2. Masking of Convictions for Commercial Driver Licensees

Federal law requires that states not "mask" or defer imposition of judgment on commercial drivers who have violated state and local traffic laws. Failure to comply with the provision will result in a loss of federal transportation funds. States have until September of this year to resolve the problem, but penalties will not be imposed until one year after a state is found in violation; therefore, the state has the 2006 Annual General Session to fix the problem.
