

**State Impact**

This bill will have a revenue neutral impact on the state. Currently no state agency is regulating the termite control industry. Provisions of this bill will require termite inspection personnel to be licensed by the Department of Agriculture and Food. The bill would allow the department to charge a reasonable license fee and triennial renewal fee. It is estimated the license fee will be \$15, the triennial renewal fee \$20, and that 100 people will apply for a license in the first year and 10 people in the second year. Costs of material and related expenses would be equal to the fees charged.

**Individual and Business Impact**

It is estimated that 100 people would need to pay a \$15 license fee in the first year, and 10 people per year in each consecutive year. In the fourth year and beyond, those who wish to renew their license would need to pay a \$20 triennial renewal fee.
