A. ITEMS FROM THE MASTER STUDY RESOLUTION

1. Alcohol Law.
2. Alcoholic Beverage Control Act Fees - to study whether tiered fees under the Alcoholic Beverage Control Act for the renewal of full-service restaurant licenses should be modified to a flat fee.
3. Building Energy Codes - to study the 2009 International Energy Conservation Code (IECC) amendments for both residential and commercial buildings and review the 2012 IECC.
4. Commercial Breeders - to study issues related to commercial breeder regulations (H.B. 124).
5. Condominiums - to study amendments to current law governing condominiums (H.B. 117).
6. Construction Trades - to study amendments to the Utah Construction Trades Licensing Act (S.B. 182).
7. Fit Premises - to study modifications to the Utah Fit Premises Act (S.B. 154).
8. In-House Financing Credit Reporting Requirements - to study whether to require companies that do in-house financing, including payday lenders, to report to the three major credit reporting agencies.
9. Independent Contractors - to study and review independent contractor classifications.
10. Mobile Home Park Law - to study changes to the Mobile Home Park Residency Act.
11. Moving the Division of Securities - to study whether to move the Division of Securities into the Insurance Department.
12. Non-Compete Contracts - to study non-compete contracts between employers and employees, how broad their potential scope may be, and whether the state's

current statutory process makes it impossible for an employee who has been RIF'd to find gainful employment.

13. Sampling of Alcoholic Beverages - to study the sampling of alcoholic beverages by retail licensees (S.B. 81).
14. State-owned Liquor Stores - to study the privatization of state-owned liquor stores.
15. Wages - to study prevailing wages and the effect they have on the economy.
16. Workers' Compensation Insurance - to study workers' compensation insurance for children working under a parent's direction.
17. Online Public and Legal Notices - to study and review ways to simplify and centralize online public and legal notices and make a report of findings to the Business and Labor Interim Committee.
18. Disclosure of [debt] after dissolution of a business.
19. Repeal of licensure required for eyelash extension, hair braiding, and nail painting (H.B. 430).

D. OTHER POSSIBLE REPORTS AND STUDIES

The Legislature adopted the following intent language in 2011 General Session S.B. 3:

"The Legislature intends that the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control shall use the \$100,000 appropriated in this item to hire a consultant to develop a business plan that minimizes costs while maximizing profits. The Department shall consider all relevant factors in arriving at unbiased recommendations, such as: demand price elasticity, proximity analysis, demand shifting, customer service, monopoly considerations, demographics and products offered. The Department shall report to the Business, Economic Development and Labor Appropriations Subcommittee during the 2011 Interim."

If desired, the Business and Labor Interim Committee could also receive this report.
