State Impact

To comply with the provisions of this bill, it is estimated that the Department of Commerce would need one FTE with annual costs of \$30,000 beginning in FY 2012. In addition, programming and capital costs will be \$36,500 (one-time) in FY 2012. License fees for individuals licensed to prescribe controlled substances will be increased to cover the additional expenses and will generate General Fund revenue of \$26,700 in FY 2012. Commerce Service Fund revenue and expenditures affect the annual transfer to the General Fund.
