Native American Teacher Training Programs

Notable Initiatives in Other States

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US Dept. of Education - Indian Education Professional Development Grants

- Administered by the Office of Indian Education
- Designed to prepare and train Indians to serve as teachers and school administrators
- Awards professional development grants to Institutions of Higher Education (IHEs), Local Education Agencies (LEAs), Other Organizations and/or Agencies, State Education Agencies (SEAs)
- No professional development competition in 2015
 - Reworking current regulations for Indian Education Discretionary Grant Programs

American Indian Teacher Program (AITP) Portland, Oregon

- Portland State University Graduate School of Education in consortia with Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde, the Siletz, the Warm Springs, and the Umatilla
- Provides training and financial assistance for 18 Native American teachers-in-training to teach in schools with high numbers of Native students enrolled
 - Full tuition
 - Health Insurance
 - Annual living stipend
 - Graduate school fees (admission, basic skill test, matriculation, etc.)
 - Licensure costs
- Payback provision to US Dept. of Education
 - Service by teaching at a school serving American Indian/Alaskan Native students OR
 - Repay in cash all funding previously awarded

Minnesota Indian Teacher Training Partnership (MITTP)

- MN § 122A.63 established a grant program to assist American Indians to become teachers
- Offers scholarships and loans to American Indian students pursuing a teaching career at any of four Minnesota institutions:
 - St. Paul/Minneapolis Augsburg College
 - Red Lake Schools Bemidji State University (BSU)
 - Mahnomen Schools Minnesota State University Moorhead (MSUM)
 - Duluth Public Schools University of MN Duluth (UMD)
- Scholarships also available for current school district employees looking for additional certifications
- Future expansion/revisions

Oklahoma Native American Excellence in Education Early Childhood Teacher Project

- Southeastern Oklahoma State University in collaboration with the Choctaw and Chickasaw Nations of Oklahoma
- After graduating, students teach in schools with at least a 5% Native American student population
 - Continued specialized training and support during entire first year of teaching
- Provides support and training for 12 Native American students pursuing degrees in Early Childhood and/or Special Education
 - Full tuition, books, and fees
 - Childcare
 - Laptop
 - Living stipend

Washington Future Native Teachers Initiative Wisdom Seekers Project

- Funded by a grant from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation
- Collaboration between the Washington Education Association, Evergreen State College, and Western Washington Native American Consortium
- 2-day conferences given to provide information, support, and encouragement for Native high school students interested in a career in education
- 2014: 52 student participants
- 2015: 65 student participants

Other Programs

- National Indian Education Association Scholarships
 - Catching the Dream Scholarship Native American Leadership Program
- Teach for America Native Alliance Initiative (NAI)
 - Hawaii, New Mexico, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Twin Cities, and Washington State
 - Launched in 2010 to recruit more educational leaders from Native backgrounds and enhance teaching of Native American curriculum
 - Increase in number of American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian individuals in TFA teaching corps and alumni base from 40 to nearly 200 since 2010
