

**AMENDED NOTE**

**State Impact**

This bill will have no fiscal impact in FY 2003. The legislation may create a fiscal incentive for some local jurisdictions to establish their own justice courts and set up administrative traffic courts, which could result in the diversion of General Fund revenue from the State to local governments. Approximately ten cities could create a justice court under this bill. These cities include but are not limited to Provo, Orem, Layton, and Ogden, each of which could divert up to \$400,000 from the General Fund. The total State-wide impact could be over \$1,700,000 loss of revenue to the General Fund if all of the cities decided to establish their own courts. It is estimated that at least a few local jurisdictions would use the provisions of this legislation resulting in a loss of State General Fund revenue of approximately \$800,000 starting in FY 2004.
