## STATE GOVERNMENT (UCA 36-12-13(2)(b))

Enactment of this bill will cost the Department of Public Safety \$9,800 one-time from the General Fund in FY 2013.

Enactment of this bill likely will not result in direct, measurable expenditures by Utah businesses. Individuals with outstanding warrants will be less able to avoid their resolution and potential payment of fines and penalties, but it is not known how much additional revenue will be generated.
