I. Why do we need this funding?

- To address unmet needs of victims and children

Stakeholders Addressing Unmet Needs

- UDVC is the federally recognized victim advocacy non-profit organization
- DHS currently contracts with 13 private victim service providers to serve victims of domestic violence

Service Providers are at Capacity

- Domestic violence victim service providers have increased the amount of victims services by 41.1% over the past five years;
- Due to lack of capacity, unmet need increased 67% during the same period of time.

II. How will the funds be spent?

- Current building block request of additional \$693,500 ongoing for victim services
- Any additional funding appropriated in SFY15 to be divided equally among 13 private victim service providers (approximately \$53,300 each)
- This funding will be subject to the terms of the contracts administered by DCFS; prioritized for supportive services that promote safety and stability for victims of domestic violence.
- DCFS audits all contracted victim service providers annually for contractual and budgetary compliance

III. Outcomes Measures: How will we track our progress?

- NOW: SFY14, Performance measurement of shelter nights=immediate safety
- □ PLAN: SFY15, quantitative and qualitative outcomes including:
 - Shelter nights=immediate safety
 - Supportive services=improvements in safety and quality of life for victims and children
