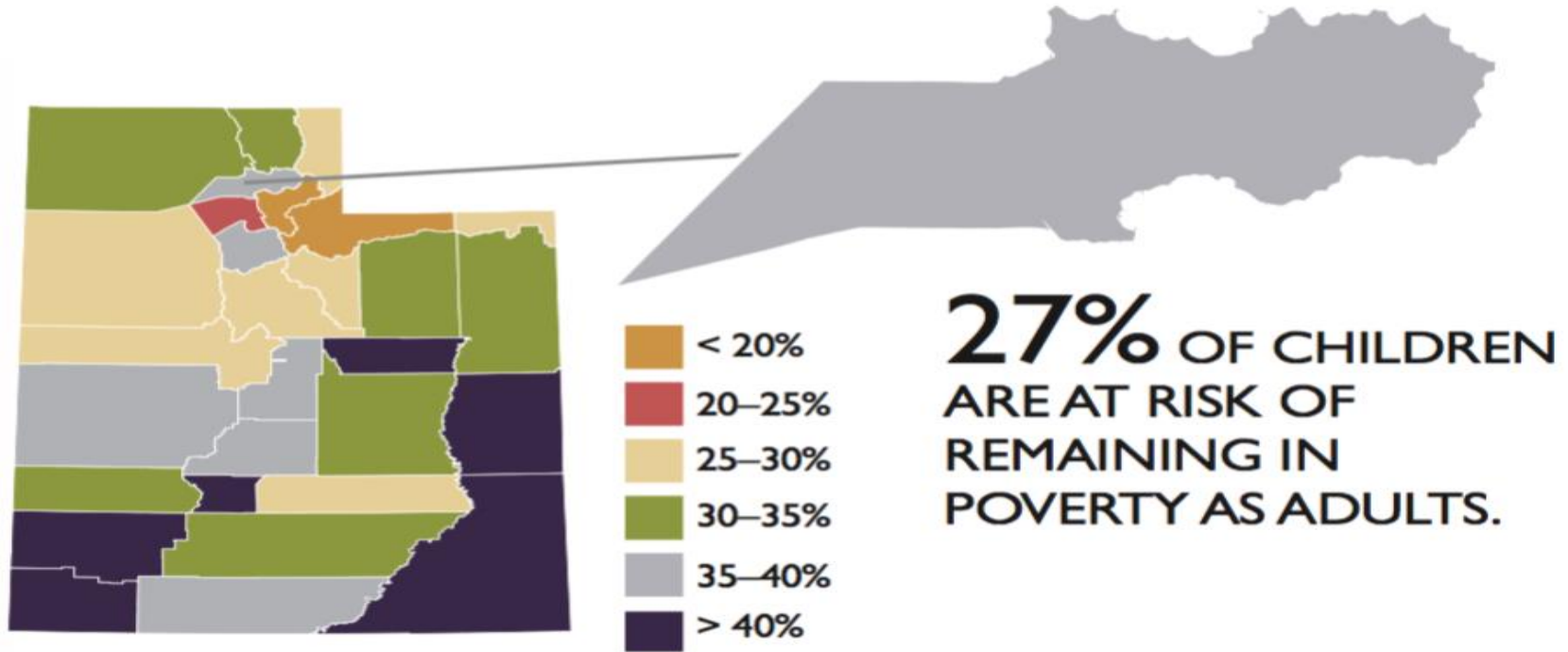

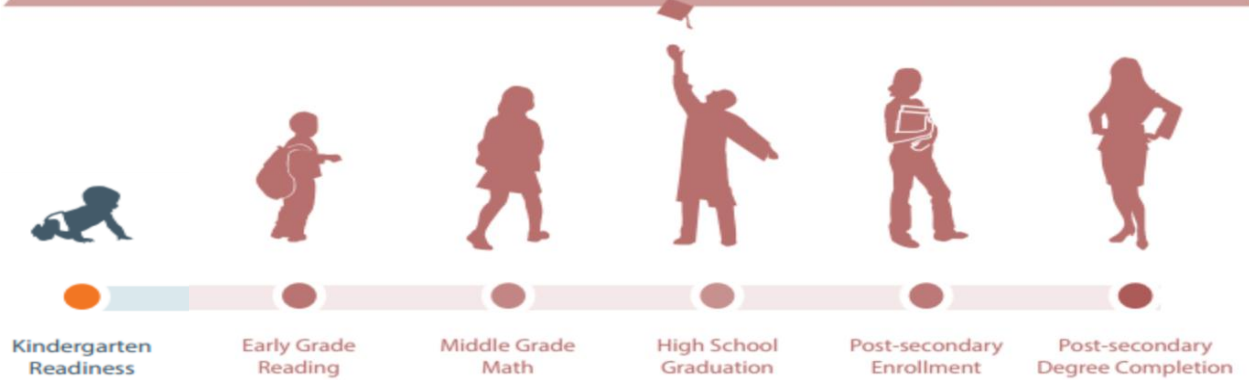

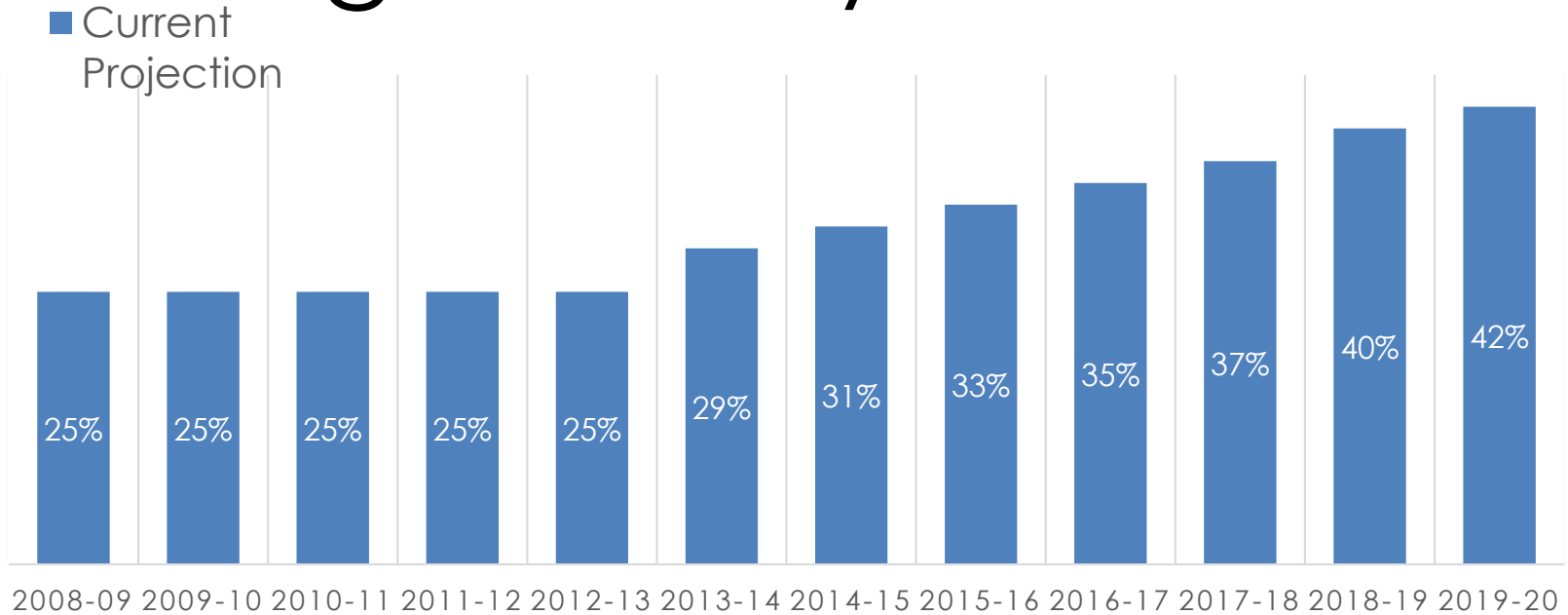

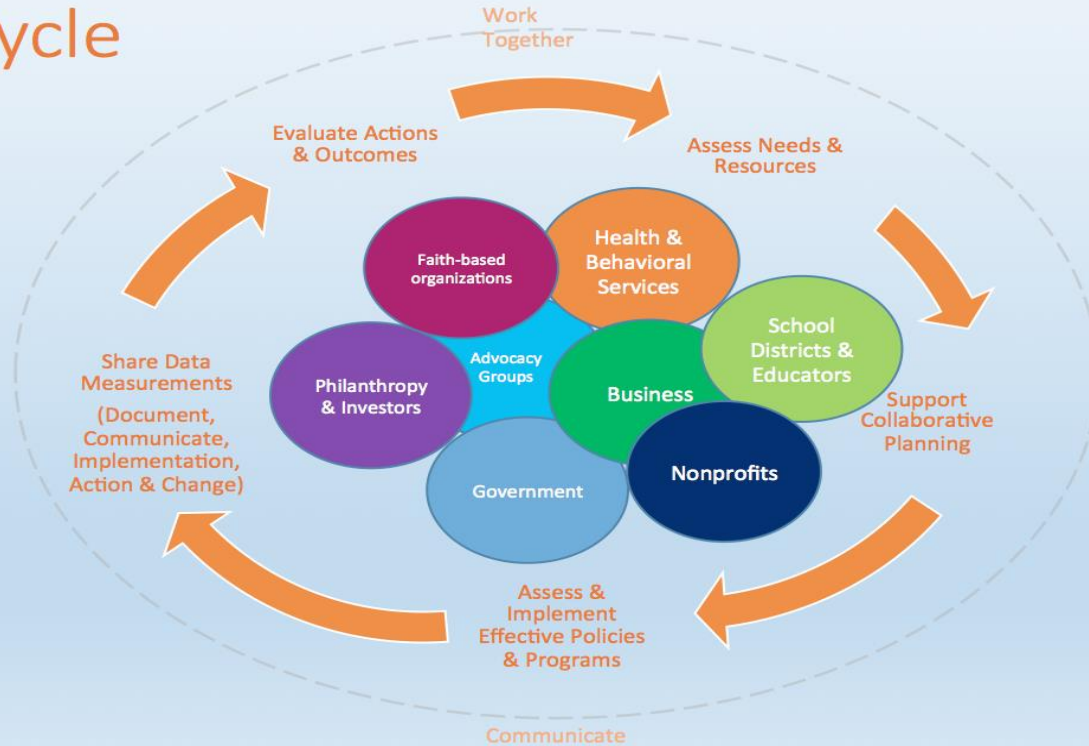
Child-Centric Data-Driven Model



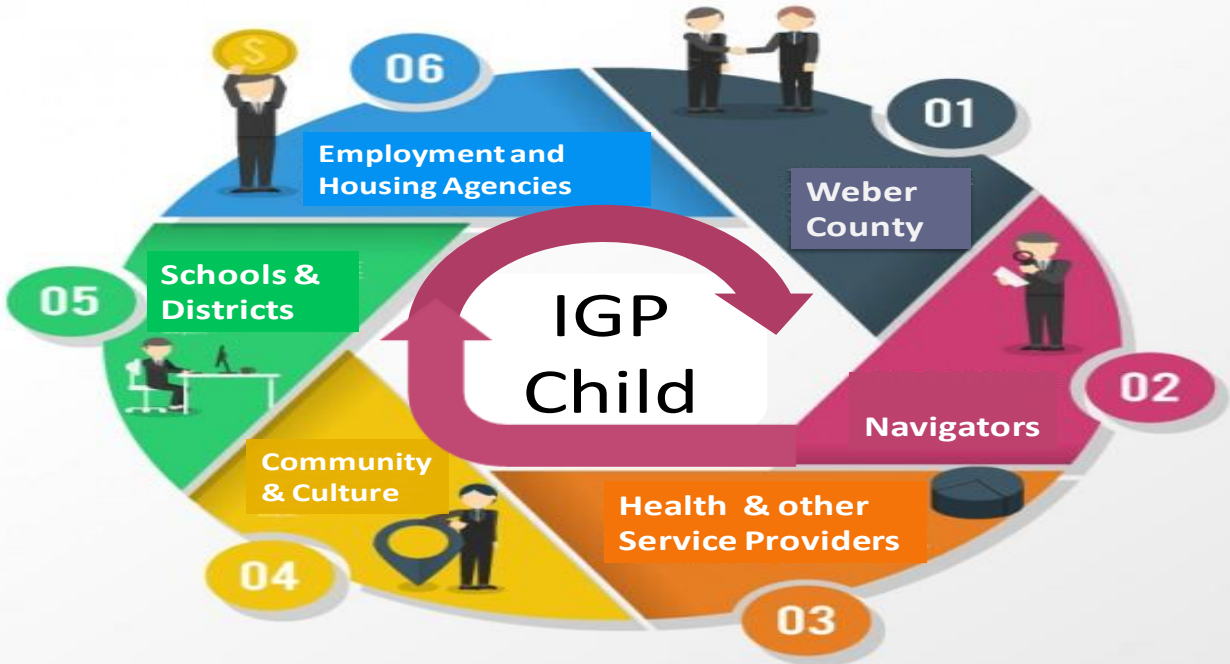
Early childhood
