# ISSUE BRIEF

## **SUMMARY**

Utah Code Annotated, Section 63J-5-201, states: "The Legislative Fiscal Analyst shall submit a federal funds request summary for each agency to the legislative appropriations subcommittee responsible for that agency's budget for review during each annual general session. Each legislative appropriations subcommittee shall review the federal funds request summary and may recommend that the agency accept the federal funds or participate in the federal program for the fiscal year under consideration; or recommend that the agency not accept the federal funds or participate in the federal funds or participate in the federal funds of \$1,439,009,200 in for FY 2010 and \$1,333,556,800 in FY 2011. Federal stimulus money (ARRA) is discussed in a separate Issue Brief entitled: "*ARRA Funds Approval.*"

## **DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS**

In FY 2010, the Department of Health will administer 85 grants providing \$1,439,009,200 federal funds, of which 8 are in the Medicaid/CHIP programs. The 77 non-Medicaid grants will bring in a total of \$106,228,100 federal funds at a cost of \$11,046,000 in State funds of which \$4,142,300 is from the General Fund. The 8 Medicaid/CHIP grants will bring in a total of \$1,332,781,100 federal funds at a cost of \$506,319,100 in State funds of which \$241,340,400 is from the General Fund. The General Fund used to draw down these federal funds represents 100% of the Medicaid and CHIP budget and an additional 12% of the remaining Department of Health budget, as compared to the original General Fund appropriation for FY 2010. The Department of Health anticipates passing through 62% of the federal funds received from non-Medicaid grants to non-State entities. Some of the largest recipients of pass-thru from the Department of Health are private health care providers, the Department of Human Services, the University of Utah, and the State's 12 local health departments. In FY 2011, the Department of Health will administer 75 grants providing \$1,333,556,800 federal funds, of which 7 are in the Medicaid/CHIP programs. The 68 non-Medicaid grants will bring in a total of \$103,395,000 federal funds at a cost of \$11,421,500 in State funds of which \$4,298,200 is from the General Fund. The 7 Medicaid/CHIP grants will bring in a total of \$1,230,161,800 federal funds at a cost of \$554,658,800 in State funds of which \$292,613,900 is from the General Fund.

## COMMUNITY AND FAMILY HEALTH SERVICES FY 2011 (CONT.)

As per UCA 63J-5-201 the subcommittee has at least the following three options:

- 1. "Recommend that the agency accept the federal funds or participate in the federal program for the fiscal year under consideration"
- 2. "Recommend that the agency not accept the federal funds or participate in the federal program for the fiscal year under consideration."
- 3. Direct the agency to accept some, but not all of the federal funds listed above

As per UCA 63J-7-102 through 63J-7-203 grants received after this approval process by the subcommittee that meet any of the following 3 criteria must be approved by the Executive Appropriations Committee:

- 1. More than \$50,000
- 2. Add permanent or part-time employees
- 3. Require any State match

## **LEGISLATIVE ACTION**

• The Analyst recommends that the Committee direct the Department of Health to accept all federal funds as listed above.
