



33 (d) one representative of the Utah League of Cities and Towns;  
34 (e) one representative of the Utah Association of Counties; and  
35 (f) two members of the general public representing the business community in the  
36 state.

37 (2) (a) The speaker of the House of Representatives shall designate one of the members  
38 appointed under Subsection (1)(b) to serve as cochair of the task force.

39 (b) The president of the Senate shall designate one of the members appointed under  
40 Subsection (1)(c) to serve as cochair of the task force.

41 (3) (a) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum.

42 (b) The action of a majority of a quorum constitutes the action of the task force.

43 (4) (a) Salaries and expenses of the members of the task force who are legislators shall  
44 be paid in accordance with Section 36-2-2 and Legislative Joint Rules, Title 5, Chapter 3,  
45 Legislator Compensation.

46 (b) A member of the task force who is not a legislator may not receive compensation  
47 for the member's work associated with the task force, but may receive per diem and  
48 reimbursement for travel expenses incurred as a member of the task force at the rates  
49 established by the Division of Finance under Sections 63A-3-106 and 63A-3-107.

50 (5) The Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel and the Office of the  
51 Legislative Fiscal Analyst shall provide staff support to the task force.

52 (6) The task force shall review and make recommendations on the following issues:

53 (a) developing an electronic database for all state-collected data on a person doing  
54 business in the state that is:

55 (i) centralized;

56 (ii) secure; and

57 (iii) interconnected; and

58 (b) developing a single sign-on web portal that allows a person doing business in the  
59 state to access all relevant state-collected business data on the person, including information  
60 related to:

61 (i) business registration;

62 (ii) worker's compensation;

63 (iii) tax liability;

64 (iv) occupational health and safety inspections; and  
65 (v) other information collected by the state that the task force determines is relevant to  
66 a person doing business in state.

67 (7) The recommendations for developing the electronic database described in  
68 Subsection (6)(a) and the single sign-on web portal described in Subsection (6)(b) shall  
69 include:

70 (a) a recommendation for the electronic database's and single sign-on web portal's:

71 (i) technical specifications;

72 (ii) data security measures;

73 (iii) data ownership by participating state and local entities;

74 (iv) administration; and

75 (v) governance;

76 (b) a plan for an open API that provides for access to the single sign-on web portal or  
77 electronic database by participating state and local entities;

78 (c) a method for allowing optional participation by a political subdivision of the state  
79 in the electronic database and the single sign-on web portal;

80 (d) the projected cost of developing and maintaining the electronic database and the  
81 single-sign on web portal, and any available sources of funding; and

82 (e) a projection for how the electronic database and the single sign-on database could  
83 be eventually adapted to include data about individuals that is collected by the state.

84 (8) The task force shall report to the Public Utilities and Technology Interim  
85 Committee:

86 (a) no later than November 30, 2016, with:

87 (i) an initial description of the task force's findings; and

88 (ii) a master plan for development of the electronic database and the single sign-on web  
89 portal, including proposed legislation if necessary to accomplish the task-force's objective; and

90 (b) no later than November 30, 2017, with a final report that describes the progress  
91 made in completing the master plan described in Subsection (8)(a)(ii) and any remaining  
92 obstacles.

93 Section 2. **Repeal date.**

94 This bill is repealed on July 1, 2018.
