

THE POWER OF SHARING

Opt in to the cHIE (Clinical Health Information Exchange) to allow your healthcare professionals to access your secure medical information (medical history, prescriptions, allergies, immunization records, etc.). It could save your life in an emergency. It could also save you money by preventing duplicate tests and labs. Opting in will also allow your healthcare professionals to disclose or share your medical information with other organizations for treatment purposes. Give your doctors another tool for effective and efficient care by choosing to participate in the cHIE.

Consent Options:

PARTICIPATE: I give consent to share and allow access to my medical records to participating healthcare professionals through the cHIE.

By choosing this option I assert that I have spoken with my adult dependents and confirmed their desire to share their medical information with health providers through the cHIE. I understand that adult dependents may individually change this election to participate in the cHIE at any time.

LIMITED: I give consent to share and allow access to my medical records to participating healthcare professionals through the cHIE only in an emergency.

I understand that adult dependents may individually change this election to participate in the cHIE at any time.

NOT-PARTICIPATE: I don't want to participate.



KEY PPACA PROVISIONS

- » Immediate

NFIB V. SEBELIUS

- » Court has jurisdiction to hear the case because mandate is a “penalty” for standing analysis.
- » Individual mandate is a tax and thus constitutional on that ground and not the commerce clause.
- » Medicaid expansion is an unconstitutional burden without a *PEHP*

STATE RISK POOL

» No Impact for Medicaid Expansion or Individual Mandate.

» 1.75% Increase or \$4.7 Million for Implemented Provisions:
