


Utah Telehealth Network

- ▶ Serve those, plus state agencies (UDOH, DHS), University of Utah, health systems, behavioral health programs, and others

- ▶ Private secure healthcare network to meet the clinical and operational missions of our members
- ▶ Cyber security management and support
- ▶ An array of media services, including videoconferencing, live streaming, video-on-demand production
- ▶ Telehealth development guidance and support

Recent Initiatives

Network Upgrade & Expansion

- ▶ Support use of Remote Hosted EHRs, health information exchange, meaningful use, and other HIT
- ▶ Increase reliability and redundancy, network speed
- ▶ Utilize UEN's robust backbone and support
- ▶ Utilize Universal Service Healthcare Connect Funding for 65% discounts for eligible healthcare providers

Recent Initiatives

Cyber Security

- ▶ Provide security tools and support to local IT staff, with a focus on prevention.

Recent Initiatives

New State-wide Videoconferencing Platform

- ▶ Easy-to-use, secure, works on mobile devices, compatible with legacy videoconferencing
- ▶ Flexible in its use – suitable for
 - ▶ patient care, connecting to homes and patients, but also to high end videoconferencing units in ERs
 - ▶ Project ECHO, care coordination, training, & meetings

Recent Initiatives

New State-wide Videoconferencing Platform

- ▶ Funded by State of Utah through Medicaid
- ▶ Will be offered to health care providers, large and small.
- ▶ Decentralized model, centralized support
- ▶ Currently in use by early adopters
- ▶ Go live – Fall 2016

Trends in Telehealth

- ▶ Traditional Telehealth still exists
- ▶ Hub & spoke -> Direct to Consumer
- ▶ New models, including Project ECHO, remote monitoring, store-and-forward
- ▶ New providers in the marketplace

Implications of new trends

- ▶ Are there issues of care coordination, standard of practice?
- ▶ New payment models, not “one size fits all”

Coverage & Reimbursement

- ▶ Still the major barrier to adoption, real and perceived. Inconsistent from policy to policy.
- ▶ Consider parity legislation: If covered in person and doable via telehealth, cover and reimburse the same
- ▶ Consider support for innovative models of care delivery

Other

- ▶ Special considerations for rural and small providers
- ▶ Growing burden of IT support, network and other issues from their perspective



GAPS:

Progress

- Medicaid issued a notice in 2015 clarifying CMS guidance on telemedicine coverage. UT will cover physician and NP services delivered via telemedicine. However non-medical mental and behavioral health providers are not included in this coverage.²²¹

Private Insurance

- Bordered by AZ and CO which have parity laws for private insurance. UT has no history of proposed parity legislation within the past 2 years.

Medicaid

- No restrictions imposed on patient or provider settings
- Coverage for skilled nursing services and medication management under the skilled nursing home telemedicine pilot.²²²⁻²²³
- Coverage for interactive audio-video only.

Innovation

- Utah Telehealth Network offers clinical, educational, and administrative services via telemedicine across the state.²²⁴

- Requirements for telemedicine are on par with requirements for in-person services, not including prescribing. No unique practice standard requirements for telemedicine.
- Requires full license and allows P2P exemption.
