List of 2021 Second Special Session Passed Legislation

Legislative Interim Meetings

Meetings were held November, 17, 2021, or as noted

Business and Labor

November 9, 2021

Consumer Privacy in Banking and Financial Transactions

Discussed 2021 Second Special Session legislation,
"Concurrent Resolution Urging Congress and the President
to Protect Consumer Privacy in Banking and Financial
Transactions," which urges Congress and the President to
protect consumers from harmful, invasive, and
burdensome Internal Revenue Service tax information
reporting requirements for financial institutions.

Interlocal Cooperation Act Amendments

Discussed 2021 Second Special Session legislation, "Interlocal Cooperation Act Amendments," which amends provisions related to project entities and taxed interlocal entities.

State Flag Amendments

Discussed 2021 Second Special Session legislation, "State Flag Amendments," which extends the sunset date of the State Flag Task Force for one year. The bill also designates the current state flag as the governor's flag on October 1, 2022.

Unemployment Insurance Rates Amendments

Discussed 2021 Second Special Session legislation, "Unemployment Insurance Rates Amendments," which modifies the Unemployment Insurance Division's calculation of employer contribution rates to the Unemployment Compensation Fund for calendar years 2022, 2023, and 2024.

Workplace COVID-19 Amendments

Discussed 2021 Second Special Session legislation, "Workplace COVID-19 Amendments," which requires an employer to relieve an employee of a COVID-19 vaccination mandate if receiving the vaccine would be injurious to their health and well-being, conflict with religious beliefs, practice, or observance, or conflict with a personal belief. The bill requires an employer to pay for COVID-19 workplace testing and prohibits an adverse action against an employee who claims relief.

November 17, 2021

Cryptocurrency Regulatory Sandbox

Received a <u>presentation</u> from committee staff about the framework for a cryptocurrency regulatory sandbox.

Discussed the identity crisis that cryptocurrency faces and the regulatory environment for establishing a sandbox dedicated to cryptocurrency.

Division of Consumer Protection Amendments

Discussed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Division of Consumer Protection Amendments</u>," which would amend the Business Opportunity Disclosure Act by defining terms and amending provisions regarding:

- filings;
- seller disclosure statements;
- furnishing a disclosure statement to a potential purchaser; and
- enforcement of the Business Opportunity Disclosure Act.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Division of Consumer Protection Amendments" for the 2022 General Session.

Insurance Amendments

Discussed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Insurance Amendments," which would amend provisions in the Insurance Code.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Insurance Amendments."

Licensing Amendments

Discussed draft legislation, "<u>Licensing Amendments</u>," which would modify the process for review of occupational and professional licensing, including repealing the Occupational and Professional Licensure Review Committee Act and creating the Office of Occupational and Professional Licensure Review.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Licensing Amendments."

Occupational and Professional Licensing Modifications

Discussed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Occupational and Professional Licensing Modifications," which would modify provisions related to licensed professionals.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Occupational and Professional Licensing Modifications."

Outdated Reports

Received a <u>presentation</u> from committee staff about the following six expired reporting requirements in statute:

- the Inland Port Authority community enhancement program;
- the cost of insulin manufacturing and factors that determine the price of insulin;
- hospital costs and workers' compensation;
- the effectiveness of the Labor Commission and state law in addressing discrimination in matters of compensation;
- education and training standards for state plumber and electrician apprenticeship programs; and
- the usefulness of the Technology and Commercialization and Innovation Program (TCIP).

Discussed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Business and Labor Reporting Requirements," which would remove the expired reports except for the TCIP report which is addressed in a different bill.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Business and Labor Reporting Requirements."





State Construction Code Amendments

Discussed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "State Construction Code Amendments," which would amend provisions of Title 15A, State Construction and Fire Codes Act. The bill would also create a licensing exemption for a person certified by the National Institute for Certification in Engineering Technologies at level III or IV in Water-Based System Layout or Fire Alarm Systems.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "State Construction Code Amendments."

Transition Report Responses

Received transition report responses from the committee's five agencies. The committee received:

- a <u>presentation</u> from the Department of Commerce;
- a <u>presentation</u> and response <u>report</u> from the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control;
- a response <u>report</u> from the Labor Commission;
- the review <u>report</u> and a response <u>report</u> from the Department of Financial Institutions; and
- comments from the Insurance Department.

Criminal Code Evaluation Task Force

October 29, 2021

Criminal Code Evaluation Task Force Sunset Extension

Received a presentation from committee staff on a proposal to extend the sunset date of the task force.

Action: Approved as a task force bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Criminal Code Evaluation Task Force Sunset Extension," which would change the sunset date of the task force from April 15, 2023, to April 15, 2025.

Criminal Code Recodification

Received a <u>presentation</u> from committee staff on Title 76 Recodification, Chapters 5 and 5b. Discussed whether the recodification bill should have a special effective date.

Action: Approved as task force bills, 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Criminal Code Recodification" and "Criminal Code Recodification Cross References," which would restructure the criminal code to be more uniform.

Economic Development and Workforce Services

Child Care Amendments

Discussed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Child Care Amendments," which would modify provisions related to child care.

Action: Amended and approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Child Care Amendments."

Economic Development Modifications

Discussed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Economic Development Modifications," which would make changes to the Economic Development Tax Increment Financing program, administered by the Governor's Office of Economic Opportunity.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Economic Development Modifications."

Intergenerational Poverty Mitigation Amendments

Discussed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Intergenerational Poverty Mitigation Amendments," which would repeal the Intergenerational Welfare Reform Commission, the Intergenerational Poverty Advisory Committee, and the Intergenerational Poverty Plan Implementation Pilot Program.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Intergenerational Poverty Mitigation Amendments."

Public-Private Partnership Amendments

Discussed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Public-Private Partnership Amendments," which would modify provisions related to public-private partnerships.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Public-Private Partnership Amendments."

State Film Production Incentives Amendments

Discussed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "State Film Production Incentives Amendments," which would exempt "rural productions" from the limit on the total amount of motion picture tax credit incentives that the Governor's Office of Economic Opportunity may issue each fiscal year.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "State Film Production Incentives Amendments."

Education

November 09, 2021

Dixie State University Name Change

The committee discussed 2021 Second Special Session H.B. 2001, "<u>Utah Tech University</u>" and heard public comment on the bill.

November 16, 2021

Higher Education Performance Funding

Received a <u>presentation</u> from Utah System of Higher Education (USHE) outlining the performance funding goals required by 2021 General Session S.B. 193, "<u>Higher Education Performance Funding</u>."

Reviewed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Higher Education Performance Funding Goals</u>," which would adopt and codify the USHE recommended goals.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Higher Education Performance Funding Goals."

November 17, 2021

Civics Education Working Group

Received a <u>presentation</u> from the co-chairs of the Civics Education Working Group organized by 2021 General Session H.C.R. 15, "<u>Concurrent Resolution Emphasizing the Importance of Civics Education."</u>





Education Sunset Extensions

Reviewed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Education Sunset Extensions</u>," which would extend the sunset date for the following provisions by five years:

- Utah Code Section <u>53G-8-211(5)</u>, which provides that a school district or school may refer a minor to a court or a law enforcement officer or agency for an alleged class C misdemeanor committed on school property, or for allegedly being a habitual truant, under certain circumstances; and
- Utah Code Section <u>53E-4-402</u>, which creates the State Instructional Materials Commission.


Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Education Sunset Extensions."

Hospitality and Tourism Management CTE Pilot Program Sunset Extension

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Hospitality and Tourism Management CTE Pilot Program Sunset Extension," which would extend the program's sunset date from 2023 to 2025.

Public Education Curriculum Requirements

Discussed and heard comments on 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Public Education Curriculum Requirements."



Utah's Charter School Governance Structure

Heard a <u>presentation</u> on the audit report #2021-09 – <u>A</u>

<u>Performance Audit of Utah's Charter School Governance</u>

<u>Structure</u> from the Office of the Legislative Auditor General.

Heard responses to the audit from the Utah State Board of Education and the Utah State Charter School Board.

Public Education Assessment Results and Enrollment Update

Received a <u>presentation</u> from the Utah State Board of Education on the effects of pandemic-related disruptions on <u>assessment results</u> in the 2020-2021 school year and an update on student enrollment in school districts and charter schools as of October 1, 2021.

Utah School Accountability System Working Group

Received an <u>update</u> on the progress of a working group's <u>efforts</u> to improve Utah's school accountability system. The group will provide recommendations for redesigning the state's accountability system to align more closely with personalized, competency-based learning and the state's Portrait of a Graduate, while maintaining a transparent, simple, and easy-to-compare accountability system.

Government Operations

988 Behavioral Crisis Response System Implementation Update

Received a <u>presentation</u> regarding the Utah Crisis Line and the coordination of community services and resource allocation for the implementation of the 988 behavioral crisis response system.

Judicial Performance Evaluation Commission Amendments

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Judicial Performance Evaluation Commission Amendments," which would provide that the Judicial Performance Evaluation Commission would determine whether a judge meets minimum performance standards, rather than making a recommendation regarding retaining a judge.

Ballot Amendments

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Ballot Amendments," which would:

- replace a ballot title for an initiative or referendum with a short title and summary;
- establish requirements for the short title and summary;
- provide for the ballot to include the short title of initiatives and referenda and to refer to a ballot proposition insert, included with the ballot, for a voter to review information relating to the initiatives and referenda; and
- describe the content of a ballot proposition insert.

Medical Cannabis Patient Protection Amendments

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Medical Cannabis Patient Protection Amendments," which would amend protections for medical cannabis patients, including public employees, to protect the holding of a medical cannabis card and medical cannabis recommendations.

Special License Plate Designation

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Special License Plate Designation," which would create a support special group license plate to support the Live On suicide prevention campaign.

State Employment Amendments

Reviewed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "State Employment Amendments," which would:

- shorten the timeline for processing and reviewing a grievance filed by a state employee;
- require that state employees be paid based on performance;
- transition, through attrition or incentives, any supervising employees who are currently career-service to at-will; and
- require supervisors of state employees to receive annual management training.

Municipal Alternate Voting Methods Pilot Project Amendments

Reviewed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Municipal Alternate Voting Methods Pilot Project Amendments," which would:

- amend provisions relating to marking a ballot for instant runoff voting;
- give a participating municipality the option of selecting different methods of conducting an election by instant runoff voting; and
- describe the process of voting and of determining winners in an instant runoff election, depending on the voting method selected by a participating municipality.

Required Reports

Received an <u>update</u> from the Department of Veterans and Military Affairs on the department's activities and accomplishments.

Health and Human Services

Behavioral Health Services Amendments

Discussed draft legislation that would create a grant program and require submission of a Medicaid waiver for integration of physical and behavioral health and to allow for a certain medication-assistance treatment drug to be included in the Charitable Prescription Drug Recycling Act.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Behavioral Health Services Amendments."

Electronic Cigarette Substance Standards

Briefed by the Department of Health on its development and implementation of rules regulating e-cigarette cartridges. Utah vape shops are seeking to enjoin the department from enforcing the rules, which include a 3% limit on nicotine content on or after September 1, 2021.

Healthcare Worker Protections

Considered draft legislation that creates enhanced penalties for assault or threat of violence against an owner, employee, or contractor of a health facility.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Health Care Worker Protection Amendments."

Participation by Transgender Youth in School Sports

Considered draft legislation that allows a student in grades 9 through 12 to participate in gender-designated interscholastic athletic activities according to the sex designation on the student's current birth certificate. The legislation also establishes participation requirements for gender-transitioned and gender-transitioning individuals.



Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Student Athletics Participation."

State Agency Realignment

Considered draft legislation that provides a statutory framework for the <u>merger</u> of the Department of Health and the Department of Human Services by July 1, 2022. A report to be <u>released</u> by the agencies this month will address staffing and building use and identify further statutory changes needed to effect the merger.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Department of Health and Human Services Amendments</u>."

Sunset Reviews

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Clinical Mental Health Counselor Licensing Amendments," which would amend provisions relating to clinical mental health counselors and extends the sunset of the provisions.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Extension for Controlled Substance Prescription Requirements," which would extend the repeal date for controlled substance prescription regulations.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Utah Substance Use and Mental Health Advisory Council Sunset Extension</u>," which would extend the sunset date for the Utah Substance Use and Mental Health Advisory Council.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Coordinating Council for Persons with Disabilities Sunset Extension," which would extend the sunset date for the Coordinating Council for Persons with Disabilities.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Study on State Hospital Capacity Sunset Amendments," which would remove the sunset date for provisions related to the study of long-term needs for adult beds in the state hospital.

Youth Suicide Report

Received a <u>presentation</u> from the Office of the Medical Examiner on the statutorily required <u>Youth Suicide Report</u>. Discussed the current rate of youth suicides in the state, key risk factors, and strategies to advance suicide prevention.

Utah Council for Citizen Diplomacy

Received an update from the Utah Council for Citizen Diplomacy on the Council's work over the past two years.

International Relations Framework

Discussed the <u>draft international relations framework for Utah</u> and the role of the Utah State Legislature in the state's international relations and trade efforts.

Judiciary

November 9, 2021

Pretrial Amendments

Heard a presentation regarding the 2021 Second Special Session legislation, "Pretrial Amendments," which amends the process for acquiring a public defender.

November 17, 2021

Expungement Modifications

Heard a presentation from the Salt Lake County Office of Criminal Justice Initiatives regarding the 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Expungement Modifications," which would clarify and amend the process and requirements for expungement.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Expungement Modifications."

Extension of the Utah Council on Victims of Crime

Heard a presentation on 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Extension of the Utah Council on Victims of Crime."



Action: Amended and approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Extension of the Utah Council on Victims of Crime" which would repeal the sunset date in its entirety.

Justice Court Judge Elections Amendments

Heard a presentation from the Weber County Clerk and the Administrative Office of the Courts on 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Justice Court Judge Elections Amendments," which would streamline ballots to prevent judges in smaller jurisdictions, who cover more than one city or town, from appearing multiple times on the same ballot.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Justice Court Judge Elections Amendments."

Offender Supervision Amendments

Heard a presentation on 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Offender Supervision Amendments," which would amend parole and probation guidelines.

Action: Amended and approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Offender Supervision Amendments."

Juvenile Recodification

Heard a presentation from committee staff regarding the second part of the juvenile recodification bill that is currently being drafted for the 2022 General Session. The presentation included an <u>overview</u> of the policy changes within the bill and a <u>summary</u> of the specific sections of Utah Code being recodified.

Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice

Catalytic Converter Theft

Discussed efforts to curb catalytic converter theft in the state.

Received comments from the ChamberWest Chamber of Commerce, Western Metals Recycling, and the Office of the Attorney General about the best way to address community and law enforcement concerns over catalytic converter theft while also respecting the realities of the scrap metal industry.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Catalytic Converter Amendments," which would require certain catalytic converter purchasers to document and input information into the central database for pawnshops and secondhand businesses.

Criminal Code Evaluation Extension

Received a presentation on the necessity of extending the sunset date of the Criminal Code Evaluation Task Force to facilitate the process of recodifying the criminal code.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Criminal Code Evaluation Task Force Sunset Extension," which would change the sunset date of the Criminal Code Evaluation Task Force to April 15, 2025.

Criminal Code Recodification

Received a presentation from the Criminal Code Evaluation Task Force on current efforts to recodify the criminal code. Received the Criminal Code Evaluation Task Force's annual statutorily required report, which includes an overview of changes made during the 2021 General Session to the duties and scope of the task force, a summary of the two items the task force studied during the 2021 interim, and an explanation of the membership of the task force.

DNA Specimen Analysis Amendments

Discussed proposed changes to DNA specimen analysis and destruction policies in the state.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "DNA Specimen Analysis Amendments," which would require sheriffs to provide a person notice related to the destruction of a DNA specimen and removal of the person's DNA sample and records from a database, require certain DNA specimens to be processed and entered into a database, and permit a person to request the destruction of the person's DNA specimen and related records under certain conditions.

Domestic Violence Updates

Received a <u>presentation</u> from the Department of Public Safety about available domestic violence data in the state. Received comments from a legislator about ways to improve the collection and analysis of domestic violence data.

Justice Reinvestment Initiative Report

Received the annual <u>report</u> from the Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice on data related to the Justice Reinvestment Initiative.

Law Enforcement and Mental Health

Discussed ways to facilitate access to mental health resources for first responders. Discussed the importance of also providing resources to the families of first responders.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "First Responder Mental Health Services Amendments," which would require all first responder agencies to provide mental health resources for employees, spouses, children, and retirees. The bill would also establish a grant program to provide mental health resources, which would be administered by the Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health.

Law Enforcement Data Report

Received a <u>presentation</u> from the Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice on law enforcement data collection, as required by 2021 General Session S.B. 159, "<u>Law Enforcement Data Management Requirements</u>."



Law Enforcement Funding

Received a presentation on 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Citation Fines Amendments," which would require that a fine collected by a justice court for certain violations issued by the Utah Highway Patrol be paid to the General Fund.

Public Safety Retirement Amendments

Received a presentation on possible changes to 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Public Safety Retirement Amendments," which would update the original committee bill to include state public safety employees who were hired between 2011 and 2020.

Action: Amended and approved as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Public Safety Retirement Amendments."

Sunset Extension on the Emergency Management Task Force and the Search and Rescue Advisory Board

Received an overview from committee staff about the committee's decision to extend the sunset dates of the Emergency Management Task Force and the Search and Rescue Advisory Board. Both extensions were discussed at the committee's meeting on September 15, where the Division of Emergency Management advocated for the extension of both entities.

Action: Approved as committee bills 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Emergency Management Administration Council Sunset Extension," and "Search and Rescue Advisory Board Sunset Extension." Both bills would extend the sunset dates of each entity from July 1, 2022, to July 1, 2027.

Legislative Redistricting

Redistricting

During a meeting of the Legislative Redistricting Committee on November 1, 2021, the Utah Independent Redistricting Commission submitted an exhaustive report about its three recommended Congressional plans, three Senate plans, three House plans, and three State School Board plans. The Legislative Redistricting Committee took these twelve plans under advisement.

On November 8, 2021, after hours of public comment, the committee recommended to the full Legislature one Congressional, one Senate, one House, and one State School Board plan that were proposed by the chairs of the Legislative Redistricting Committee.

Transportation

Vehicle License Plate and Registration Amendments

- and modify emissions testing requirements for vintage plate vehicles.

Received a <u>presentation</u> from committee staff on a component of the proposal that was not included in the posted draft legislation. That component would delegate responsibility for the special group plate program from the Legislature to the Department of Motor Vehicles.

State Road Jurisdiction Amendments

Discussed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "State Road Jurisdiction Amendments," which would amend the descriptions of and transfers jurisdiction to the state for the following roads: SR-7, SR-85, and SR-194. The draft legislation would also designate the Midvalley Highway as SR-179. A previous draft of this legislation was adopted as a committee bill during the October 20, 2021, interim

meeting but the bill was brought before the committee again to include the designation of the Midvalley Highway.

The Utah Department of Transportation answered questions about the process for adopting roads into the state system.

Action: Adopted as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "State Road Jurisdiction Amendments."

Transportation Amendments

Discussed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Transportation Amendments," which would:

- exempt vintage vehicles with a model year of 1967 or older from emissions inspections;
- amend provisions related to the Office of the Attorney General in prosecution of certain cases related to motor vehicle enforcement; and
- allow the Department of Public Safety to establish a pilot program for tow rotation dispatch services through a public-private partnership.

Received public comment from the Utah Highway Patrol and State Tax Commission.

Action: Adopted as a committee bill 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Transportation Amendments."

Vehicle Registration Amendments

Discussed 2022 General Session draft legislation, "Vehicle Registration Amendments," which would:

- create a new motor vehicle registration fee for certain fuel-efficient vehicles;
- amend the Utah Department of Transportation's rulemaking authority related to the Road Usage Charge (RUC) Program; and
- set the RUC rate and RUC cap fee for enrolled vehicles.

The Utah Department of Transportation provided public comment on the RUC program operating costs and adoption of electric vehicles. Also received public comment from the Utah Taxpayers Association and Utah Clean Energy.
