

**FIFTH SPECIAL SESSION**

**State Impact**

Enactment of this bill will result in a reduction of \$5,000,000 in the Quality Teaching Block Grant program within the Minimum School Program. With this reduction the program would be reduced from an ongoing appropriation of \$69,178,111 to \$64,178,111 for fiscal year 2003. Each school district in the state would receive their proportionate equitable share of the reduction. The Quality Teaching Block Grant program was created by the 2002 Legislature in the general session from program funds that were formerly designated as career ladder funds and U-PASS funding.

The bill also contains language that requires School Districts to certify that they did not increase class size or directly reduce classroom instructional expenditures as a result of this reduction before they can receive their share of the FY 2003 funding increase that results from the .75 percent increase in the value of the weighted pupil unit.
