#### 4. H.J.R. 15 Joint Resolution on Military Sexual Trauma (Romero, A.)

Rep. Romero presented the resolution to the committee.

- 1. Page , Line 28 through Page 2, Line 29:
- 28 {WHEREAS, shame and stigma create a barrier to reporting sexual assault in the armed
- 29 forces; }
- 2. Page 2, Lines 41 through 42:
- 41 armed forces, including embarrassment, { fear, and shame and the challenge of separating
- 42 professional and personal duties; } stigma, and fear of retaliation;
- 3. Page 2, Lines 45 through 52:
- 45 {WHEREAS, according to the DOD report, individuals who experience sexual assault
- 46 do not report their assault because they fear retaliation and the lack of confidentially when 47 reported within the chain of command:
- 48 WHEREAS, according to the DOD report, 73% of the women and 44% of the men who
- 49 experienced sexual assault in the past year did not report it because they wanted to forget about
  50 the event and move on;
- 51 WHEREAS, in addition, according to the DOD report, 61% of women and 41% of men
- 52 did not want more people to know about their sexual assault; }

69 violence in the United States Armed Forces.
