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Legislative Interim Meetings

Meetings were held October, 19, 2022, or as noted

Administrative Rules Review and General Oversight Committee

October 20, 2022

Administrative Rules Reauthorization Legislation

Action: Voted to open a committee bill to reauthorize all administrative rules except those identified by the committee.

Charter School Satellite Authorization

Discussed <u>R277-552-7(2)(c)</u> and the process by which the Utah Charter School Board authorizes charter school satellites. Received a <u>presentation</u> from committee staff and heard from stakeholders regarding whether a clarification to the rule is warranted.

Kinship Preference

Discussed relevant statute and administrative rules that require the Division of Child and Family Services and the juvenile court to provide preferential consideration to a child's relative when making placement decisions after the child has been removed from parental custody. Received a <u>presentation</u> from committee staff and heard stakeholders' perspectives on the process and requirements involved when determining where to place a child.

Business and Labor

Audit: Budget Review of the Insurance Department

Received a <u>presentation</u> about the Office of the Legislative Auditor General's budget review of the Insurance Department. The <u>audit</u> identified concerns in the Captive Insurance Division and the Insurance Fraud Division. The audit made the following findings and recommendations:

- concluded captive insurance provides the state with less economic benefit than originally estimated;
- provided options to increase the economic benefit of captive insurance;
- questioned whether it is appropriate for the Captive Insurance Division to promote the industry given its role as regulator; and
- recommended the Insurance Fraud Division provide antifraud education programs for insurers and the public.

Prioritization of Licensing Reviews

Reviewed a <u>list</u> of occupational licenses proposed for periodic review by the Office of Professional Licensure Review (OPLR) in 2023. OPLR proposed periodic review of mental and behavioral health licenses within the Department of Commerce and Department of Health and Human Services to address Utah's mental health crisis and shortage of mental health professionals. Received a <u>presentation</u> addressing how the reviews will be conducted and expected deliverables.

Action: Voted to approve the proposed list of occupational licenses for periodic review in 2023 and to submit a copy of the approved list to the Legislative Management Committee in accordance with Utah Code Section <u>13-1b-303</u>.

Public Expression Protection

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Public Expression Protection</u> <u>Act.</u>" which would enact the Uniform Public Expression Protection Act and:

- create a process for a claim asserted against a person for communication in, or on an issue under consideration in, certain governmental proceedings or exercising certain rights under the United States Constitution or Utah Constitution;
- require a court to award costs, attorney fees, and other litigation expenses under certain circumstances;
- include a severability clause; and
- repeal the Citizenship Participation in Government Act.

Required Reports

Discussed the following reports that were received in accordance with statutory reporting requirements:

Unfair Practices Act

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Unfair Practices Act</u> <u>Amendments</u>," which would repeal the Unfair Practices Act because the act's policies are provided in greater particularity in other areas of the code.

Criminal Code Evaluation Task Force

October 20, 2022

Criminal Code Recodification

Received a <u>presentation</u> from committee staff on technical changes made within Title 76, Chapter 6, Offenses Against Property, as the result of feedback from the Utah Attorney General's Office.

Action: Voted to support 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Criminal Code Recodification and Cross</u> <u>References</u>," with the addition of the changes suggested during the meeting.

Discussion of Task Force Report

Received a <u>presentation</u> from committee staff about the task force report required to be submitted to the Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice Interim Committee and the Legislative Management Committee before November 30 of each year.

Protective Order Amendments

Received a <u>presentation</u> from committee staff on 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Protective Order</u> <u>Amendments</u>," which concerns jail release agreements and jail release court orders. Received comments from the Statewide Association of Prosecutors and the Utah Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers about proposed changes to Utah Code Section <u>78B-7-802(4)(c)</u>.

Action: Voted to approve 2023 General Session draft legislation, "Protective Order Amendments," without the proposed changes to Utah Code Section 78B-7-802(4)(c).

Commission Discussion


Heard a report from the State Board of Education, as required in Utah Code Section 53G-10-103, on its implementation of and compliance with provisions enacted in the legislation.

Council Discussion of 2022 Recommendations

Discussed the outlook for the remainder of the year and what will need to be accomplished in the coming weeks to produce a statutorily required report of the council's findings and recommendations.

September Council Meeting Follow-up

Discussed the status of research surrounding Medicaid reimbursement and strategies to expand access to mental health screenings, assessments, and treatment available to Medicaid-enrolled children. Received a <u>presentation</u> from State Board of Education about current mental health programs throughout Utah's schools and goals for increasing services.


Utah System of Higher Education Mental Health Efforts

Federalism Commission

October 17, 2022

Cost of Federal Decarbonization Policies

Received a <u>presentation</u> from a professor with Washington University in St. Louis regarding the estimated full cost of federal energy policies to individuals and communities. The commission discussed the costs of focusing energy policy on climate damage instead of addressing energy security, costs, and environmental security.

Federalism Policy Tracker and Federalism Index

Received a presentation from a professor and staff at the Utah Valley University Center for Constitutional Studies regarding a federalism <u>issue tracker</u> and discussed federal actions that the commission members would like to study.

Phoenix Correspondence Commission Report

Received a <u>presentation</u> from the Phoenix Correspondence Commission regarding the work that the group has done to coordinate efforts between states to call a future Article V convention. Discussed how Utah can support the work of the Phoenix Correspondence Commission.

Executive Boards and Commissions

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Boards and Commissions</u> <u>Amendments</u>," which would address reporting requirements relating to an executive board.

Juvenile Offender Penalty Amendments

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2023 General Session draft legislation, "Juvenile Offender Penalty <u>Amendments</u>," which would modify the sentencing of a juvenile offender for certain sexual offenses in district court.

Local Official Amendments

Reviewed 2023 General Session draft legislation, "Local <u>Official Amendments</u>," which would provide direction in statute regarding when a city council may make changes to executive responsibilities.

Sensitive Instructional Materials

Received a <u>report</u> from the State Board of Education on the implementation of and compliance with the requirement that it provide guidance and training to support public schools in identifying materials that meet the definition of sensitive materials.

State Commemorative Periods

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>State Commemorative Periods</u> <u>Amendments</u>," which would modify provisions related to commemorative periods and address the repeal of commemorative periods.

State Initiative Process

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2023 General Session draft legislation, "Initiative and Referendum Modifications," which would amend provisions relating to initiatives and referenda.

Voter Residency Requirements

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Voting and Voter Residency</u> <u>Amendments</u>," which would amend elections provisions, including residency provisions for voting and running for office, and provisions relating to uniformed and overseas voters.

Voter Signature Verification

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Voter Signature Verification</u> <u>Amendments</u>," which would address voter signature verification and voter accessibility.

Health and Human Services

Committee Business

Action: Voted to open a committee bill file to facilitate the recodification of the health and human services statutes related to the creation of the Department of Health and Human Services.

Medicaid Adult Dental Coverage

Action: Voted to amend, and approved as a committee bill, 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Medicaid</u> <u>Dental Waiver Amendments</u>," which would require the Department of Health and Human Services to request authorization to provide dental services to Medicaideligible adults not already eligible for dental services.

Medicaid Mental Healthcare for Adults

Received a presentation from a legislator about expanding Medicaid coverage for adults experiencing mental health issues.

Medical Cannabis Governance Structure Working Group Report

Received a <u>report</u> on recommendations from the Medical Cannabis Governance Structure Working Group.

Action: Voted to open a committee bill file to implement the provisions of the Medical Cannabis Governance Structure Working Group report.

State Plan on Aging

Received a <u>presentation</u> from the Utah Commission on Aging and a legislator on 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Master Plan on Aging</u>," which would amend the duties and powers of the Utah Commission on Aging and direct the commission to prepare and publish a 10-year master plan for aging.

Sunset Review: Assisted Living Facility Transfers

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2023 General Session draft legislation, "Long Term Care Ombudsman <u>Amendments</u>," which would remove a sunset date and amend requirements for certain facility-initiated transfers or discharges of a resident.

Sunset Review: Behavioral Health Crisis Response Commission

Discussed 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Behavioral Health Crisis Response Commission</u> <u>Amendments</u>," which would extend the sunset of the commission and make amendments to its membership and duties.



Sunset Review: Utah Marriage Commission Dedicated Credits

Received a <u>presentation</u> from committee staff on dedicated credits received by the Utah Marriage Commission that will become lapsing on July 1, 2023, absent further action by the Legislature.

Action: Voted to open a committee bill file to repeal the sunset of the Utah Marriage Commission's dedicated credits and allow their non-lapsing status to continue.

Treatment of Gender Dysphoria in Minors

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Sex Characteristic Surgical</u> <u>Procedures</u>," which would prohibit certain medical procedures related to treatment of gender dysphoria in minors.

Judiciary

Attorney Fees

Heard from a legislator on the issue of recovering attorney and expert fees in certain civil actions against a government entity.

Expungement of Juvenile Records

Heard from committee staff and legislators on a committee bill regarding the expungement of certain juvenile records.

Mental Health and Criminal Justice

Received an update from a legislative working group exploring ways to improve the criminal justice system as it relates to individuals with mental illness.

Waiver of Punitive Damages

Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice

Arson Amendments

Received a presentation from a legislator on 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Arson Amendments</u>", which would amend the definition of "habitable structure." This draft legislation was recommended to the committee by the Criminal Code Evaluation Task Force.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2023 General Session draft legislation, "Arson Amendments."

DNA Rape Kit Testing and Unrelated Crimes

Discussed a committee bill file opened to address victim privacy concerns by prohibiting the use of DNA gathered from rape kits for investigating unrelated crimes. The Salt Lake County District Attorney's office testified that the law currently prohibits using a victim's DNA gathered from a rape kit to investigate unrelated crimes.

Drug Possession Penalty Amendments

Received a presentation from a legislator on 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Drug Possession Penalty</u> <u>Amendments</u>," which would amend the definition of a restricted person in possession of a dangerous weapon and a controlled substance and reduce the penalty, in certain circumstances, for a restricted person in possession of marijuana.

Action: Approved as a committee bill 2023 General Session draft legislation, "Drug Possession Penalty Amendments."

Jail and Prison Deaths

Received a presentation from a legislator about the increase in jail and prison deaths as well as policy options to address the increase.

Mentally III Offenders

Received a presentation from a legislator on 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Mental Health Support and Law</u> <u>Enforcement Co-Response</u>," which would create a grant program for expanded mobile crisis intervention teams to be administered by the Division of Integrated Healthcare.

Action: Approved as a committee bill drat legislation, "Mental Health Support and Law Enforcement Co-Response."

Performance Audit of Healthcare in State Prisons

Received a <u>presentation</u> from the Office of the Legislative Auditor General on the findings of <u>report</u> Number 2021-17. Received a <u>response</u> to the audit from the Department of Corrections.

Sentencing Guidelines

Division of Indian Affairs Report

Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA)

Heard a proposal from the Confederated Tribes of the Goshute Reservation to create a state ICWA statute.

Action: Voted to open a committee bill file to create a state ICWA statute.

Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women and Girls Task Force

Discussed 2023 General Session draft legislation, "Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women and Girls Task Force Sunset Extension," that would:

- change the name of the task force to the Murdered and Missing Indigenous Relatives Task Force:
- extend the task force's repeal date from November 30, . 2023, to November 30, 2024; and
- extend the deadline for the required report from the task force to the Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice Interim Committee from November 30, 2023, to November 30, 2024.

Action: Voted to favorably recommend as a committee bill 2023 General Session draft legislation, "Murdered and Missing Indigenous Women and Girls Task Force Sunset Extension."

Native American Education

Received a <u>presentation</u> on Native American education in Utah and a <u>statutorily required report</u> from grant recipients in <u>San Juan School District</u> and <u>Uintah School District</u> on the grants they received under the <u>American Indian and</u> <u>Alaska Native Education State Program</u>.

Office of American Indian/Alaska Native (AI/AN) Health and Family Services

Heard from the new Office of Al/AN Health and Family Services within the Department of Health and Human Services. Also received two <u>statutorily required reports</u> from the office's <u>Indian Health Liaison</u> and <u>Indian Child</u> <u>Welfare Act Liaison</u>. The office also provided its <u>2022</u> <u>American Indian and Alaska Native Health Status Report</u>.

Domesticated Elk

Received an <u>update</u> from committee staff about work on a committee bill that would address issues facing the Domesticated Elk Program. Received comment from the Utah Department of Agriculture and Food about the program and next steps.

Draft Legislation: Emergency Water Shortages Amendments

Discussed 2023 General Session amended draft legislation, "<u>Emergency Water Shortages Amendments</u>," which would address temporary emergency shortages of water declared by the governor. Received comments from the state engineer, the Utah Farm Bureau, and the Janet Quinney Lawson Institute for Land, Water and Air.

Action: Voted to take a position of encouragement and support for the continued work on 2023 General Session draft legislation, "Emergency Water Shortages Amendments."

Draft Legislation: Outdoor Recreation Amendments

Discussed 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Outdoor Recreation Amendments</u>," which would require the Division of Outdoor Recreation to prepare a recreation management plan for Provo Canyon. Action: Voted to favorably recommend as a committee bill 2023 General Session draft legislation, "Outdoor Recreation Amendments."

Draft Legislation: Radon Related Amendments

Discussed 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Radon</u> <u>Related Amendments</u>," which would enact the Radon Gas Act. Received comments from the Utah Association of Realtors about current radon mitigation regulations.

Draft Legislation: Water Related Liability Amendments

Discussed 2023 General Session draft legislation, "<u>Water</u> <u>Related Liability Amendments</u>," which would modify provisions related to the liability of owners or operators of water facilities, streams, or rivers and related trails. Received comments from the Utah Association for Justice and the Utah Farm Bureau.

Action: Voted to favorably recommend as a committee bill 2023 General Session draft legislation, "Water Related Liability Amendments."

Saline Aquifers

Received a <u>presentation</u> from a legislator about the possibility of accessing water from deep saline aquifers to address the decreased Great Salt Lake level. Received comments from a Brigham Young University professor about the role of modular molten salt reactors in these efforts.

Small-Scale Wastewater Recycling
