Sunset Review Process

Purpose:

- 1. Eliminate programs that do not serve a clear public purpose
- 2. Improve existing programs

Responsibility:

- The state agency involved is responsible to seek reauthorization if needed
- An interim committee may review the program and prepare legislation

Process:

- The Legislative Management Committee assigns the interim committees sunset reviews that are due for sunset the following year
- The interim committee chairs decide whether or not to put the sunset reviews on an agenda

Considerations:

- Is the program necessary to the health, safety or welfare?
- Is the program accomplishing its objective?
- Are there ways to improve it?

Options:

The committee can then recommend legislation that:

- 1. Allow the program to expire
- 2. Reauthorize the program (maximum of 10 years)
- 3. Repeal the program
- 4. Remove the program from the sunset act
- 5. <u>Improves</u> the program

Alternatively, the committee can allow the program to expire.

^{**}Note**: The agency overseeing the program is responsible for justifying the need for the program to the interim committee(s).
