FY16 At-A-Glance

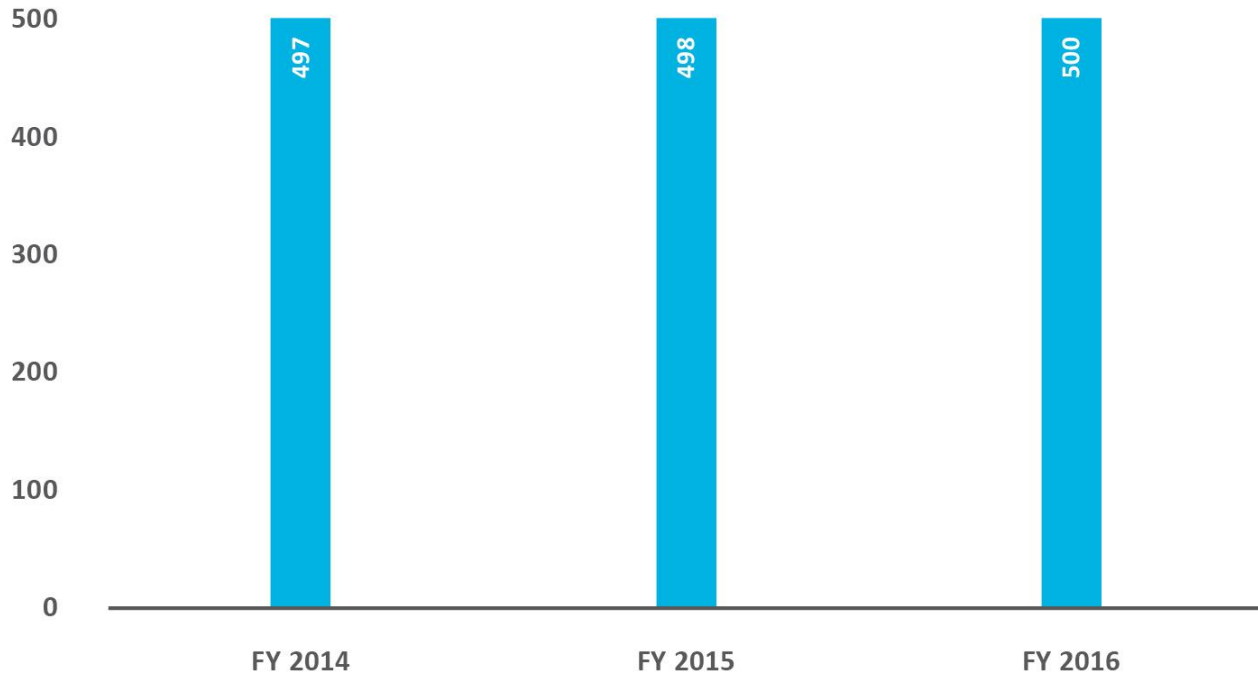
- Co-hosted the Indian Child Welfare Conference in May 2016, which brought together government agencies, tribal leaders, and child welfare advocates.

Governor's Native American Summit Attendance

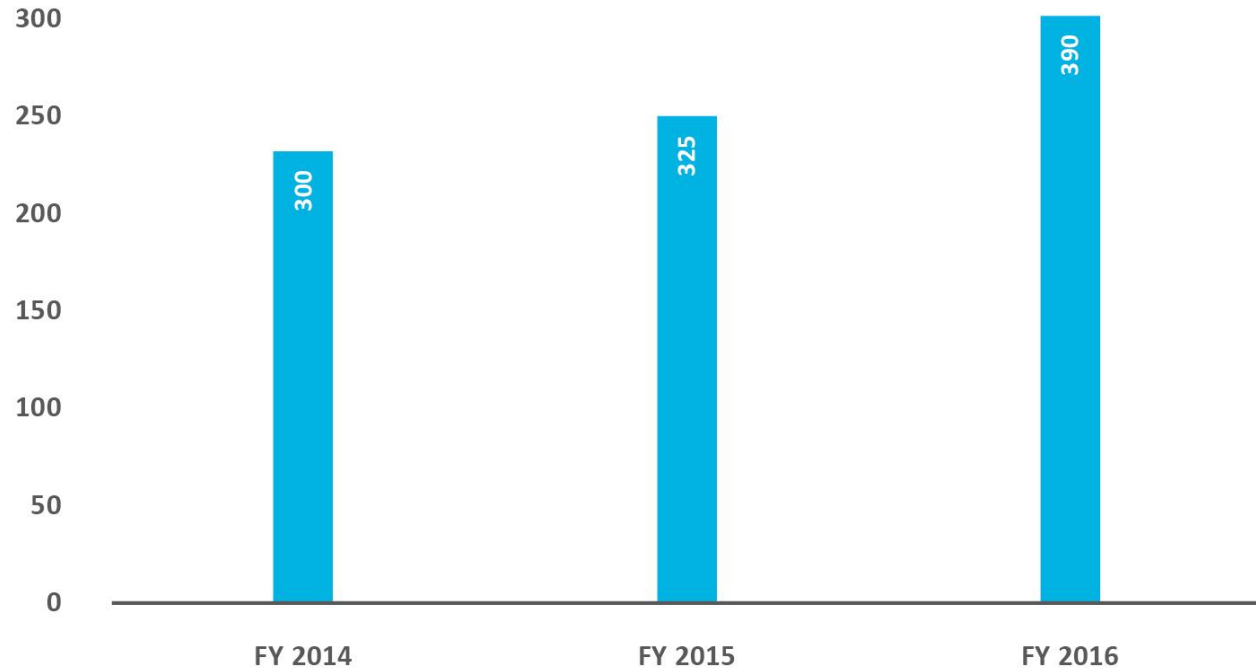

CIRCLEVILLE MASSACRE MONUMENT

- Division of Indian Affairs facilitated meetings between the Paiute Indian Tribe of Utah, Division of State History, and the LDS Church History Department to build a monument honoring the victims of the Circleville Massacre.
- The monument uses the oral histories of the Koosharem band and the ceremony included songs and prayers from tribal members.



NATIVE AMERICAN REMAINS REVIEW COMMITTEE

- Seven members, including four appointed by Indian tribes and three appointed as representatives of repositories.
- Monitors the identification process of human remains.
- Reviews findings about the identity or cultural affiliation of Native American remains or the return of Native American remains.
- Resolves disputes among Indian tribes or lineal descendants and state agencies relating to the return of Native American remains.
- FY16: 26 remains reviewed, 26 remains interred.
