Specifically, the committee was asked to: study historical data regarding the use of force and lethal use of force by law enforcement officers and whether any reports are available that track police use of force; review training provided to officers; and review the process to investigate incidents of police use of force. The committee will also study the process by which citizens can file complaints if they believe that a peace officer has used excessive force in an interaction with a member of the public.
