## 1. S.B. 50 Aggravated Assault Modifications (Kennedy, M.)

Sen. Kennedy presented the bill with the assistance of Will Carlson, Deputy District Attorney, Salt Lake County District Attorney's Office.

Sen. Kennedy moved to amend S.B. 50 with Amendment #1. The motion passed with a vote of 2 -MOTION:

Amendment 1 S.B. 50

- Page, Line 28 through Page 2, Line 41:
- (2) An actor commits aggravated assault if the actor: 28
- (a) (i) attempts, with unlawful force or violence, to do bodily injury to another; 29
- 30 (ii) makes a threat, accompanied by a show of immediate force or violence, to do
- 31 bodily injury to another; or
- (iii) commits an act, committed with unlawful force or violence, that causes bodily 32
- injury to another or creates a substantial risk of bodily injury to another; and 33
- 34 (b) includes in the actor's conduct under Subsection (2)(a) the use of:
- (i) a dangerous weapon: 35
- 36 (ii) any act that intentionally or knowingly impedes the breathing or the circulation of blood of another individual
- by the actor's use of unlawful force or violence [that is likely to produce a loss of 37
- consciousness1 by: 38
- 39 (A) applying pressure to the neck or throat of an individual: or
- 40 (B) obstructing the nose, mouth, or airway of an individual; or
- 41 (iii) other means or force likely to produce death or serious bodily injury.
