2. Exemptions from Rulemaking and Ordinances in Violation of State Law

The committee will discuss whether the current exemption in the Administrative Rulemaking Act for state education institutions should remain or be repealed. The committee will discuss remedies to correct local ordinances that violate state law or the state constitution, and a pathway for citizens to complain about local ordinances in violation of state law.

3. Rulewriting Training

The Office of Administrative Rules is the statutory publisher of proposed and effective Utah administrative rules. They provide rulewriting training and make resources available to state agencies that file administrative rules. They will outline the breadth and depth of training they provide to state agencies as it relates to rulewriting and the Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act.
