SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND MENTAL HEALTH – PERFORMANCE MEASURES

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ISSUE BRIEF

SUMMARY

As part of a Human Services In-depth Budget Review (found at <u>http://le.utah.gov/interim/2010/pdf/00001613.pdf</u>), the Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health reported a six year history of performance measures and benchmarking information (when available). The division has updated this information and included two additional years. An eight year history of measures is included in the appendix. This brief highlights changes from information presented a year ago and identifies measures that have improved or declined by more than 5 percent.

LEGISLATIVE ACTION

No Legislative action is required. This brief is presented for informational purposes only.

HUMAN SERVICES OVERALL GOALS

As part of its FY 2014 budget submission, the Department of Human Services provided the following four departmentwide goals:

- collaborate with community partners and within the Department on issues that cut across divisions
- maintain and improve transparency regarding Department finances and operations in the community
- foster creativity, innovation and adoption of best models and practices
- improve outcomes and results by using measures which lead to good decisions that drive success

ANALYSIS OF SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND MENTAL HEALTH PERFORMANCE MEASURES

The Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health (DSAMH) has made no changes to the measures it presented in the 2012 General Session.

DSAMH measures showing greater than 5% improvement

#6 – Community Mental Health Services – Preadmission Screening and Resident Review – # of screenings (+20%)

- **#12** *Residential Mental Health Services* # of children placed in community from State Hospital (+8%)
- #23 Utah State Hospital # of pediatric patients treated (+8%)
- #35 State Substance Abuse Services % increase in abstinence from admission to discharge from alcohol (+5%)
- #35 State Substance Abuse Services % increase in abstinence from admission to discharge from drugs (+31%)
- #40 Drug Court Program # of clients receiving services as of June 30th (+19%)
- #44 Drug Court Program increase in employment rates between admission and discharge (+22%)

When a patient's outcome score has surpassed both the score required for reliable change and the cut score between inpatient and community care, they are considered to be "recovered." The Youth Outcome Questionnaire (YOQ) is a self-report measure for youth. This outcome measure is a national measure and can be utilized to compare to inpatient or community mental health centers that employ the same instrument. The reliable change index for the YOQ is >10 to be statistically significant
