5 **LONG TITLE**

6 **General Description:**

7 This bill requires an institution of higher education to award credit to a person who has  
8 completed a law enforcement basic training course.

9 **Highlighted Provisions:**

10 This bill:

- 11 ▶ requires the Peace Officers Standards and Training Division to provide certain
- 12 information on credits to a person who completes basic training and passes a
- 13 certification examination;
- 14 ▶ defines terms; and
- 15 ▶ requires certain institutions of higher education to award credit to a person who
- 16 completes a law enforcement basic training course and passes a certification
- 17 examination.

28 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

29 Section 1. Section **53-6-205** is amended to read:

30 **53-6-205. Completion of training course required -- Persons affected --**

31 **Notification of credit eligibility.**

32 (1) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (2), before a person may be certified as a

33 peace officer in Utah the person shall:

34 (i) successfully complete the basic training course at a certified academy;

35 (ii) pass the certification examination; and

36 (iii) pass a physical fitness test.

37 (b) A person may not exercise peace officer authority until certified.

38 (2) Subsection (1) applies only to persons not previously certified and who receive  
39 their first employment appointment or election as a peace officer in Utah on or after January 1,  
40 1985.

41 (3) The division shall inform a person who meets the requirements of Subsections  
42 (1)(a)(i) and (ii) that the person is eligible for credit at certain institutions of higher education  
43 in accordance with Section 53B-16-109.

44 Section 2. Section **53B-16-109** is enacted to read:

45 **53B-16-109. Credit for peace officer training -- Transferability.**

46 (1) As used in this section:

47 (a) "Basic training course" means the basic training described in Section 53-6-202.

48 (b) "Certification examination" means the certification examination described in  
49 Section 53-6-205.

50 (c) "Certified academy" means the same as that term is defined in Section 53-6-102.

51 (2) (a) Subject to Subsection (2)(b), a person who completes a basic training course at a  
52 certified academy and passes the certification examination shall, except as provided in  
53 Subsection (2)(c), receive 18 credits at an institution of higher education listed in Section  
54 53B-3-102 in which the person is enrolled.

55 (b) An institution of higher education shall award the credits described in Subsection  
56 (2)(a) if:

57 (i) the institution of higher education offers a program in criminal justice or a similar  
58 program; and

59 (ii) the person's declared major is in criminal justice or a similar program.

60 (c) A person may request to receive fewer credits.

61 (3) If a person described in Subsection (2)(a) transfers to another institution of higher  
62 education, and the receiving institution offers a criminal justice or a similar program, the  
63 receiving institution shall award 18 credits to the person if the person transfers to and declares

64 a major in criminal justice or a similar program at the receiving institution.

65 (4) The board shall adopt rules in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 4,

66 Administrative Procedures Act, consistent with this section for its implementation and

67 administration.

68 (5) This section does not apply to a person for whom the basic training course was

69 waived under Section 53-6-206.
