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**State Impact**

Enactment of this bill will generate \$25,000 in General Fund revenue in FY 2011 and have a net zero General Fund impact beginning in FY 2012. It will require a General Fund appropriation of \$125,000 in FY 2011 and \$150,000 beginning in FY 2012 for staff support at the Department of Insurance. It will generate \$150,000 in revenue to the General Fund beginning in FY 2011. It will also require a one-time \$150,000 appropriation from restricted funds to the Department of Insurance for software development. Actuarial costs of \$150,000 per year will be offset by fees established in the bill.
