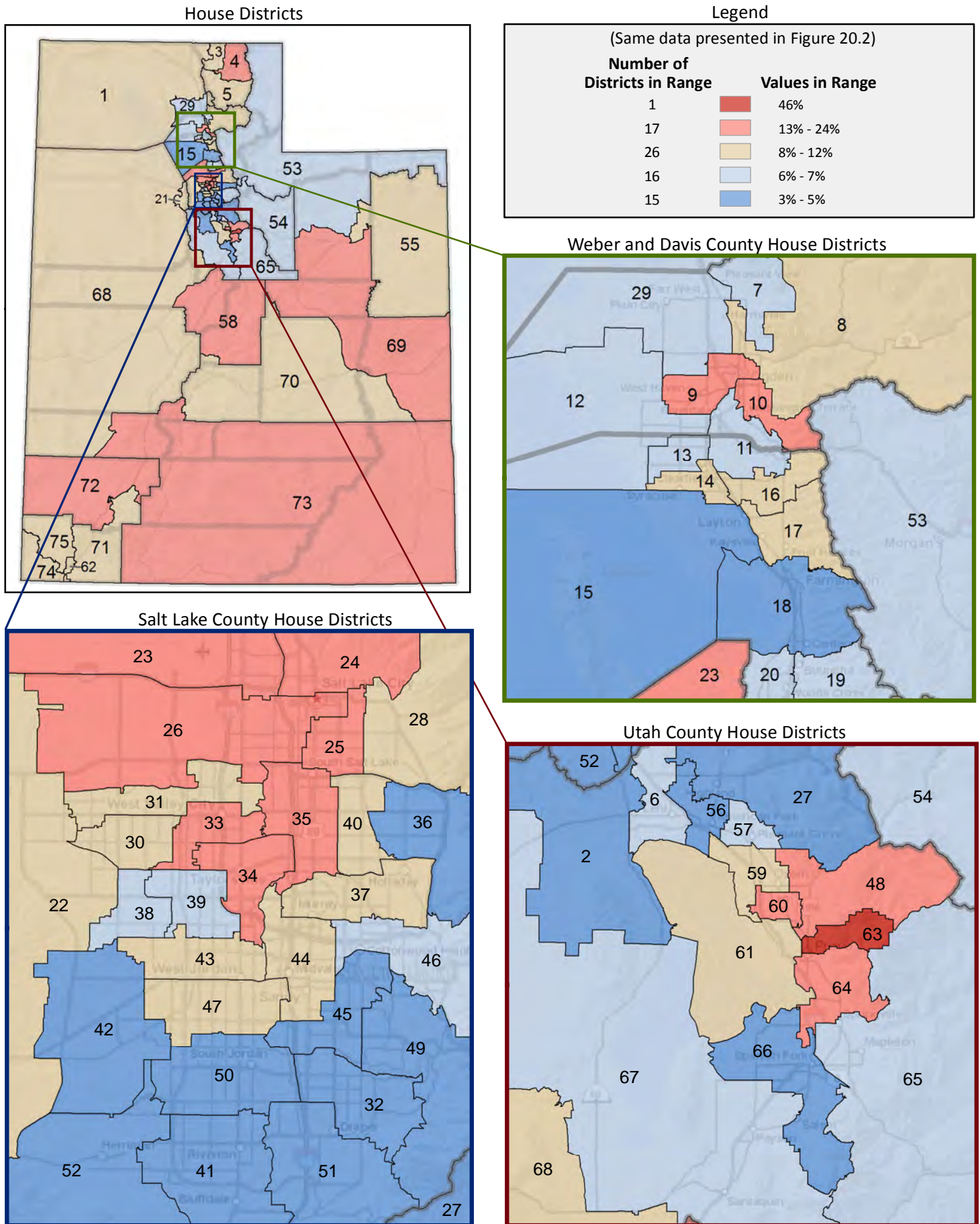


Figure 21.1 - FOOD STAMPS BY POVERTY STATUS

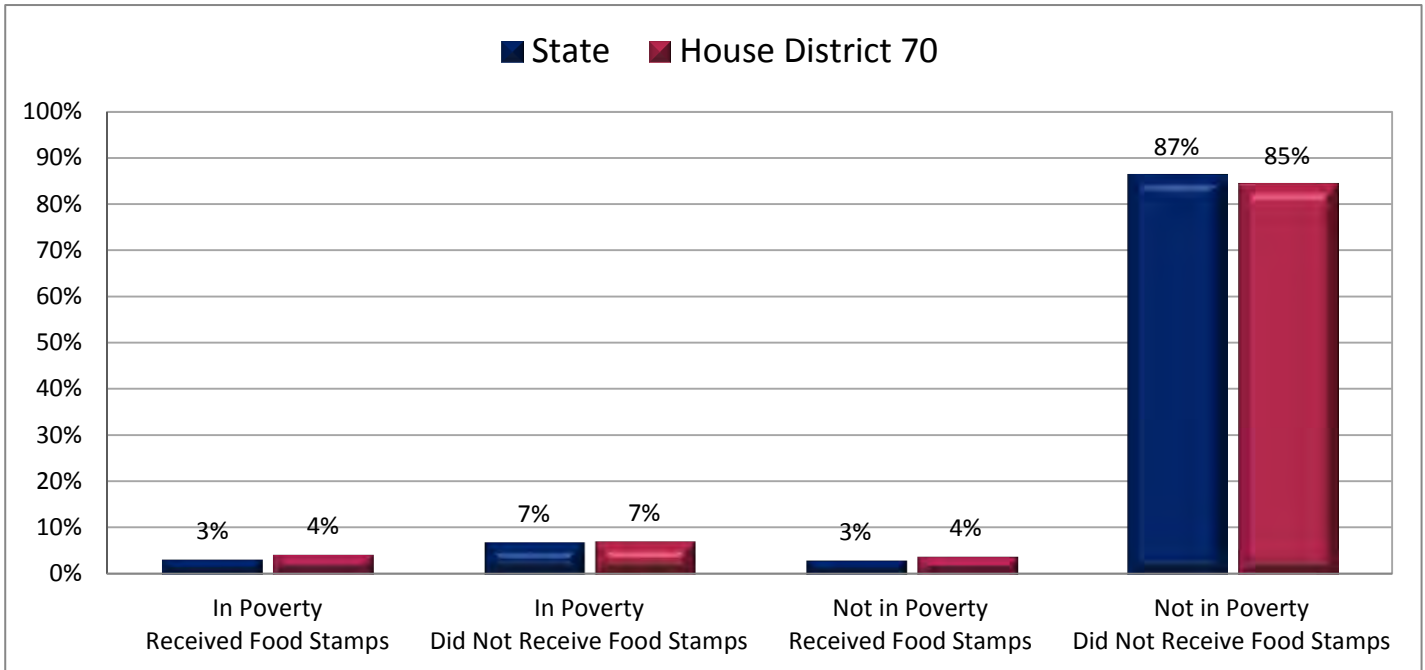
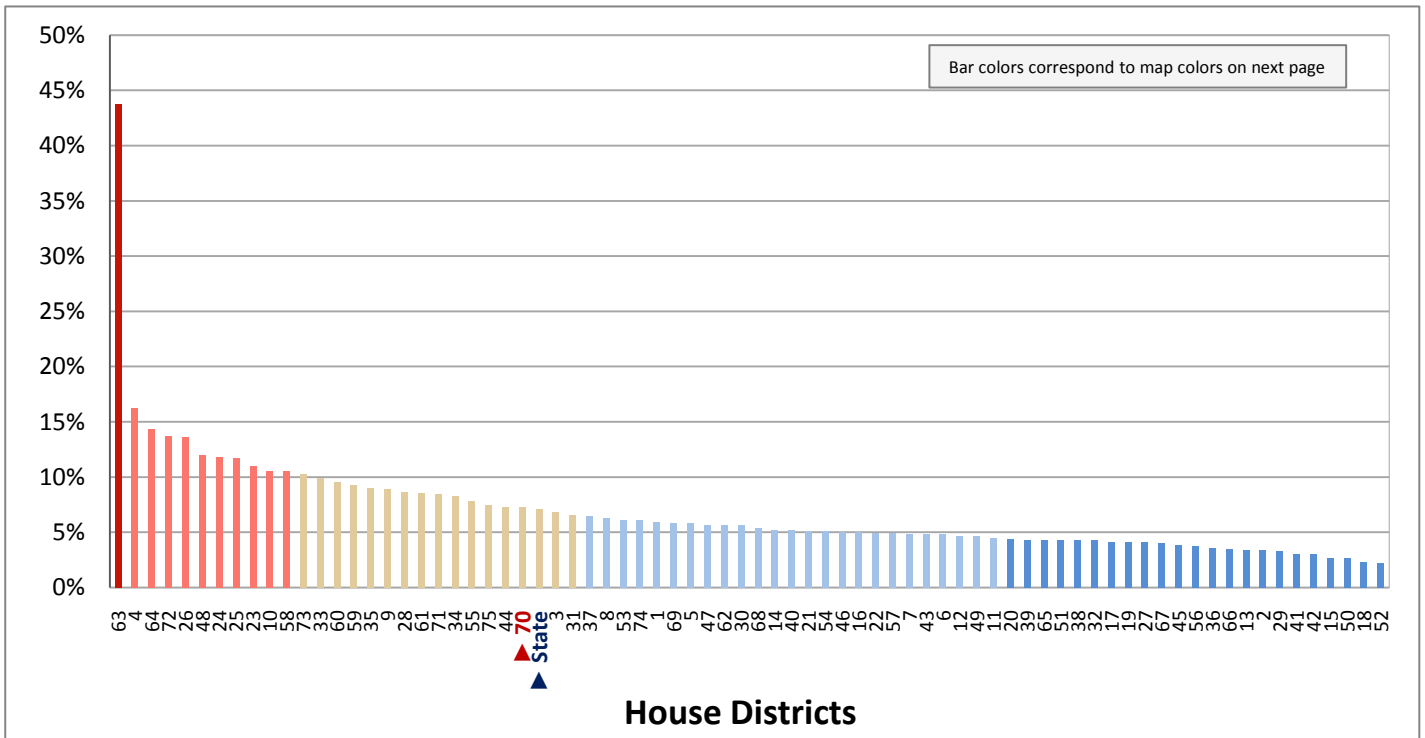


Figure 21.2 - FOOD STAMPS BY POVERTY STATUS

*Eligibility for the federal food stamp program now known as SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) is both income and asset based. A household's gross income must be less than 130% of poverty and the household's net income must be less than 100% of poverty. In addition, the household must have less than \$2,000 in assets. For households with elderly or disabled members, the asset limit is \$3,250.

Percentage of Households in Poverty That Do Not Receive Food Stamps

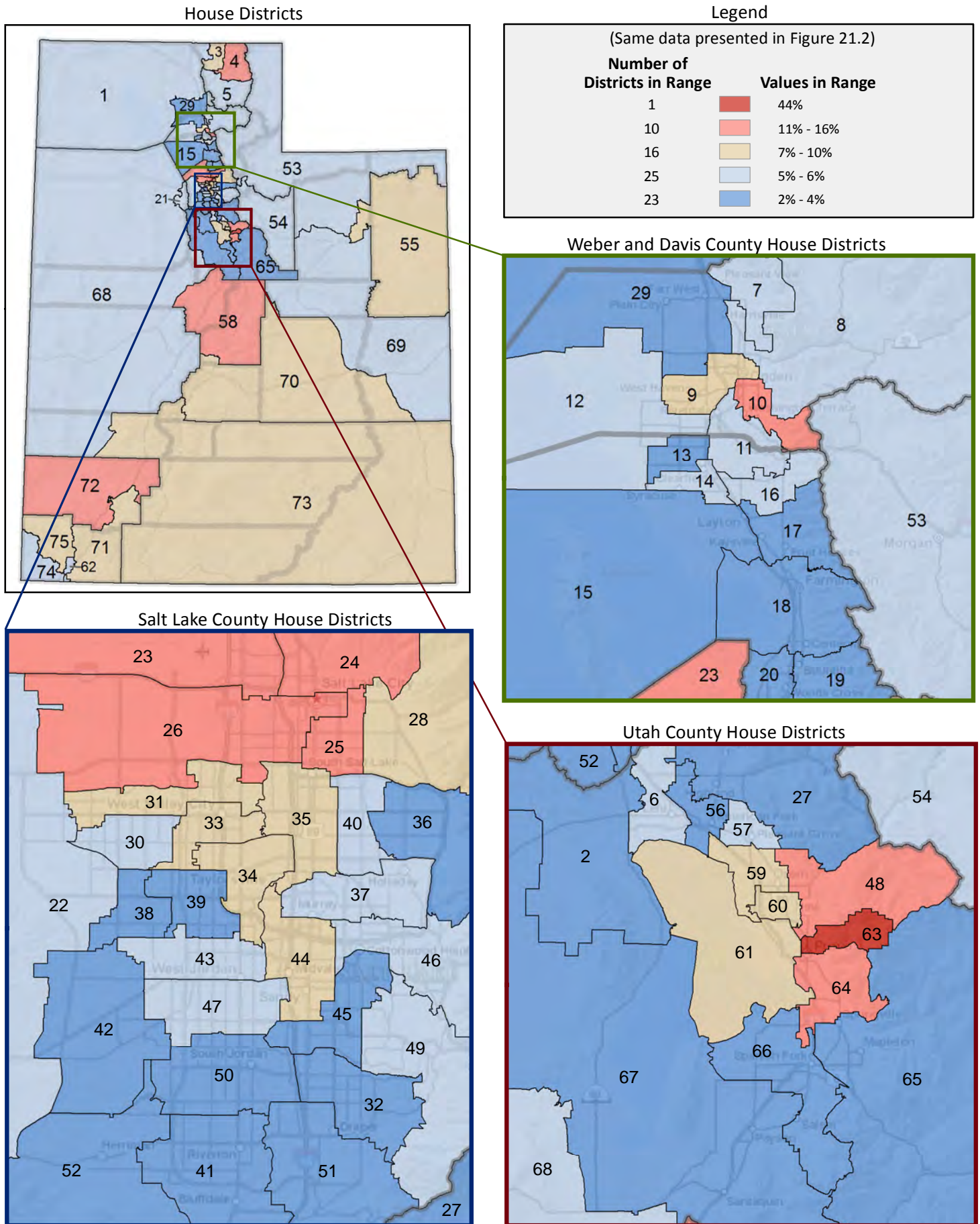


Figure 22.1 - FOOD STAMPS AND CASH PUBLIC ASSISTANCE

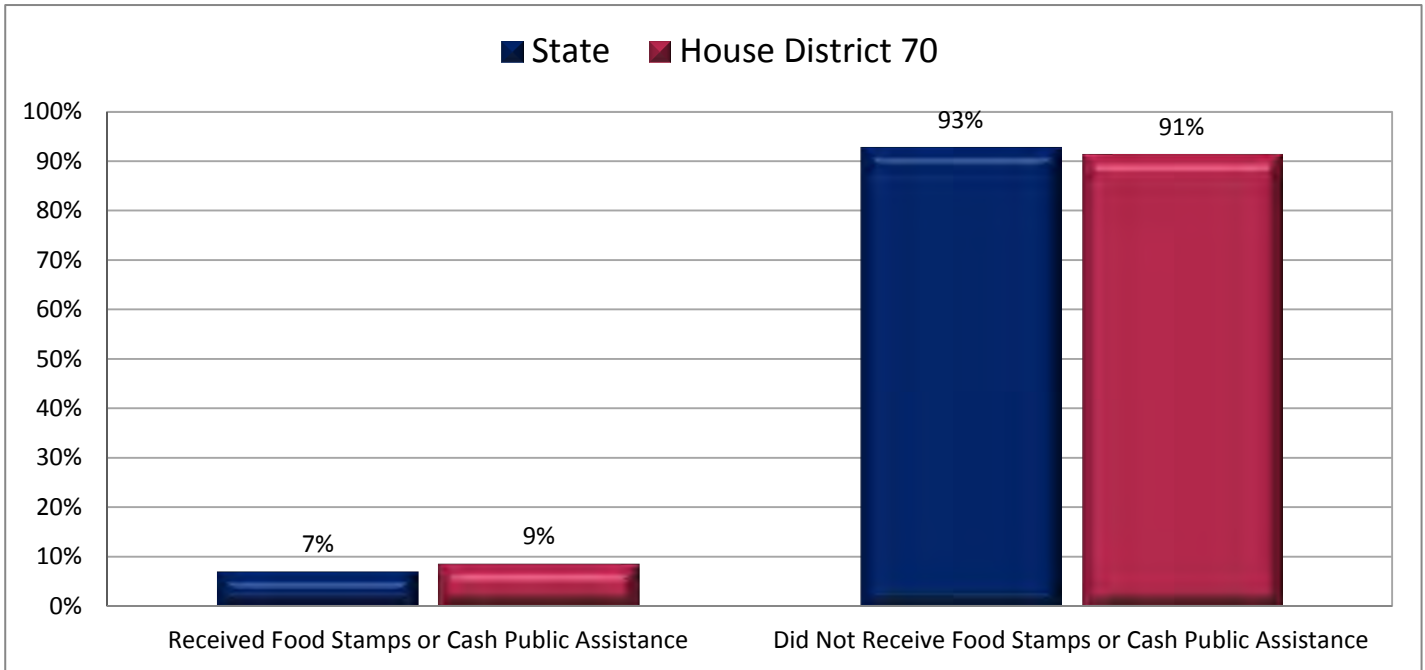
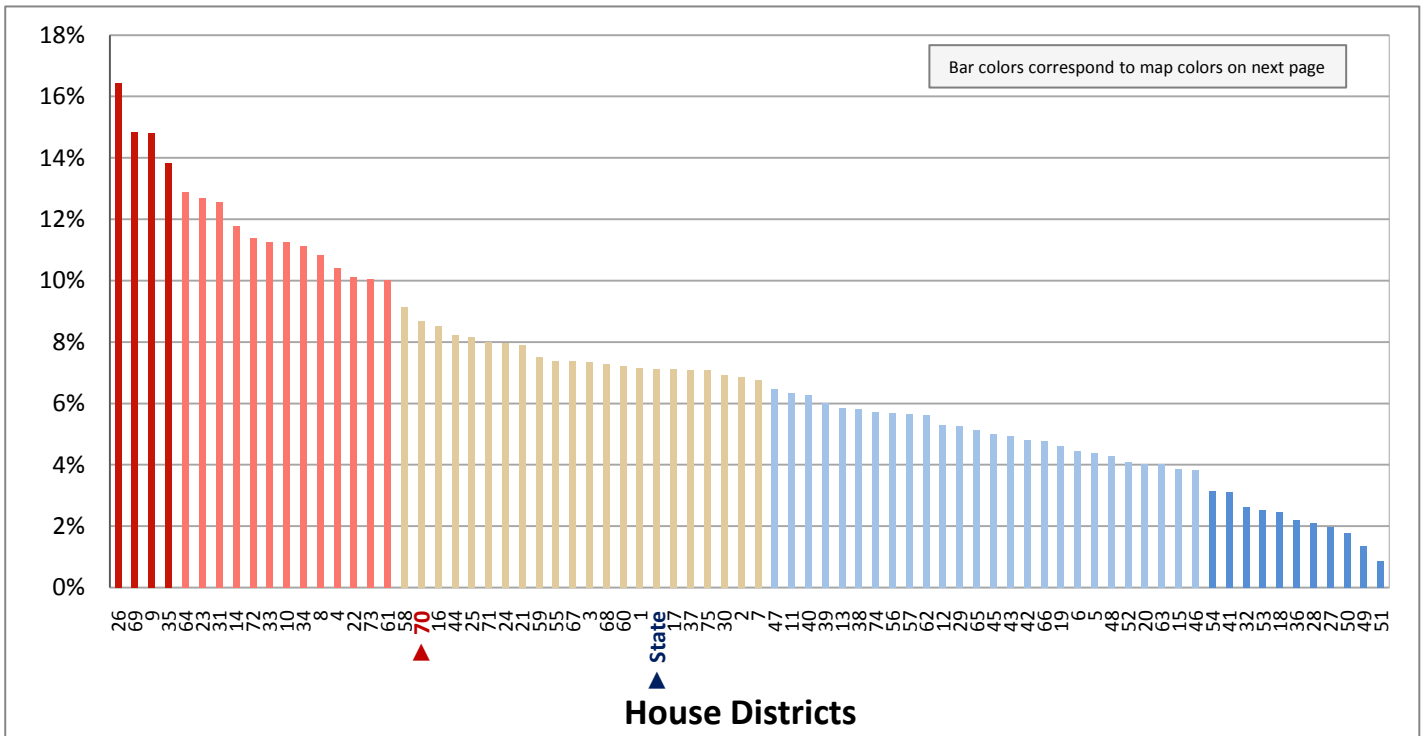


Figure 22.2 - FOOD STAMPS AND CASH PUBLIC ASSISTANCE

Percentage of Households Receiving Food Stamps or Cash Public Assistance

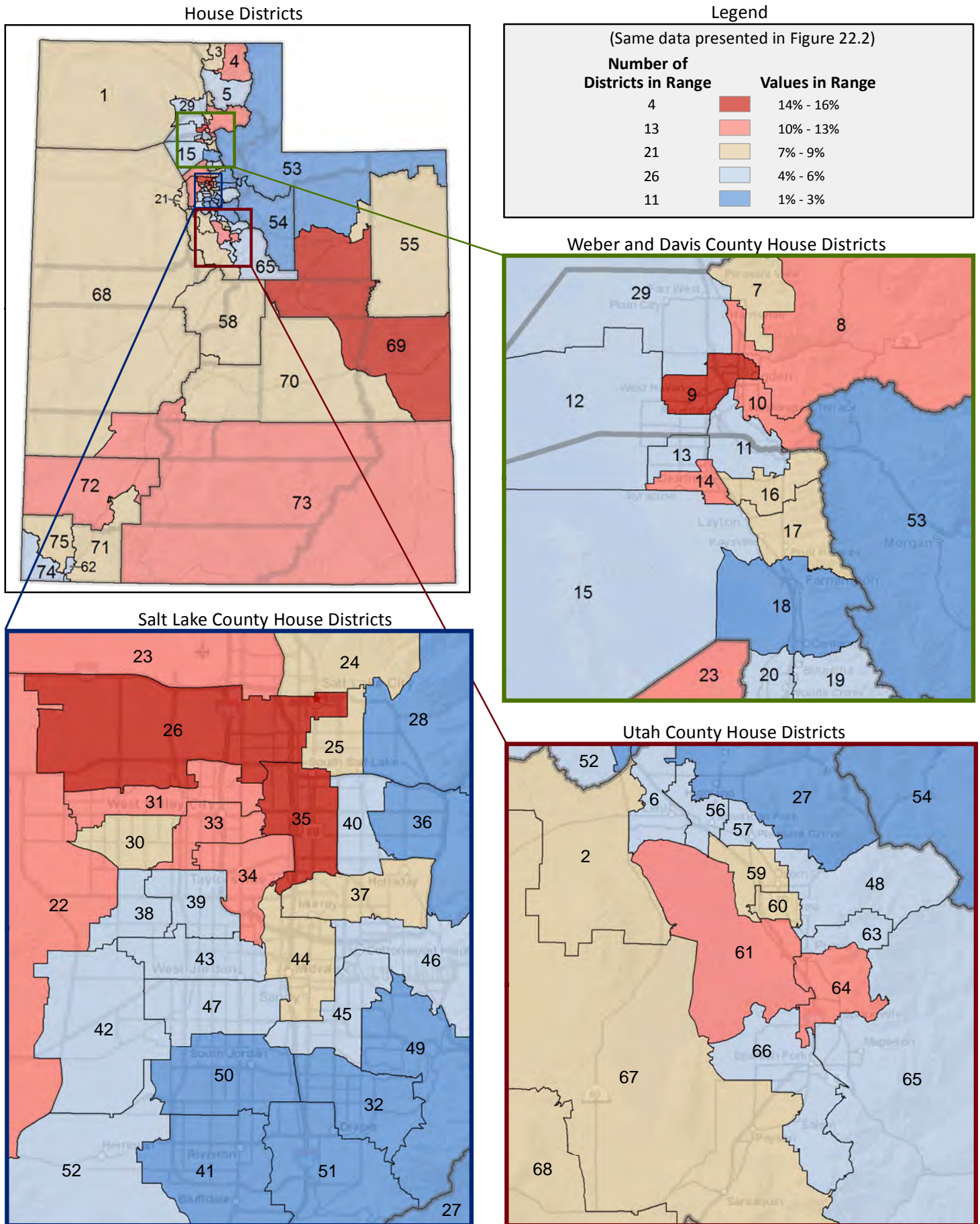


Figure 23.1 - HOUSING

 (Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)

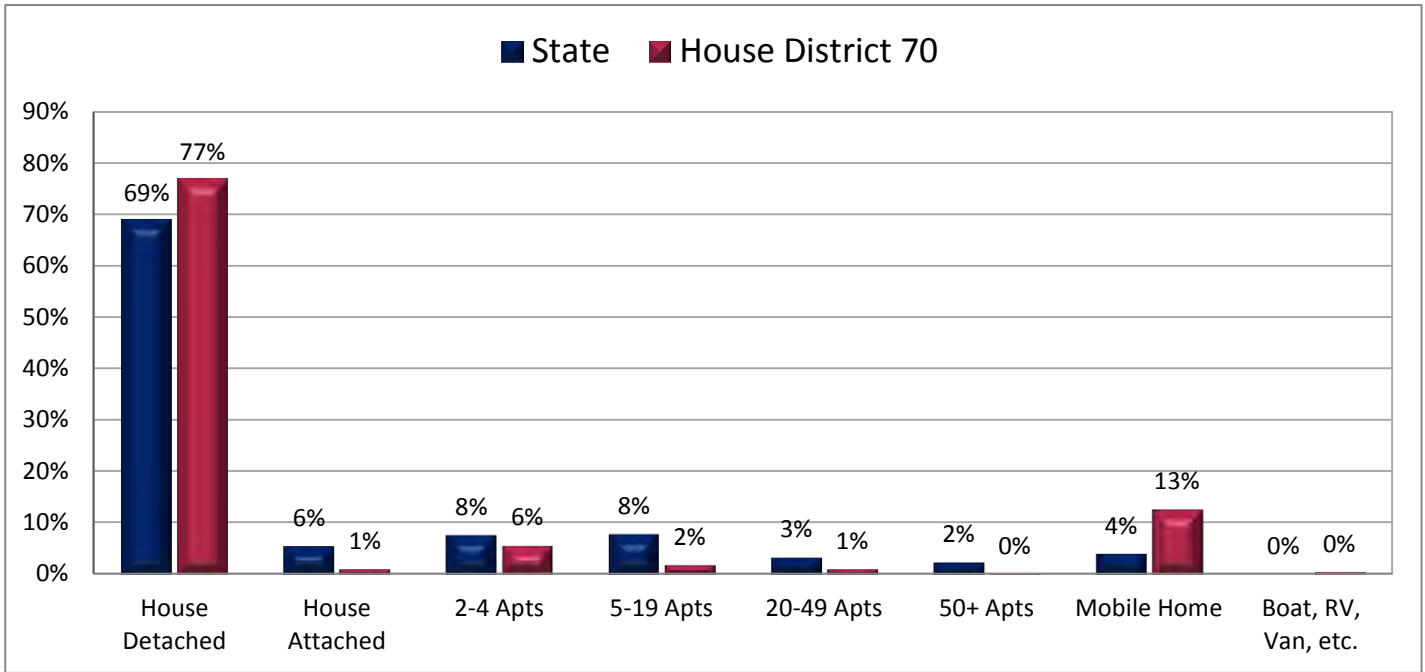
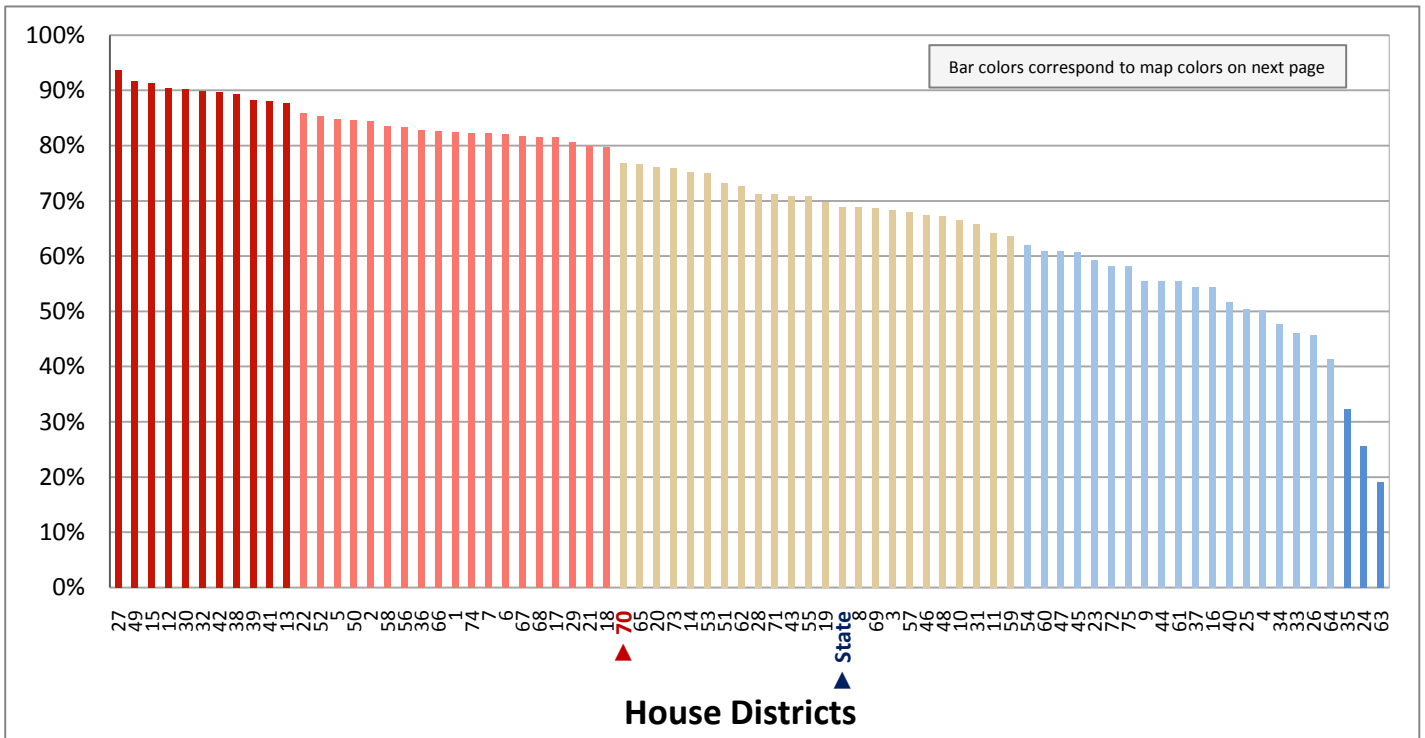


Figure 23.2 - HOUSING

Percentage of Housing Units That are a Detached House

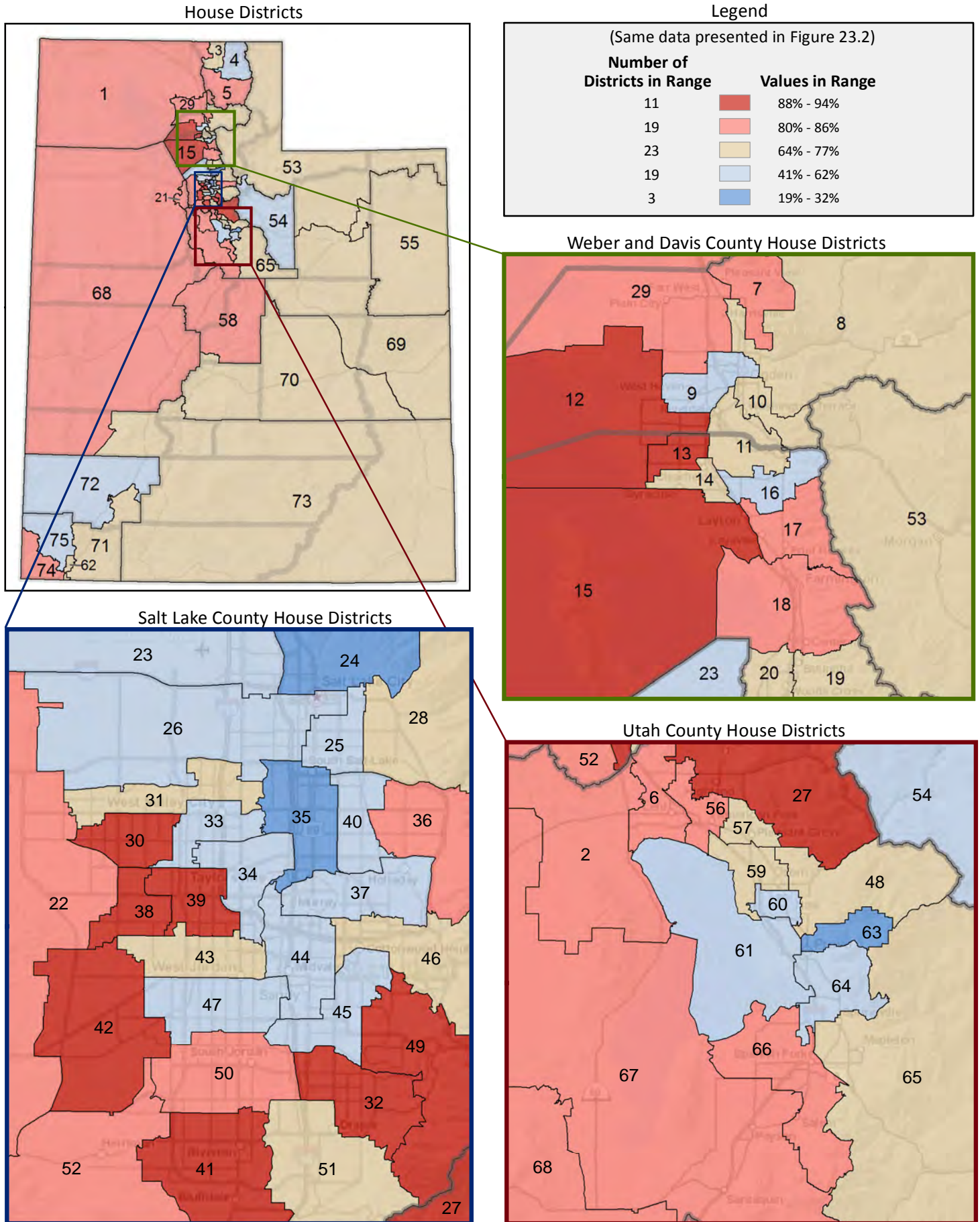


Figure 24.1 - HOME OWNERSHIP

 (Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)

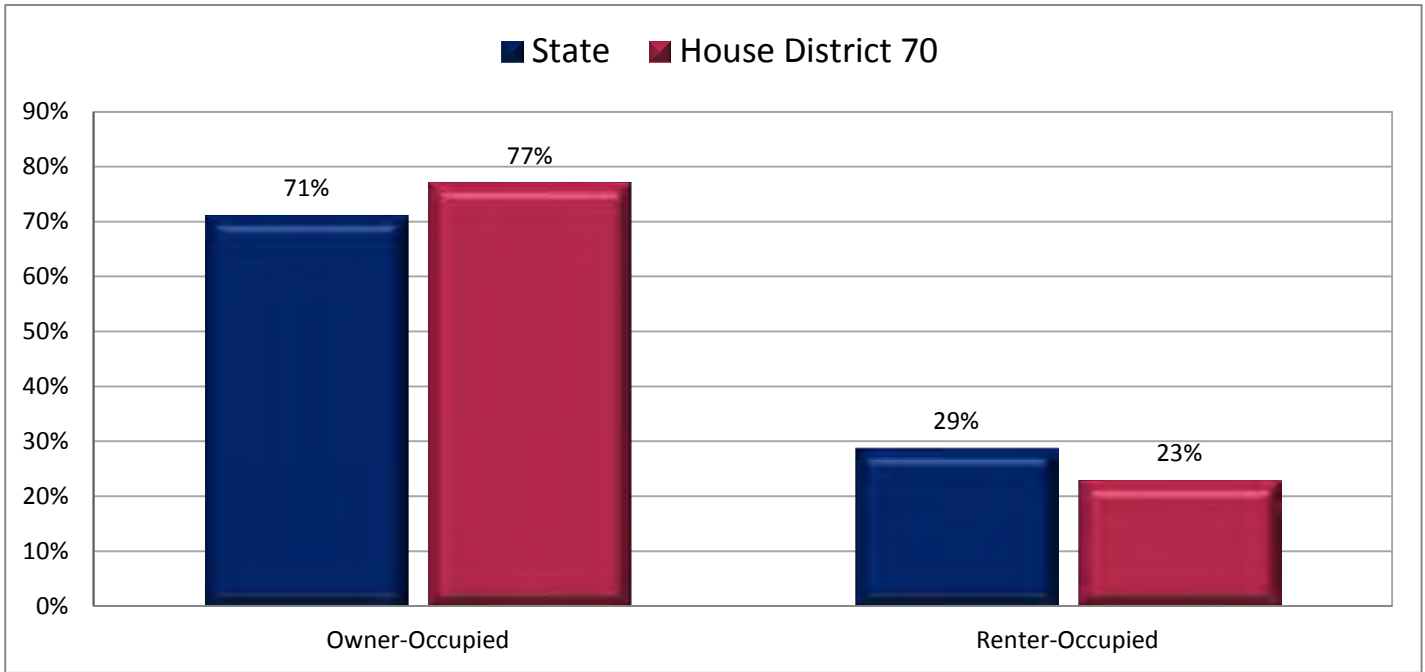


Figure 24.2 - HOME OWNERSHIP

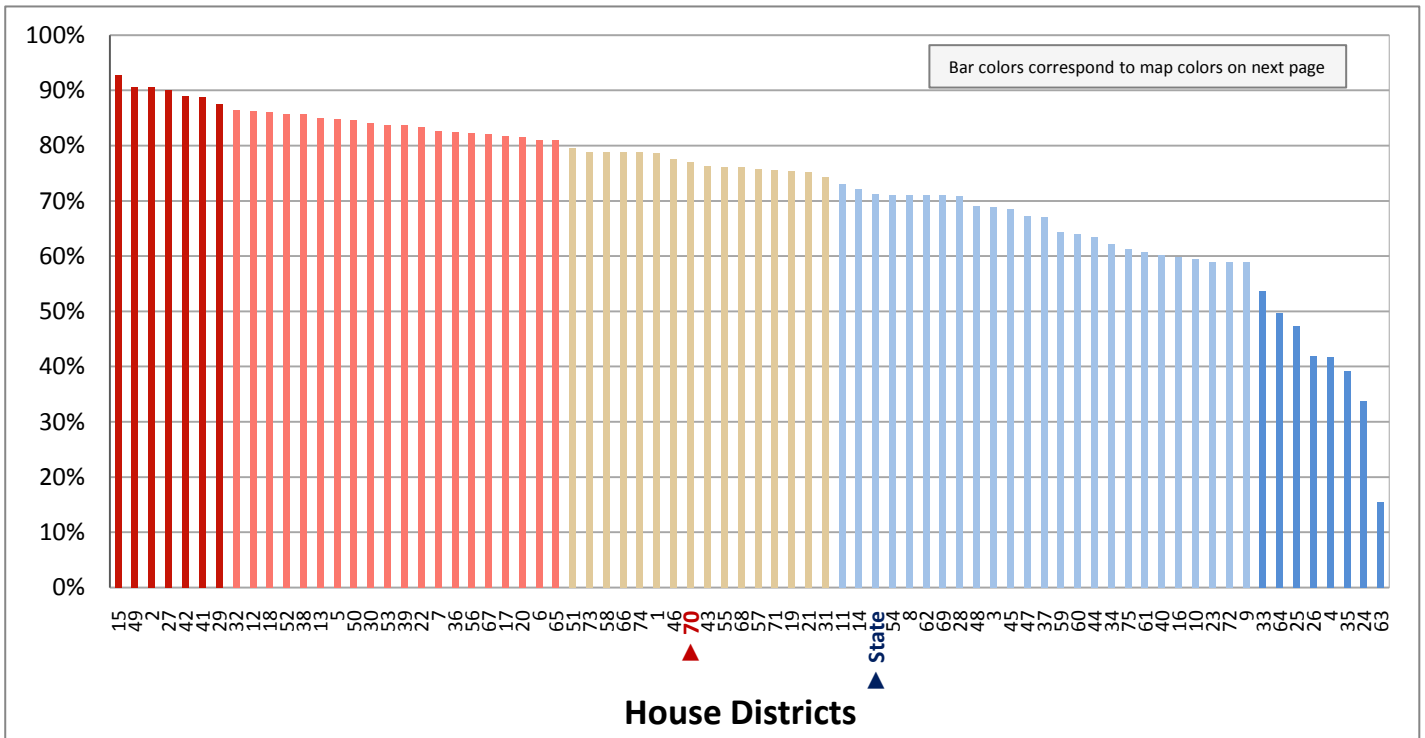


Figure 24.3 - HOME OWNERSHIP

 (First category in Figure 24.1; same data presented in Figure 24.3; additional data in Table 24 of the appendix)

Percentage of Occupied Housing Units Owned by Occupant

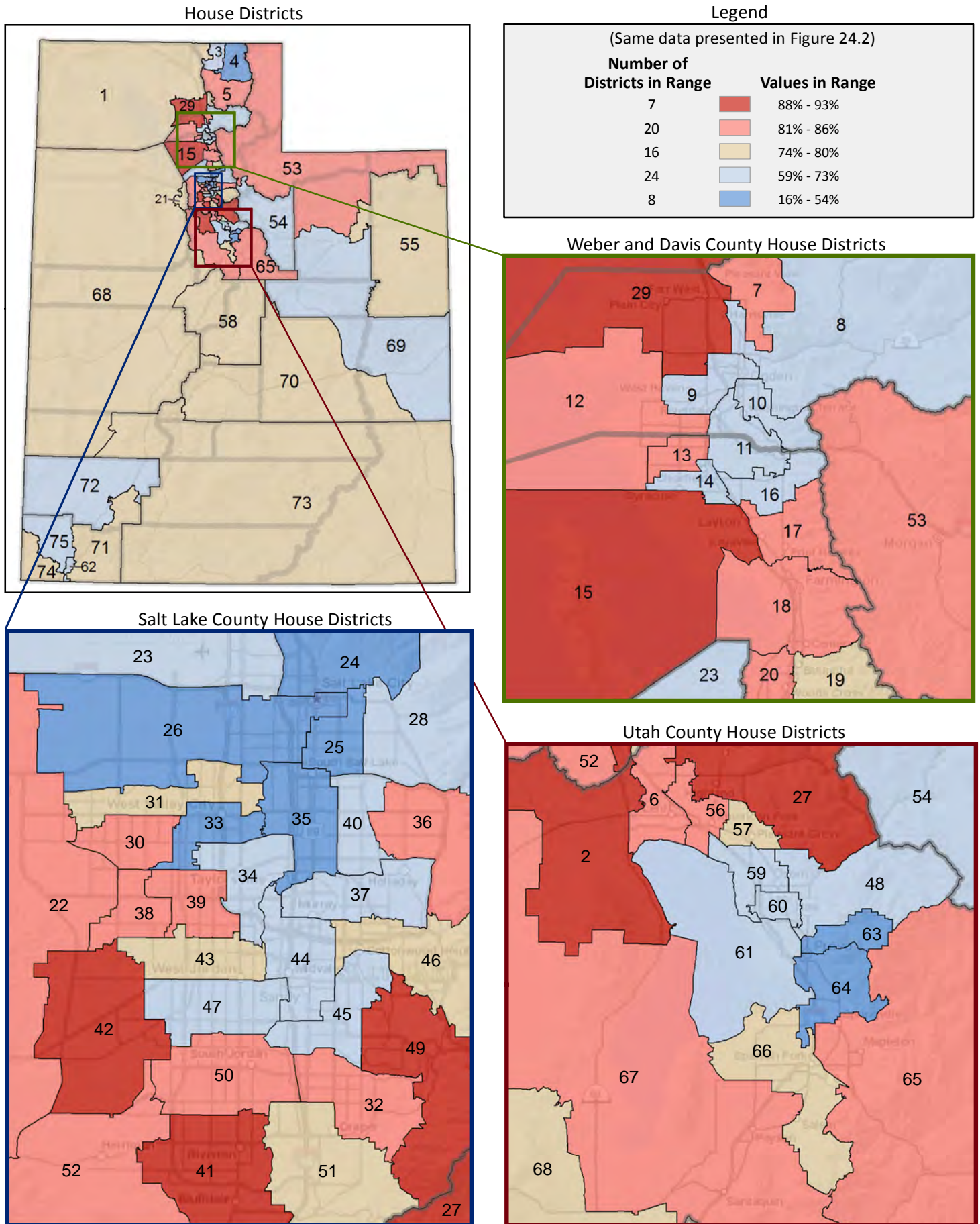


Figure 25.1 - MORTGAGE STATUS

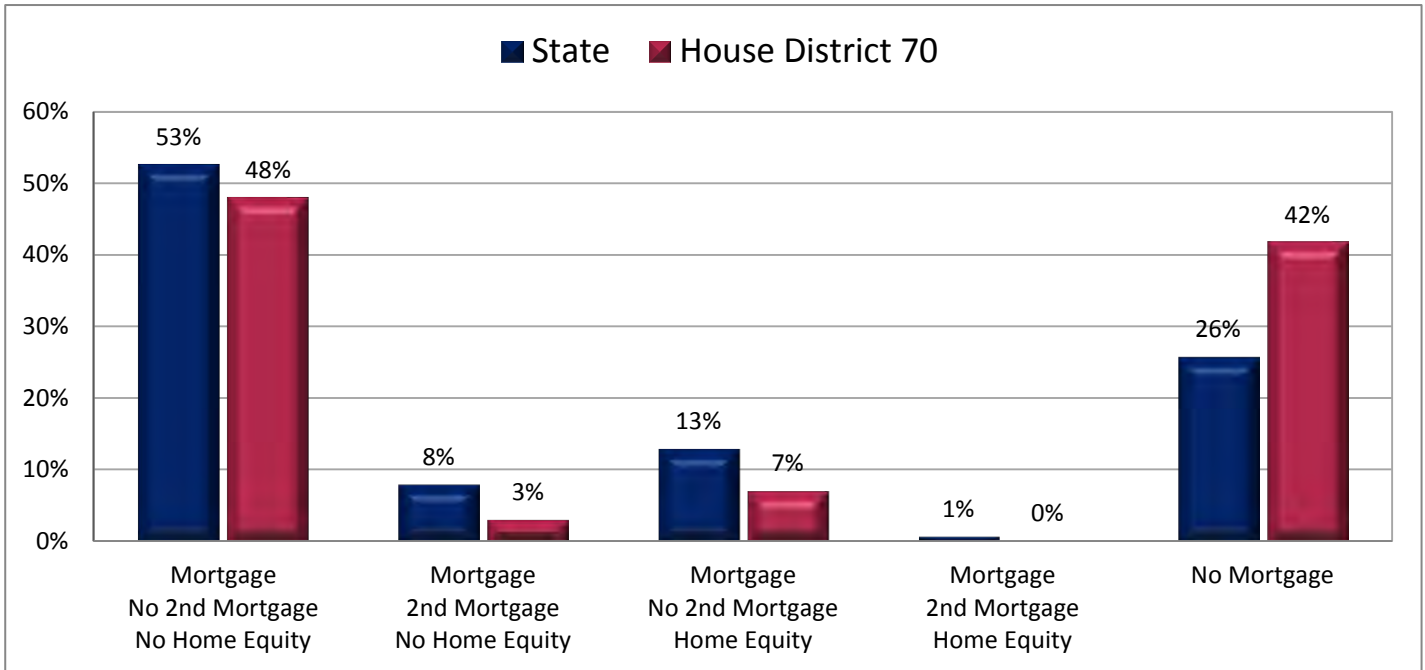


Figure 25.2 - MORTGAGE STATUS

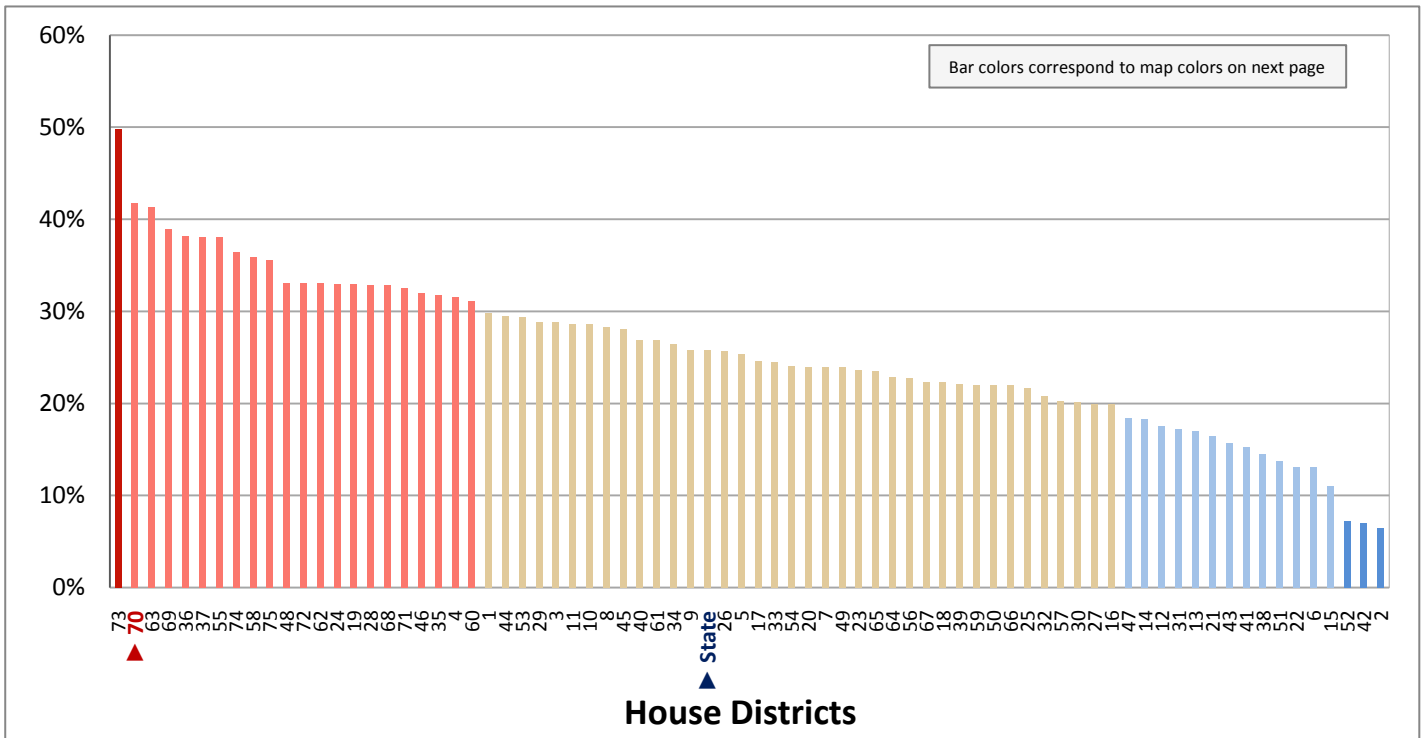


Figure 25.3 - MORTGAGE STATUS

(Last category in Figure 25.1; same data presented in Figure 25.3; additional data in Table 25 of the appendix)

Percentage of Owner-Occupied Housing Units without a Mortgage

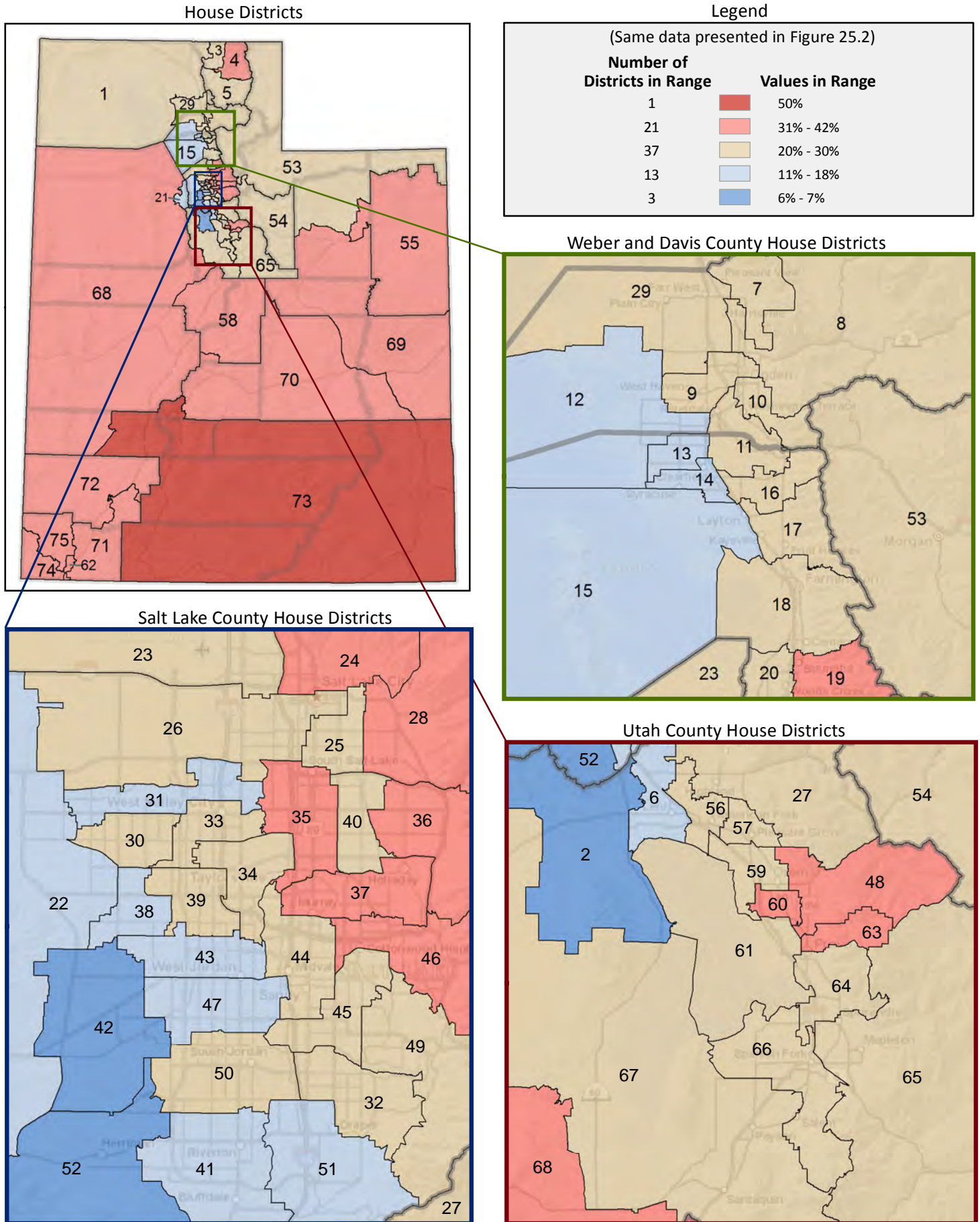


Figure 26.1 - YEAR MOVED INTO UNIT

 (Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)

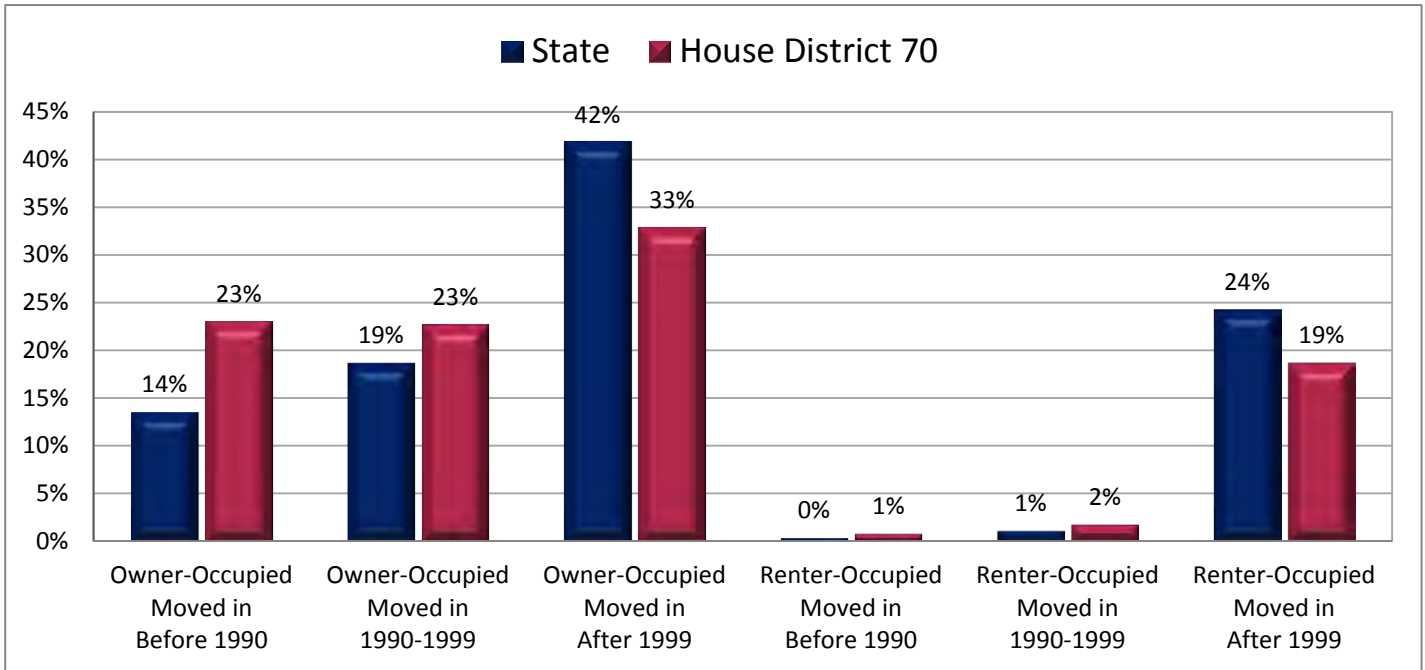


Figure 26.2 - YEAR MOVED INTO UNIT

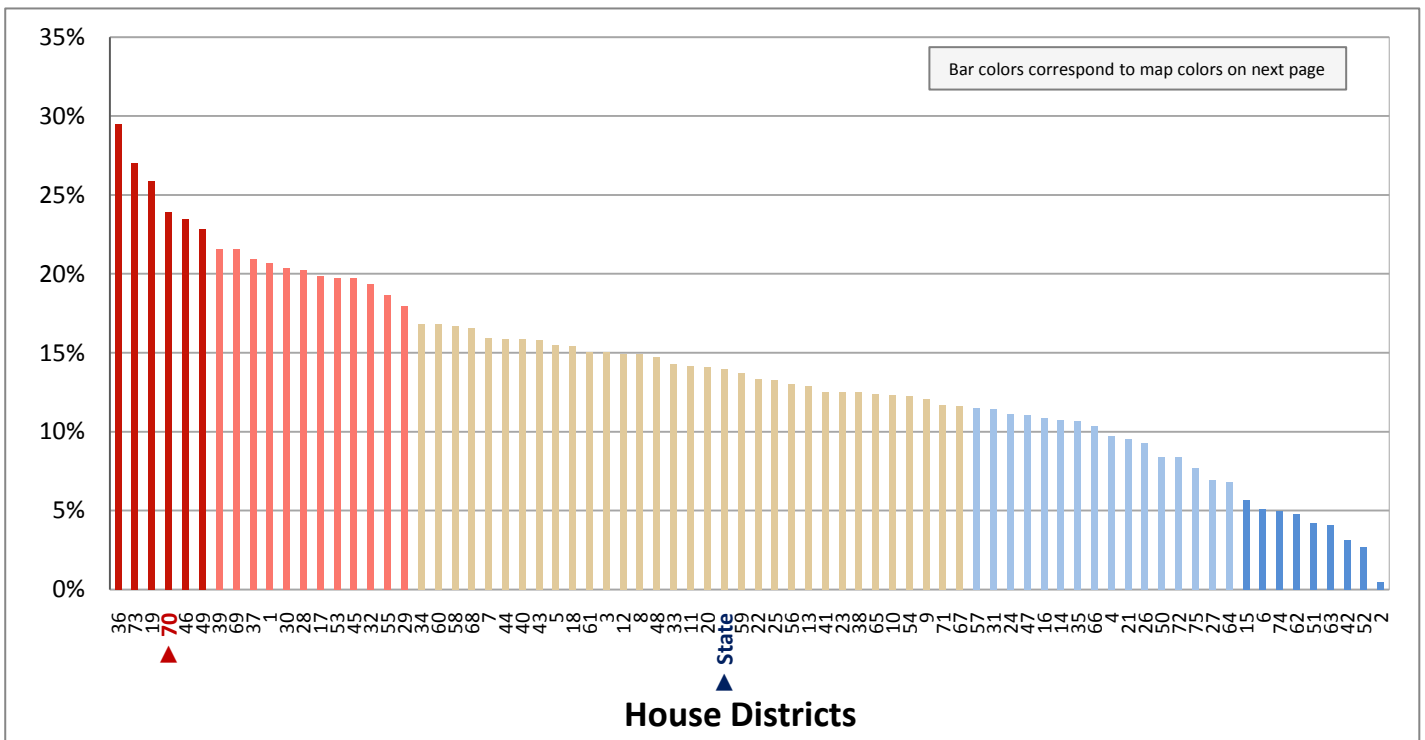


Figure 26.3 - YEAR MOVED INTO UNIT

 Moved in Prior to 1990**

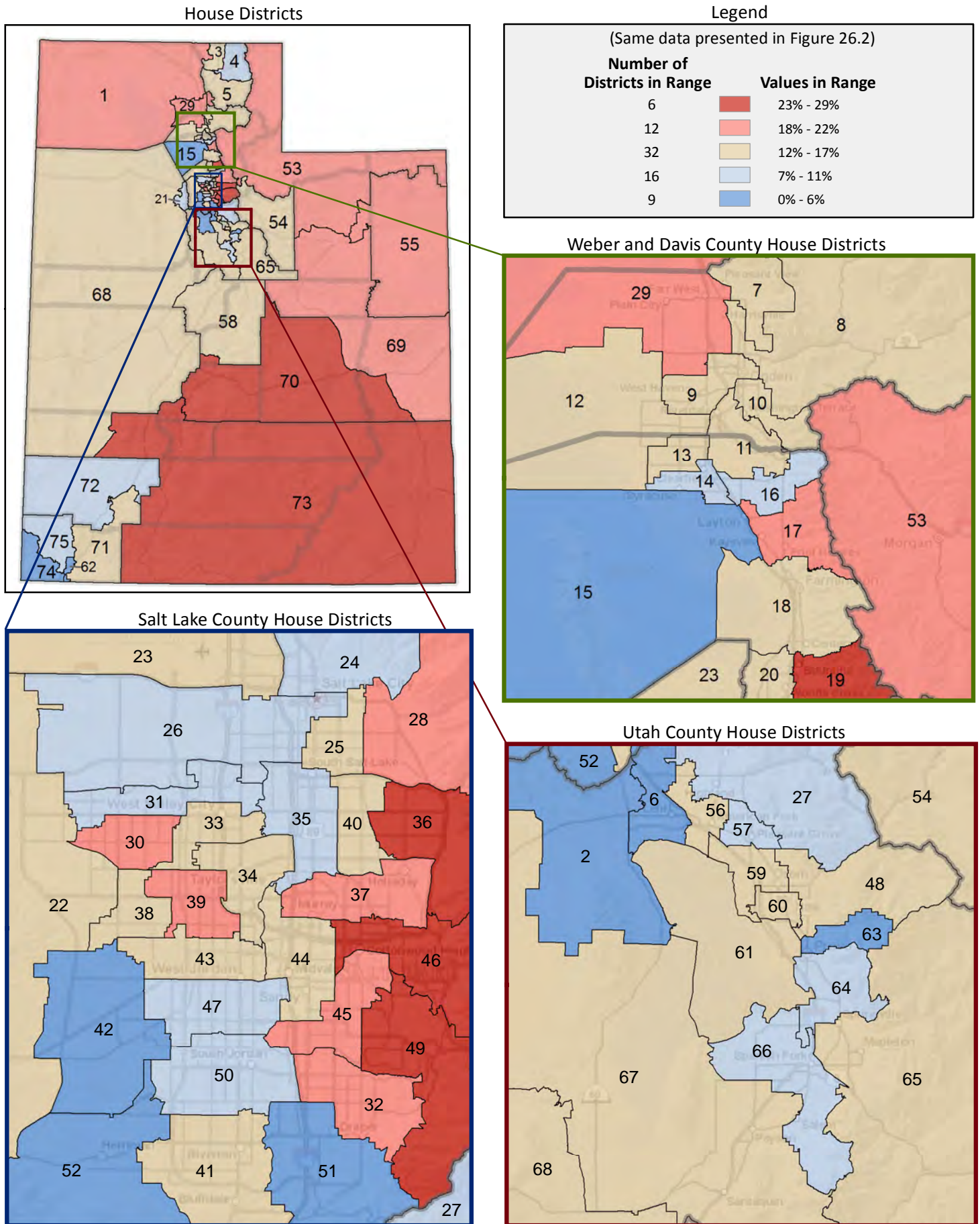


Figure 27.1 - MOVED IN PAST YEAR

 (Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)

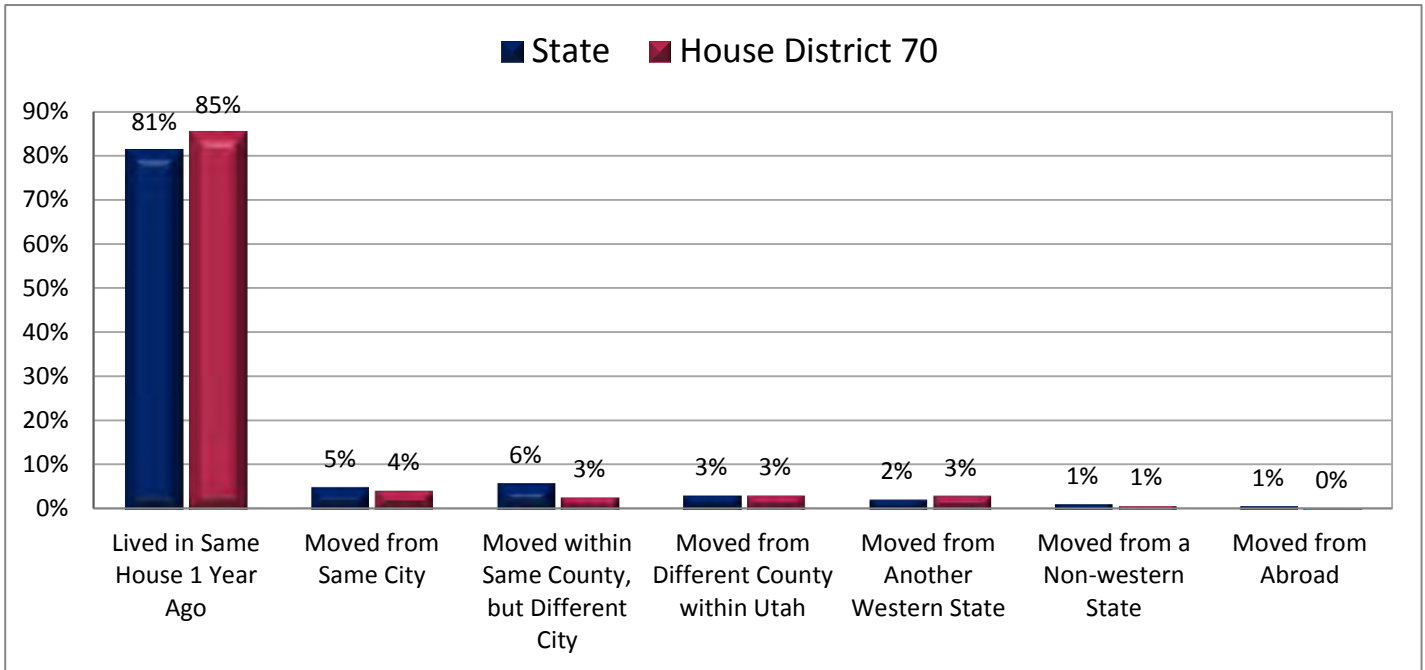


Figure 27.2 - MOVED IN PAST YEAR

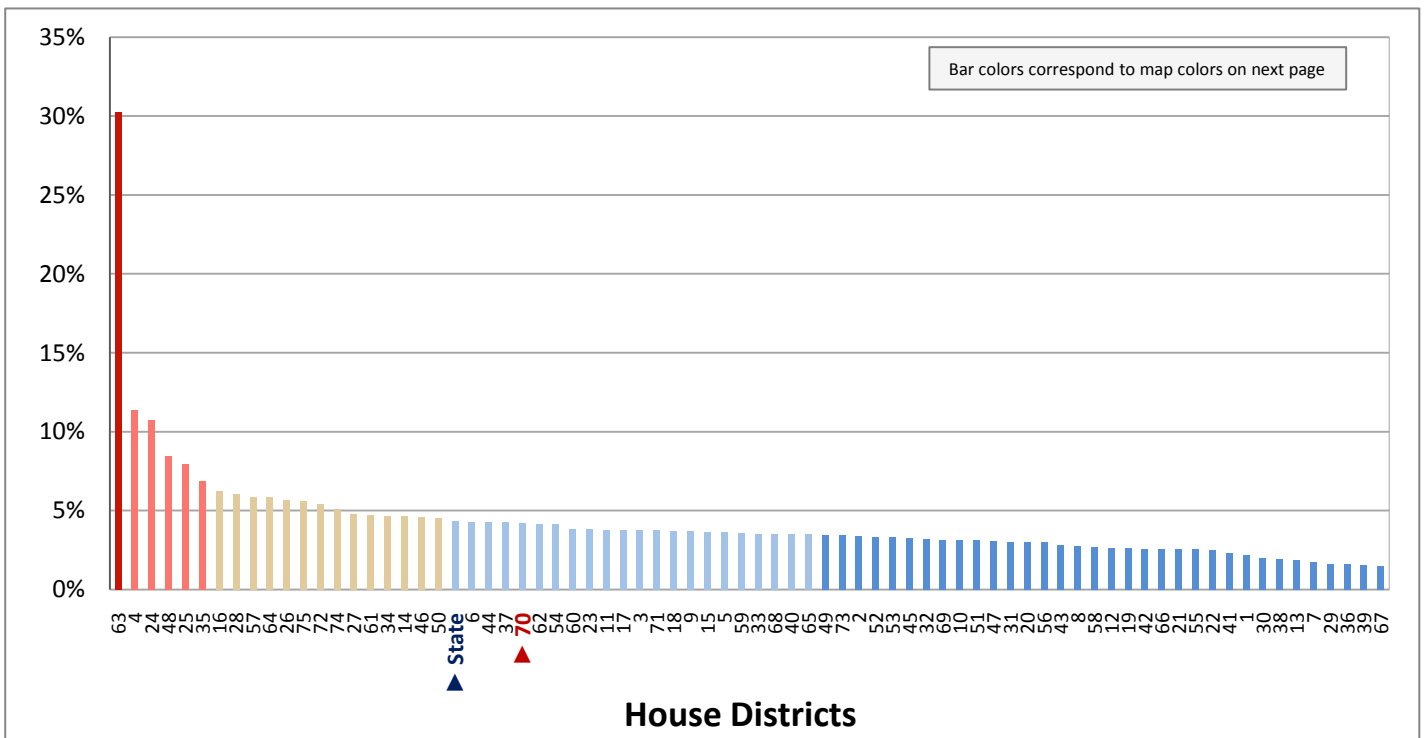


Figure 27.3 - MOVED IN PAST YEAR

Percentage of Population Age 1+ Who Moved to Utah in the Past Year

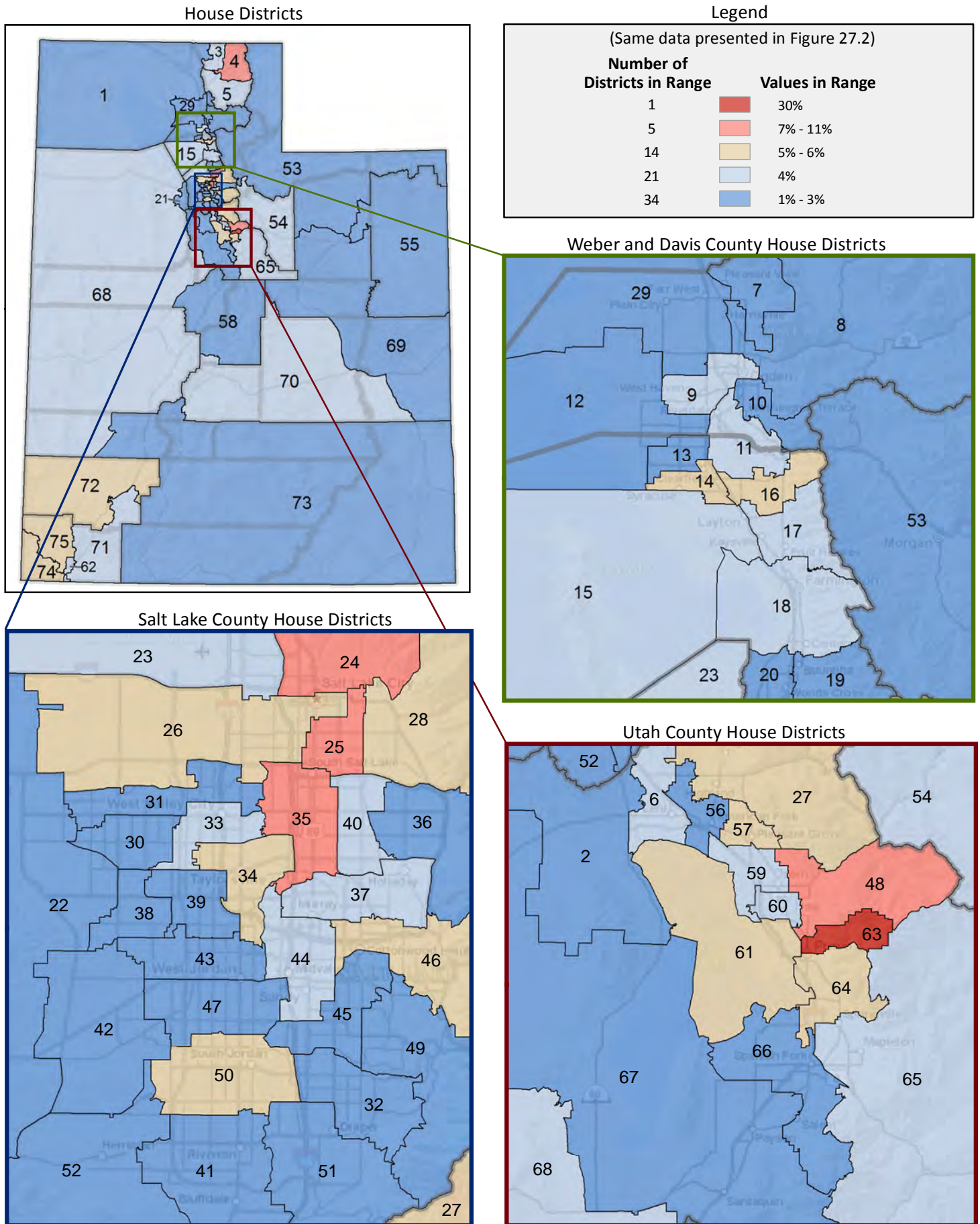


Figure 28.1 - VACANCY RATES

 (Categories are mutually exclusive and sum to 100%)

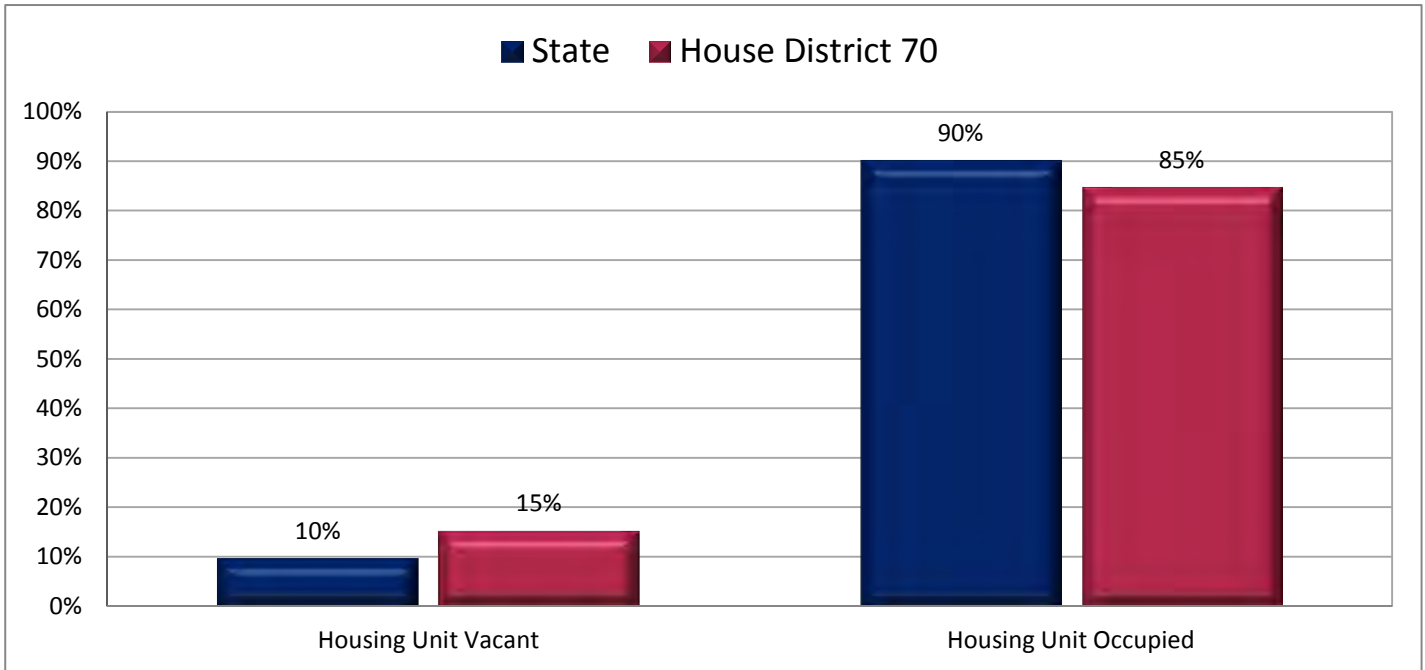
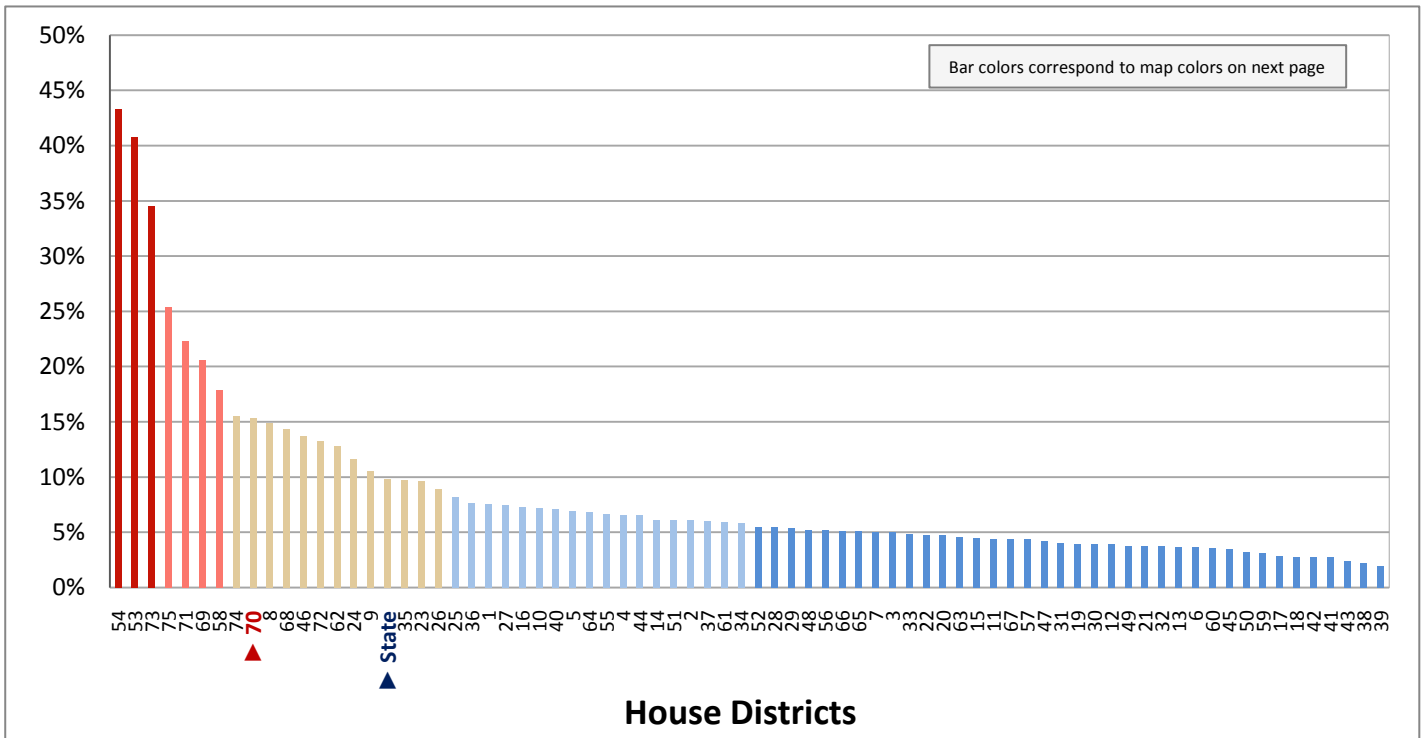


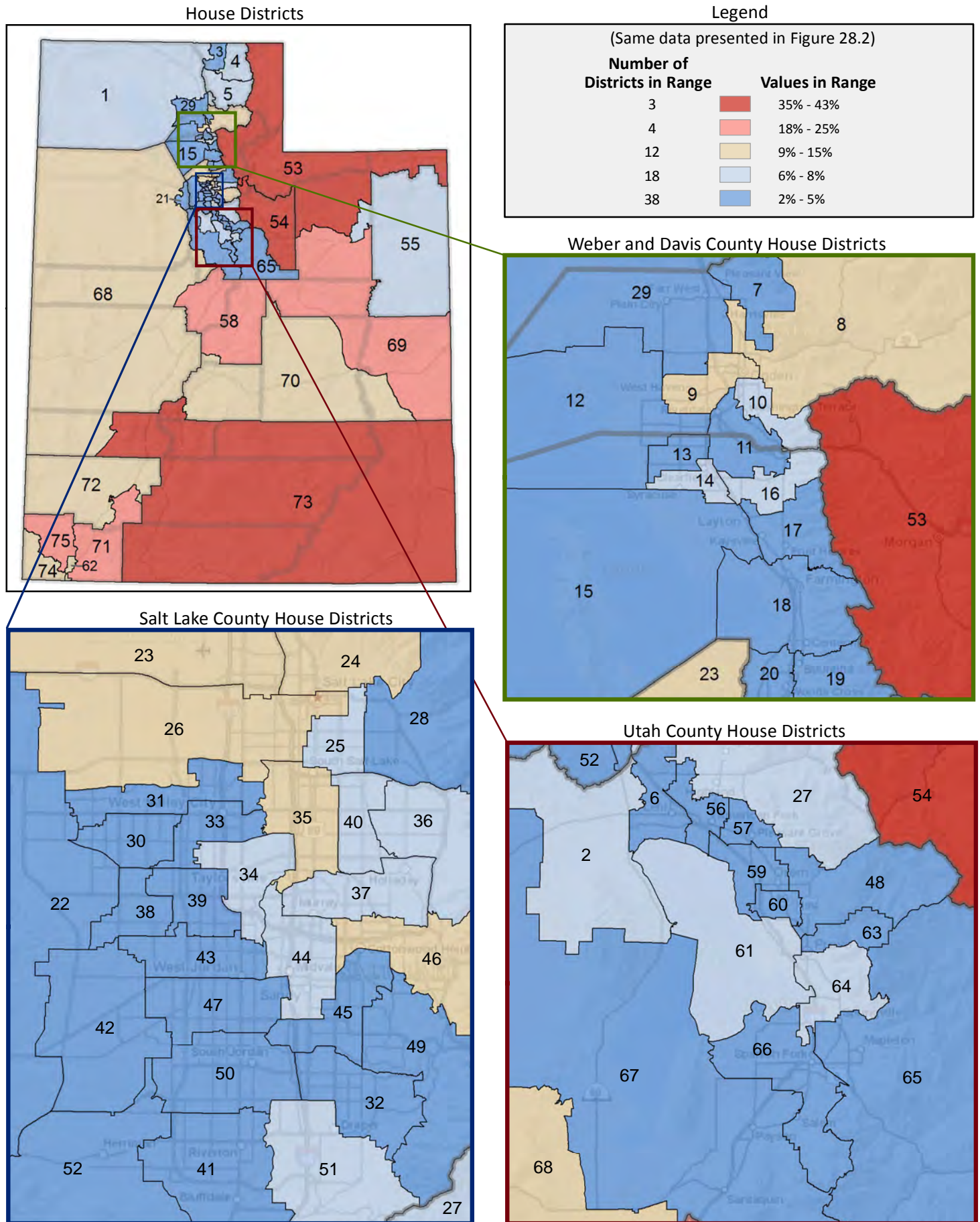
Figure 28.2 - VACANCY RATES
