UTAH TRANSFER OF PUBLIC LANDS LAWS ENACTED SINCE 2012

At a previous meeting, the Commission voted to direct commission staff to prepare a list of Utah laws that address the transfer of public lands. The following is a summary of legislation, enacted since the 2012 General Session, that contain provisions dealing directly with the transfer of federally controlled public lands to the state.
