

## **2014 FEDERAL EQUITABLE SHARING REPORT**

The primary mission of the federal government's forfeiture program is law enforcement -- to deter crime by depriving criminals of the profits and proceeds of their illegal activities and to weaken criminal enterprises by removing the instrumentalities of crime. Another purpose of the program is to enhance cooperation among federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies through the equitable sharing of federal forfeiture proceeds.


Reporting Period and Process	The period of this report is July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014. Post cards were mailed to all Utah law enforcement agencies and reminder notifications made with specific agencies identified by the U.S. Department of Justice and the U.S. Department of the Treasury as receiving shares of federal asset forfeiture monies and/or property. The reporting information was also posted on CCJJ's webpage.




Reported Use of Shared Funds
