## LINKLine

Survivors, friends, family, service providers and other community members can call the Utah Domestic Violence LINKLine for confidential support and resources. The hotline is staffed by trained victim advocates and is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week at 1-800-897-LINK (5465).



## Lethality Assessment Program

The LAP involves an assessment by law enforcement and other first responders to determine a survivor's level of risk and, if risks are identified, provides an immediate connection with community-based victim services. The UDVC can provide training and technical assistance for local law enforcement agencies, victim service providers and other community partners to begin to implement the LAP.



## Emergency Assistance Funds

These funds are available to survivors living in or connected to rural areas who are in need of financial assistance to support their immediate safety and well-being. Immediate relief from abusive situations may include housing costs, transportation, cell phones, food, etc. Applications are made through and with the support of a victim advocate and all applicant's details remain confidential throughout the process.



## Technical Assistance

The UDVC provides technical assistance to a variety of professionals in the state to enable them to provide the best quality service to victims of interpersonal violence. UDVC can support community partners serving survivors of domestic and sexual violence through listening, problem-solving, finding resources, identifying and implementing best practices.



## Education & Training

The UDVC provides training to a variety of professionals in the state to enable them to provide the best quality service to victims of interpersonal violence. The UDVC utilizes its own specialized training team and local experts and partners to deliver training, as well as hosting national partners and technical advisers to ensure that Utah is current with the most recent evidence based approaches and national best practices.



## Public Policy Advocacy

The UDVC works diligently to affect federal, state and local policies and procedures for the benefit of victims and survivors of domestic, sexual or dating violence or stalking and their children. This work includes supporting and promoting legislation that enhances the safety of survivors, researching and analyzing proposed legislation, recommending and advocating for legislative changes and funding, and educating policy-makers, stakeholders and the community on the impacts of domestic and sexual violence.
