Utah Code Ann. Subsection 58-17b-309.5 requires the Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing to report to the committee by November 30, 2012, and by November 30, 2013, on its evaluation of Pharmacy Practice Act exemptions related to

certain acts and practices involving contact lenses, cosmetic drugs, injectable weight loss drugs, and cancer drugs. The evaluation is required to address:

- "(i) practitioner compliance with the requirements of this section and Section 58-17b-309;*
- (ii) current research on dispensing and patient safety;*
- (iii) survey of other state dispensing laws; and*
- (iv) recommendations for future action concerning practitioner dispensing."*

The Committee will receive the Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing's report and recommendations.
