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- Medicaid has many provider types (over 30 provider types)
- There are many types of reimbursement
- Not all providers are compensated the same
- Some reimbursement levels are dependent upon provider assessments or intergovernmental transfers (IGTs)

- Hospitals
- Medical Professionals (physicians, dentists, etc.)
- Accountable Care Organizations
- Pharmacies
- Skilled Nursing Facilities
- Community-Based Providers
- Community Health Centers

- Fee-For-Service Payments
- Prospective Payment Systems
- Capitated Payments
- Supplemental Payments
- Some reimbursements are dependent upon provider assessments or “seeding”
- Cost-based reimbursements
- Maximum Allowable Costs

- Upper Payment Limit (UPL)
- Prospective Payment System
