**1. Call to Order**

Chair Eastman called the meeting to order at 9:10 a.m.

**2. Committee Business**

**H.B. 191      *Predatory Mortgage Lending (P. Ray)***

Rep. Ray introduced the bill.

MOTION: Rep. King moved to recommend the bill be sent to a standing committee. The motion passed unanimously with Sen. Bramble, Sen. Davis, and Rep. Morgan absent for the vote.

**S.B. 55      *Amendments to Utah Uniform Building Standards Act (P. Hellewell)***

   This act takes effect on July 1, 2003."

MOTION: Sen. Davis moved to recommend that the Rules Committee amend the bill as previously moved and send the bill to the floor calendar. The motion passed unanimously with Sen. Eastman, Rep. King, and Rep. Parker absent for the vote.

**S.B. 109            Licensing of Genetic Counselors Technical Amendments (P. Julander)**
