

Cost for additional orders, monitoring and tracking in the courts are estimated at \$184,800 per year. The Attorney General's Office requires an additional \$7,400 for costs related to potential appeals. Cost for the installation and maintenance of the required devices will be borne by the offender.

Costs to the Department of Public Safety for driver license processing and coding on the license will be covered by current conversion of the driver license to a digital form. The additional impound fees will add as much as \$1.2 million to the Transportation Restricted-Driver License Fund. These funds are statutorily earmarked for intoxilyzer equipment for law enforcement.

All of these estimates are based on 80 percent of the repeat DUIs being sentenced to interlock use.
