
Vote by Mail

Postmark Deadlines for Ballots Updated September 2016



Each state allows citizens to vote by mail, but the laws regarding the dates by which ballots must be mailed or received differ from state to state. This document shows the postmark and ballot receipt deadlines for each state.




Expressly allows Election Day postmark

Expressly requires receipt before Election Day

Generally requires receipt on or before Election Day
