**State Impact**

Implementation of this bill would likely curtail the growth in the number of certain non-immigrant alien students, resulting in a loss of future tuition revenue at various institutions. The estimated FY 2009 loss is \$350,000 and would increase to approximately \$500,000 in FY 2010.
