The Commission, which is preparing to complete its work June 30, will report on its accomplishments, unfinished business, and suggestions for future development of health policy.

The Legislature has given the Utah Health Policy Commission the following charge:

...The commission is the structured entity in this state through which all public and private entities that are involved and affected by health care reform communicate, debate, and develop solutions to resolve policy issues. The commission shall:

- (1)      develop, coordinate, and make recommendations to the Legislature and the governor for market oriented health reform;
- (2)      coordinate policy development between the various state agencies and institutions that finance, provide, or regulate the delivery and financing of health care;
- (3)      coordinate with and seek the involvement of private sector efforts to finance, provide, or regulate the delivery and financing of health care; and
- (4)      serve as the primary conduit for gubernatorial and legislative leadership in the area of health care reform. (Section 63C-3-101)

It is the goal of the commission that health system reform in Utah will provide a mechanism through which every Utahn will have access to affordable health insurance in an environment that relies primarily on a market-oriented system that contains cost and enhances quality. (Section 63C-3-102)
