The committee agreed to hear the DUI annual report in the October meeting prior to determining whether to recommend retaining or repealing it.*

*In the May committee meeting, the Driver License Division identified unconventional vehicles as an emerging issue. In the August meeting, the committee directed that legislation be prepared to address the registration and inspection of unconventional vehicles.*
