SPECIAL GROUP LICENSE PLATE REVISIONS

1. Page 11, Lines 328-334: Delete lines 328 through 334 and insert
"(3) (a) A sponsoring organization that qualifies for tax-exempt status under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c) may request the commission to authorize a new type of special group license plate for the sponsoring organization. The sponsoring organization shall:
(i) collect a minimum of 200 applications; and
(ii) pay a start-up fee established under Section 63-38-3.2 for production and administrative costs for providing the new type of special group license plates.
(b) If the provisions of Subsection (3)(a) are met, the commission shall approve the request and the division shall:
(i) design a license plate in accordance with Section 41-1a-419;
and
(ii) issue the new type of special group license plates."

2. Page 18, Line 543: Delete "or" and after "clean fuel" insert ", or special group license plates approved under Subsection 41-1a-418(3)"

3. Page 19, Lines 560-561: Delete "or" and after "radio operator" insert ", or special group license plates approved under Subsection 41-1a-418(3)"
