Enactment of this bill will cost the Division of Oil, Gas, and Mining \$108,000 from the General Fund in FY 2013 and \$32,400 from the General Fund in FY 2014.

DIRECT EXPENDITURES BY UTAH RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES (UCA 36-12-13(2)(d))

Mineral mining operators that conduct blasting within one mile of residential structure will likely incur increased costs for: blasting notice to public and residents within 1 mile, equipment to monitor air blasts and vibration, pre-blasting survey of structure of owner or renter, submittal of a plan to address blasting regulations.
