#### Amendment 2 H.B. 302

- 1. Page 1, Line 27 through Page 2, Line 37:
- 27 79-3-505. Paleontological landmarks.
- 28 (1) (a) [Sites] <u>A site</u> of significance or [sites] <u>a site</u> with exceptional fossils may be
- 29 designated as a state paleontological landmark by:
- 30 (i) [recommended to and approved by the board as state paleontological landmarks]
- 31 recommendation to and approval of the board; or
- 32 (ii) approval of the Legislature and the governor through concurrent resolution.

33 (b) (i) The governor shall notify the board if a concurrent resolution described in Subsection (1)(a)(ii) is introduced by the Legislature.

(ii) If the board receives a recommendation described in Subsection (1)(a)(i) or notice described in Subsection (1) (b)(i), the survey may prepare a report on the impacts of the proposed state paleontological landmark and submit the report to the Legislature and the governor.

- (c) No privately owned site, a site on school or institutional trust lands, or a site on
- 34 lands owned or controlled by a city that has a paleontology museum may be so designated
- 35 without the written consent of the owner or the trust.
- 36 {(c)} (d) The ownership or control of a site or the site's fossils does not change upon
- 37 designation as a state paleontological landmark.
