LOCAL GOVERNMENTS (UCA 36-12-13(2)(c))

Beginning in FY 2015, school districts may see an increase in budgeting costs of \$0 to \$25,000 per school, or up to \$23 million. To enable more local budgeting, school districts would likely see cost savings at the school district level of up to \$23 million.
