1. Page 10, Line 296 through Page 10a, Line 305:

296 (13) (a) {-Before } Except as provided in Subsection (13)(d), before an agency enacts a rule, the agency shall submit to the appropriations

- 297 subcommittee and interim committee with jurisdiction over the agency the agency's proposed
- 298 <u>rule</u> $\hat{H} \rightarrow \underline{for review} \leftarrow \hat{H}$, if the proposed rule, over a 20-year period, has a fiscal impact of more
- 298a than:

(i) \$2,000,000 to a single person; or

300 (ii) \$50,000,000 to a group of persons.

- 300a $\hat{H} \rightarrow \underline{(b)}$ An appropriations subcommittee or interim committee that reviews a rule
- 300b <u>submitted under Subsection (13)(a) shall:</u>
- 300c (i) before the review, directly inform the chairs of the Administrative Rules
- 300d <u>Review Committee of the coming review, including the date, time, and place of the review; and</u>
- 300e (ii) after the review, directly inform the chairs of the Administrative Rules
