2. Housing State Inmates in County Jails

Utah Code Section 64-13e-106 requires the Utah Department of Corrections to report annually regarding the incarceration rate, the participating counties, the number of state inmates housed by each county, the number of probation inmates housed by each county, and the number of parole inmates housed by each county.

5. Crisis Intervention Team Training

In 2001, the Department of Substance Abuse and Mental Health, the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) Utah, and the Salt Lake City Police Department partnered to provide Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training for uniformed patrol officers who volunteer to participate. CIT officers maintain their responsibilities as patrol officers while becoming primary responders in mental health crisis situations. CIT had received, through Utah State University, a one-time training grant that is no longer available. The Legislature appropriated \$118,700 in ongoing General Funds for FY 2012 to fund this program.
