39 (ii) vaccinated with an mRNA vaccine; or

40 (b) is produced by cultivating or culturing animal cells in vitro.

41 (2) { "Genetic material" means a gene, deoxyribonucleic acid, or chromosome.

42 (3) "Genetic modification" means the modification of genetic material:

(a) through modern biotechnology, directed evolution, or other mechanism; and 43

(b) in a way that does not occur naturally or that does not occur at a natural rate. \ "mRNA vaccine" means a vaccine that introduces a piece of mRNA into the cells of an animal to induce the production of a viral protein in the animal's cells.
