Eligible individuals are provided with services that are personalized to meet their specific needs in achieving a meaningful employment outcome. Examples of VR services include counseling and guidance, disability restoration interventions, assistive technology, training and job placement. The Vocational Rehabilitation program benefits individuals with disabilities who need assistance to obtain or maintain employment and increase their independence. Individuals with disabilities are able to apply for VR services starting at age 14.
