Chair Millner called the meeting to order at 2:13 p.m.

1. S.B. 35 Veterans Tuition Gap Program Act Amendments (Escamilla (Robles), L.)

Sen. Luz Escamilla presented the bill with the assistance of Mr. Gary Harder.

MOTION: Sen. Iwamoto moved to amend S.B. 35 with Amendment #1.

- 1. Page 2, Lines 47 through 54:
 - 47 (2) "Institution of higher education" or "institution" means [a]:
 - 48 [(a) credit-granting higher education institution within the state system of higher
 - 49 education; or]
 - 50 [(b) an institution of higher learning, as defined in the federal program, that is located
 - 51 in the state.]
 - 52 (a) an institution of higher education listed in Subsection 53B-2-101(1); or
 - 53 (b) a private, nonprofit, postsecondary institution { <u>headquarterd</u> <u>located</u> in Utah that is
 - 54 <u>accredited by a regional accrediting organization</u> {<u>that the board recogniz</u>} <u>recognized by the United States Department of Education</u>.
- 2. Page 2, Line 56 through Page 3, Line 66:
 - 56 (4) (a) "Qualifying military veteran" means a veteran, as defined in Section 68-3-12.5,
 - 57 who:
 - 58 (I) is a resident student under Section 53B-8-102 and rules of the board;
 - 59 (ii) is accepted into an institution and enrolled in a program leading to a bachelor's
 - 60 degree;

- 61 [(iii) has qualified for the federal program;]
- 62 [(iv)] (iii) (A) has [maximized] exhausted the federal benefit under [the] a federal
- 63 program; <u>or</u>
- 65 <u>federal program;</u> and
- 66 [(v)] (iv) has not completed a bachelor's degree.
- 3. Page 3, Lines 70 through 74:
 - 70 There is established a Veterans Tuition Gap Program to serve qualifying military
 - 71 veterans with tuition assistance at institutions of higher education when:
 - 72 (1) federal benefits under the federal program [are no longer] have been exhausted or
 - 73 <u>are not</u> available; and
 - 74 (2) a qualifying military veteran has not finished a bachelor's degree <u>and is in the</u> <u>final year of a bachelor's degree program</u>.

The motion passed with a vote of 5-0-2.

Voting in the affirmative were: Sen. Millner, Sen. Adams, Sen. Henderson, Sen. Hillyard L, Sen. Iwamoto Absent or not voting were: Sen. Stephenson.

 - 53 (b) a private, nonprofit, postsecondary institution headquartered in Utah that is
 - 54 <u>accredited by a</u> <u>recognized</u> <u>accrediting organization that the board</u> recognizes.
 - 55 (3) "Program" means the Veterans Tuition Gap Program created in this chapter.

Ms. Renae Cowley, Lobbyist, spoke in favor of the bill.

3. S.B. 60 School District Amendments (Davis, G.)

4. S.B. 61 Students with Disabilities Accommodations Funding (Davis, G.)

Ms. Angie Stallings, Deputy Superintendent, Utah State Board of Education spoke to the bill.

Mr. Andrew Riggle, Disability Law Center, spoke to the bill.

5. S.B. 49 Purpose of Minimum School Program (Fillmore, L.)

6. S.B. 64 Student Scholarship Amendments (Fillmore, L.)

MOTION: Sen. Iwamoto moved to pass S.B. 64 out favorably. The motion passed with a vote of 4-0-3.

7. S.B. 80 School Funding Amendments (Fillmore, L.)

MOTION: Sen. Stephenson moved to amend S.B. 80 with Amendment #1.

- 2. Page 15, Lines 433 through 435:
 - 433 accordance with this section by a local school board.
 - 434 (2) (a) A local school board shall impose or modify a voted local levy on { real -} property
 - 435 <u>located in the school district of the local school board if a majority of the electors of the</u> school
