(4) Bigamy is a secondary offense and may only be prosecuted if one or more of the following is a primary charge:

(a) inducing marriage under false pretenses;

(b) fraud;

(c) domestic abuse;

(d) child abuse;

(e) sexual abuse;

(f) human trafficking; or

(g) human smuggling.

(5) If a person is convicted of bigamy and any offense under Subsection (4), the penalty for both offenses shall be enhanced by one degree.
