

Implementation of this bill would require a General Fund appropriation of \$90,000 in FY 2001, and \$85,000 in FY 2002 and beyond.

Individual and Business Impact

Cattle producers will pay their own veterinarians to test an estimated 20,000 bulls per year. The cost will be about \$25 per bull, for a total of \$500,000 per year.

Aggregate savings to the cattle industry may be as high as \$5,000,000 per year if this testing helps stop abortions which are occurring in cattle.
